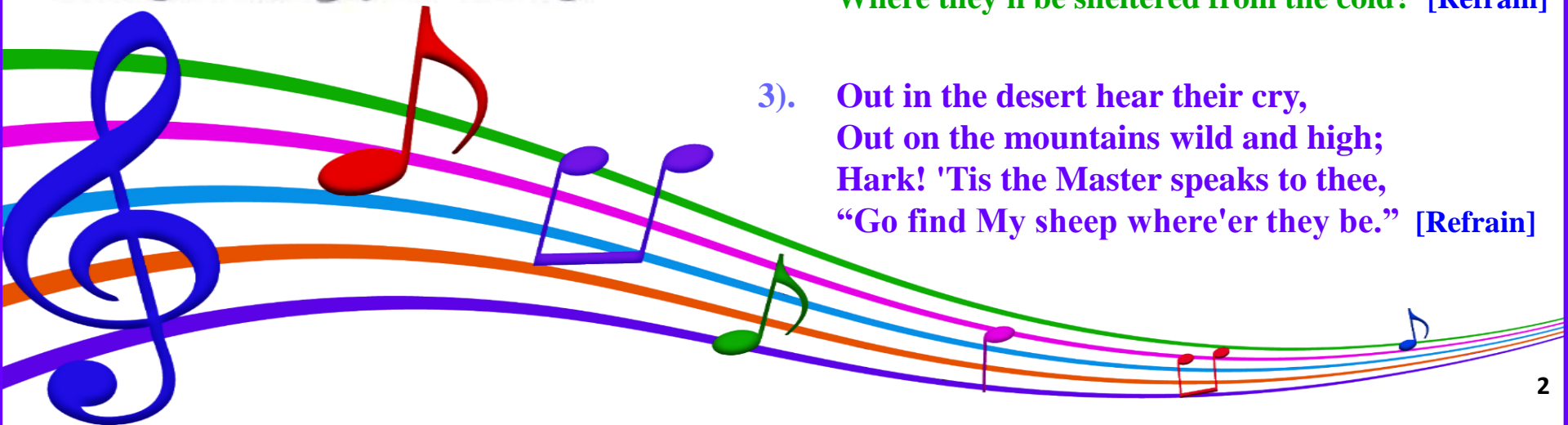

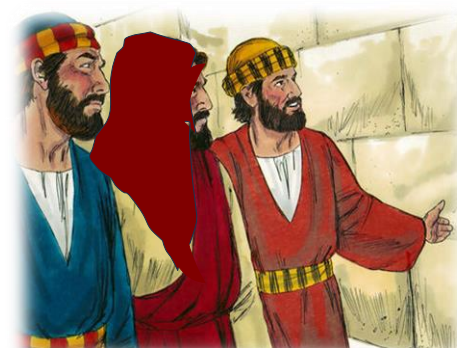
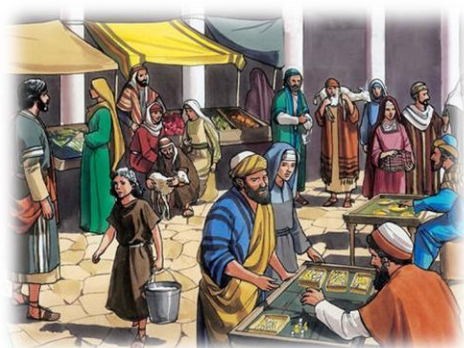

## Chapter 13 – Riding Into Jerusalem, Part 4

**Continuing:** It had been the child of His care, and His heart was filled with anguish as He realized that it would soon be made desolate. {SJ 86.3}

Had her people given heed to Christ's teaching, and received Him as the Saviour, Jerusalem would have “stood forever.” {SJ 86.4}

She might have become the queen of kingdoms, free in the strength of her God-given power. {SJ 86.5}

There would then have been no armed soldiers waiting at her gates, no Roman banners waving from her walls. {SJ 86.6}

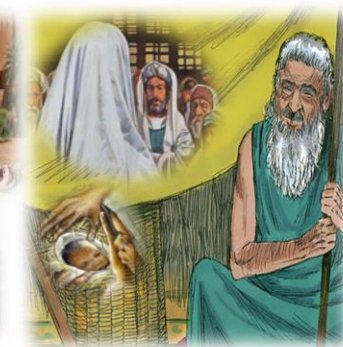
From Jerusalem the dove of peace would have gone to all nations.

