
I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

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Thus were to be fulfilled His own words, "The Good Shepherd giveth His life for the sheep."










Nature Hot-Water Bottle

One very simple home remedy is the hot-water bottle. It is very important that the water in the bottle is not so hot that it burns the patient. The hot-water bottle would be an easy way to treat someone on the Sabbath day.

It is best to only fill it partly full with hot water, and expel all the air out of it. That way it is flat and can come in contact with the skin surface, conforming to the shape of the body. Also, it will not be too heavy on the patient. Laying the hot-water bottle on the skin can remind us how Jesus came close and bent over the sick man. Though unseen, God is so close to those who are suffering that the Bible says, "In all their affliction he was afflicted" (Isaiah 63:9). "Not a sigh is breathed, not a pain felt, not a grief pierces the soul, but the throb vibrates to the Father's heart." (The Desire of Ages 356)

The hot-water bottle reminds us of Jesus, the "Water of Life," Imparting His own life force to the sick as the hot-water bottle gives its heat energy.

The importance of getting the extra air out of the hot water bottle so it will form itself to the shape of the body part it is being used on can remind us of how the "Water of Life" "sticketh closer than a brother." Jesus is the closest and best of friends in times of sickness.

The hot-water bottle is most beneficial if kept at the right temperature. It is important that we are the right temperature spiritually. This means we need a very warm supply of the Word from the "Water of Life" daily so that we can treat others warmly and lovingly.



It is good to refill the water bottle at regular times during the time it is needed. We need to refill our minds with the Word at regular times. The hot-water bottle can relieve pain, congestion, and many other ills. Jesus, the "Water of Life" can remove sin, and corruption, and all other ills. See the Children's Activity Book to discover how to best use the hot-water bottle. Practice it! (We'll learn on our Sabbath Review!)

Remind

- As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
- 2. As you put the tea kettle on to boil remember how you can help the sick with a simple hot-water bottle. Jesus, the "Water of Life" wants to help you become well from the sickness of sin.

Reinforce

- Observe water!
- Make sure you have a hot-water bottle.
 If you have an elderly person that sleeps at your house, fix them a nice warm hotwater bottle to put at their feet when they go to bed at night.





And when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceeding glad: for he was desirous to see him of a long [season], because he had heard many things of him; and he hoped to have seen some miracle done by him.

Luke 23:9 (KJV)

Then he questioned with him in many words; but he answered him nothing. .

And the chief priests and scribes stood and vehemently accused him.

And Herod with his men of war set him at nought, and mocked [him], and arrayed him in a gorgeous robe, and sent him again to Pilate.

And the same day Pilate and Herod were made friends together: for before they were at enmity between themselves.

For Herod had laid hold on John, and bound him, and put [him] in prison for Herodias' sake, his brother Philip's wife.




Herod questioned Christ in many words, but throughout the Saviour maintained a profound silence. At the command of the king, the decrepit and maimed were then called in, and Christ was ordered to prove His claims by working a miracle. Men say that Thou canst heal the sick, said Herod. I am anxious to see that Thy widespread fame has not been belied. Jesus did not respond, and Herod still continued to urge: If Thou canst work miracles for others, work them now for Thine own good, {Next Slide Please}




Continuing: and it will serve Thee a good purpose. Again he commanded, Show us a sign that Thou hast the power with which rumor hath accredited Thee. But Christ was as one who heard and saw not. The Son of God had taken upon Himself man's nature. He must do as man must do in like circumstances. Therefore He would not work a miracle to save Himself the pain and humiliation that man must endure when placed in a similar position. **{DA 729.2}**







Herod promised that if Christ would perform some miracle in his presence, He should be released. Christ's accusers had seen with their own eyes the mighty works wrought by His power. They had heard Him command the grave to give up its dead. They had seen the dead come forth obedient to His voice. Fear seized them lest He should now work a miracle. {Next Slide Please}



Continuing:

Of all things they most dreaded an exhibition of His power.
Such a manifestation would prove

a deathblow to their plans, and would perhaps cost them their lives.


Again the priests and rulers, in great anxiety, urged their accusations against Him.

Raising their voices, they declared, He is a traitor, a blasphemer.


He works His miracles through the power given Him by Beelzebub, the prince of the devils.

The hall became a scene of confusion, some crying one thing and some another.


Herod's conscience was now far less sensitive than when he had trembled with horror at the request of Herodias for the head of John the Baptist. For a time he had felt the keen stings of remorse for his terrible act; but his moral perceptions had become more and more degraded by his licentious life. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: Now his heart had become so hardened that he could even boast of the punishment he had inflicted upon John for daring to reprove him. And he now threatened Jesus, declaring repeatedly that he had power to release or to condemn Him. But no sign from Jesus gave evidence that He heard a word. **{DA 730.1}**




Herod was irritated by this silence. It seemed to indicate utter indifference to his authority. To the vain and pompous king, open rebuke would have been less offensive than to be thus ignored. Again he angrily threatened Jesus, who still remained unmoved and silent. **{DA 730.2}**






The mission of Christ in this world was not to gratify idle curiosity. He came to heal the brokenhearted. Could He have spoken any word to heal the bruises of sin-sick souls, He would not have kept silent. But He had no words for those who would but trample the truth under their unholy feet. **{DA 730.3}**







Christ might have spoken words to Herod that would have pierced the ears of the hardened king. He might have stricken him with fear and trembling by laying before him the full iniquity of his life, and the horror of his approaching doom. **But Christ's silence was** the severest rebuke that He could have given. Herod had rejected the truth spoken to him by the greatest of the prophets, and no other message was he to receive. {Next Slide Please}



Continuing:

Not a word had the Majesty of heaven for him.


That ear that had ever been open to human woe, had no room for Herod's commands.

Those eyes that had ever rested upon the penitent sinner in pitying, forgiving love had no look to bestow upon Herod.

Those lips that had uttered

the most impressive truth,
that in tones of tenderest entreaty
had pleaded with the most sinful
and the most degraded,
were closed to the haughty king
who felt no need of a Saviour.






Dear Remnant Families, Boys, Girls, and Guests;
