Mark 4:39 (KJV)

And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.

Let's continue in our book Desire of Ages, Chapter #35, pages 335-336

The storm ceases. The billows sink to rest. The clouds roll away, and the stars shine forth. The boat rests upon a quiet sea. Then turning to His disciples, And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?" **Mark 4:40 {DA 335.3}**

A hush fell upon the disciples. Even Peter did not attempt to express the awe that filled his heart. The boats that had set out to accompany Jesus had been in the same peril with that of the disciples. Terror and despair had seized their occupants; but the command of Jesus brought quiet to the scene of tumult. The fury of the storm had driven the boats into close proximity, and all on board beheld the miracle. In the calm that followed, fear was forgotten. The people whispered among themselves, "What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?" **{DA 335.4}**

Question: What happen when the storm ceased? And, what were the disciple's reactions after a hush fell upon them?

Answer: The clouds roll away, and the stars shine forth. The boat rests upon a quiet sea. And, terror and despair had seized their occupants; in the calm that followed, fear was forgotten. The command of Jesus brought quiet to the scene of tumult.

When Jesus was awakened to meet the storm, He was in perfect peace. There was no trace of fear in word or look, for no fear was in His heart. But He rested not in the possession of almighty power. It was not as the "Master of earth and sea and sky" that He reposed in quiet. That power He had laid down, and He says, "I can of Mine own self do nothing." **John 5:30.** He trusted in the Father's might. It was in faith--faith in God's love and care--that Jesus rested, and the power of that word which stilled the storm was the power of God. **{DA 336.1}**

Question: What was Jesus' reaction during the storm? And in what way did He awaken to meet the storm?

Answer: He was in perfect peace. There was no trace of fear in word or look, for no fear was in His heart. But He rested not in the possession of almighty power. It was in faith--faith in God's love and care--that Jesus rested, and the power of that word which stilled the storm was the power of God.

As Jesus rested by faith in the Father's care, so we are to rest in the care of our Saviour. If the disciples had trusted in Him, they would have been kept in peace. Their fear in the time of danger revealed their unbelief. In their efforts to save themselves, they forgot Jesus; and it was only when, in despair of self-dependence, they turned to Him that He could give them help. **{DA 336.2}**

Question: In what was Jesus resting in that brought peace in the midst of the storm? And, why did the disciples fail to be kept in peace?

Answer: The Father's care, so we are to rest in the care of our Saviour. And, If they had trusted in Him, they would have been kept in peace, their fear revealed their unbelief.

Song: Let's learn a beautiful hymn dear one that tells us how to stand, titled
"Like the Sea that never will be moved!"

How often the disciples' experience is ours! When the tempests of temptation gather, and the fierce lightnings flash, and the waves sweep over us, we battle with the storm alone, forgetting that there is One who can help us. We trust to our own strength till our hope is lost, and we are ready to perish. Then we remember Jesus, and if we call upon Him to save us, we shall not cry in vain. Though He sorrowfully reproves our unbelief and self-confidence, He never fails to give us the help we need. Whether on the land or on the sea, if we have the Saviour in our hearts, there is no need of fear. Living faith in the Redeemer will smooth the sea of life, and will deliver us from danger in the way that He knows to be best. {DA 336.3}

Question: Does Jesus forsake us though He sorrowfully reproves our unbelief and self-confidence? And, what will Living faith in the Redeemer do?

Answer: No! He never fails to give us the help we need. Whether on the land or on the sea, if we have the Saviour in our hearts, there is no need of fear. And, will smooth the sea of life, and will deliver us from danger in the way that He knows to be best.

There is another spiritual lesson in this miracle of the stilling of the tempest. Every man's experience testifies to the truth of the words of Scripture, "The wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest. . . . There is no peace, saith my God, to the wicked." **Isaiah 57:20, 21.** Sin has destroyed our peace. While self is unsubdued, we can find no rest. The masterful passions of the heart no human power can control. We are as helpless here as were the disciples to quiet the raging storm. But He who spoke peace to the billows of Galilee has spoken the word of peace for every soul.

Continuing:

However fierce the tempest, those who turn to Jesus with the cry, "Lord, save us," will find deliverance. His grace, that reconciles the soul to God, quiets the strife of human passion, and in His love the heart is at rest. "He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still. Then are they glad because they be quiet; so He bringeth them unto their desired haven." **Psalm 107:29, 30.** "Being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." "The work of righteousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance forever." **Romans 5:1; Isaiah 32:17. {DA 336.4}**

Question: What is the other spiritual lesson in this miracle of the stilling of the tempest? And, what does destroy our peace?

Answer: Every man's experience testifies to the truth of the words of Scripture, "The wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest. . . . There is no peace, saith my God, to the wicked." And, Sin, while self is unsubdued, we can find no rest.

Question: What will the souls who turn to Jesus with the cry, "Lord, save us," finds? And, what will we have, "Being justified by faith".

Answer: They will find deliverance. His grace, that reconciles the soul to God, quiets the strife of human passion, and in His love the heart is at rest. "He maketh the storm a calm, so that the waves thereof are still." And, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Chapter 3-Meekness

The meek will he guide in judgment: and the meek will he teach his way.
Psalm 25:9. {SD 82.1}

You will have to learn the important lesson of what it is to be a man in the sight of God. It is to be like Jesus, meek and lowly of heart, to guard the interests of others more **sacredly** that you would your own.... It should be carried out in your daily life and practise, showing that you have not been playing truant or a dull **scholar** in the school of Christ. **{SD 82.2}**

Selfishness cannot exist in a heart where Christ dwells; if cherished, it will crowd out everything besides. It will lead you to follow **inclination** rather than duty, to make self the subject of thought, and to **gratify** and **indulge** yourself, instead of seeking to be a blessing to others. Your wants, your pleasures, will come before everything else.... True happiness is to be found, not in **self-indulgence** and **self-pleasing**, but in learning of Christ.... Those who trust to their own wisdom, and follow their own ways, go complaining at every step, because the burden which selfishness binds upon them is so heavy. . . . **{SD 82.3}**

Jesus loves the young, and He longs to have them possess that peace which He alone can impart. He bids them learn of Him meekness and **lowliness** of heart. This precious grace is rarely seen in the youth of the present day, even in those who profess to be Christians. Their own ways seem right in their eyes. In accepting the name of Christ, they do not accept His character . . . therefore they know nothing of the joy and peace to be found in His service. **{SD 82.4}**

The meekness of Christ, manifested in the home, will make the **inmates** happy; it provokes no quarrel, gives back no angry answer, but soothes the irritated temper, and **diffuses** a gentleness that is felt by all within its **charmed** circle. Wherever cherished, it makes the families of earth a part of the one great family above. **{SD 82.5}**

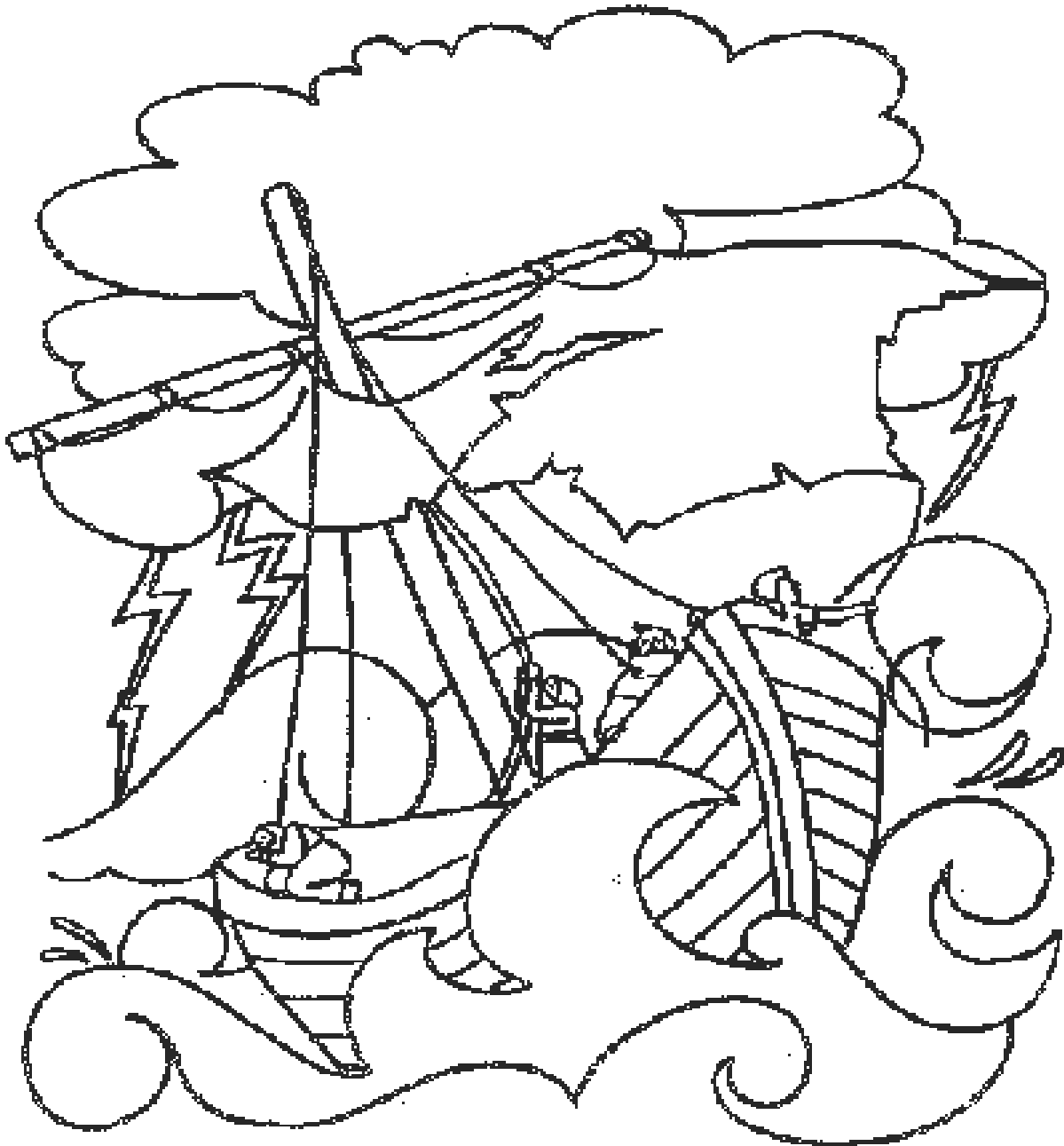

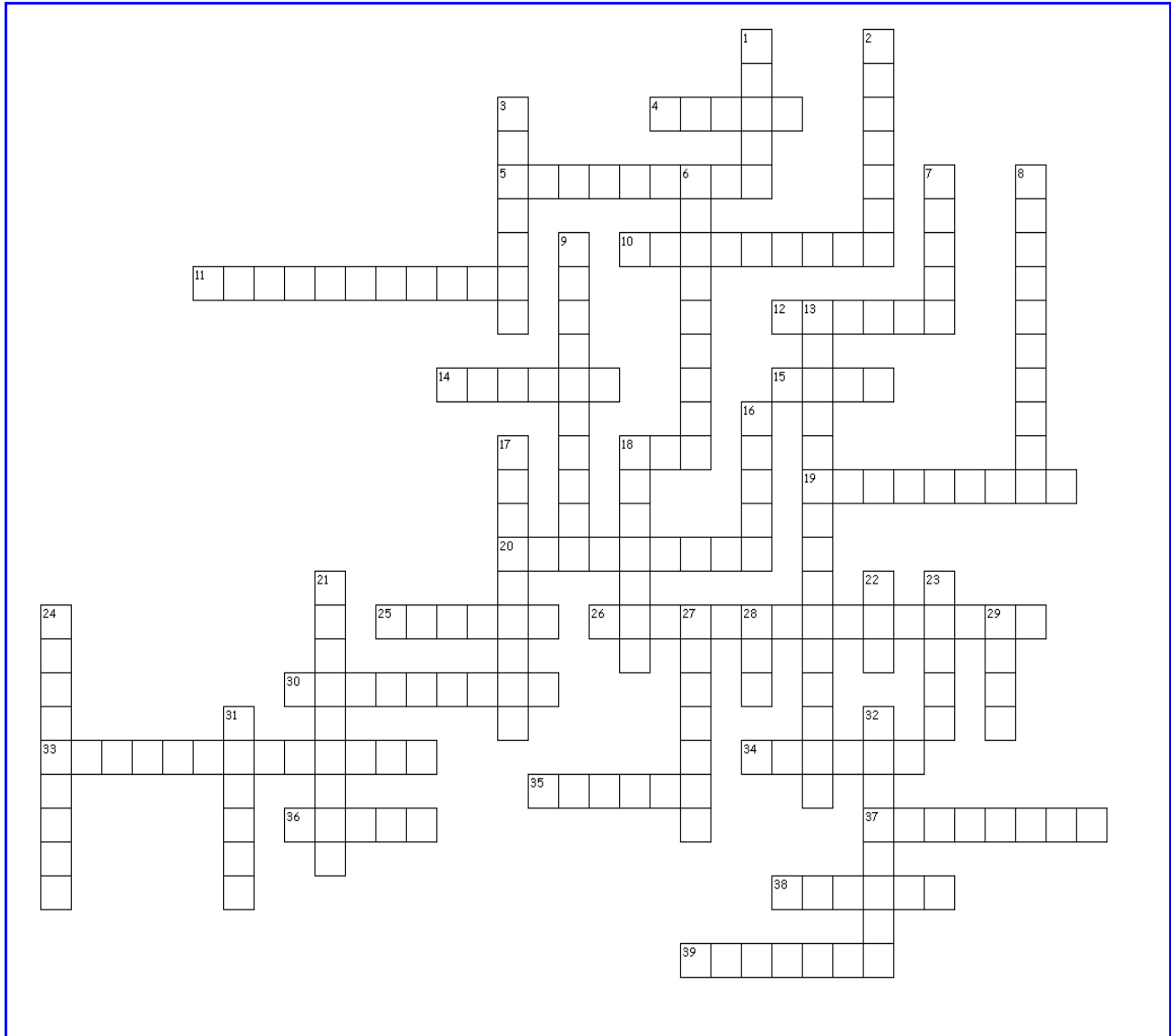