She would have been the crowning glory of the world. {SJ 86.7}

But the Jews had rejected their Saviour; they were about to crucify their King.

## Continuing:

And when the sun should set that night, the doom of Jerusalem would be forever sealed.  
(About forty years afterward, Jerusalem was utterly destroyed  
and burned with fire by the Roman army.) **{SJ 86.8}**

Reports had come to the rulers that Jesus was nearing the city with a vast company of  
followers. They went out to meet Him, hoping to scatter the throng.  
With a show of much authority, they asked: “Who is this?” **Matthew 21:10. {SJ 86.9}**

The disciples, filled with the Spirit of inspiration, answered:  
“Adam will tell you, 'It is the Seed of the woman that shall bruise the serpent's head.'  
“Ask Abraham. He will tell you, 'It is Melchisedek, King of Salem, King of Peace.’  
“Jacob will tell you, 'He is Shiloh of the tribe of Judah.' **{SJ 86.10 - SJ 87.2}**

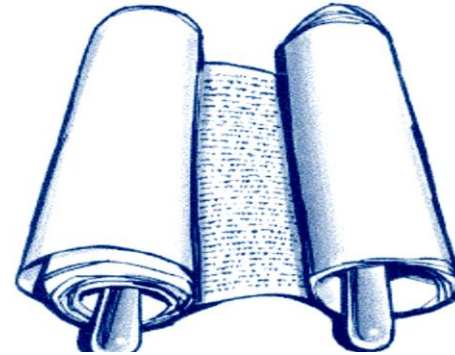

## Nature Importance of Oceans

The oceans are divided into three great oceans in the world. They are called the Pacific Ocean, the Atlantic Ocean, and the Indian Ocean. Then there are a fourth and fifth smaller oceans which are called the Arctic Ocean, and the Antarctic Ocean. (Look at a world map.)

The oceans provide food, energy, and minerals for many people. Many people in the world fish and use the fish for food. Kelp and seaweed are also taken from the ocean for food.

Petroleum oil and natural gas are drilled off shore in the oceans. These have many uses.

Minerals like sand and gravel are taken from oceans. These are made into construction materials and used in other ways.

Other materials from the ocean are pearls, coral shells, and sponges which are used in many ways.

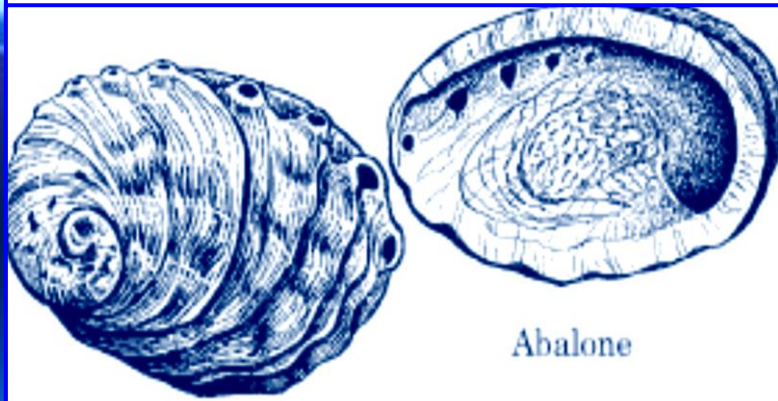
These things from the ocean which are used to **help** people, remind us of the disciples who Jesus called to **help** Him serve the people.

The ocean takes to give. So Andrew had a desire to help his brother by giving him the "*Water of Life*" he had received. He went in search of Simon Peter like the water vapor travels inland to water the thirsty land. Then he and his brother returned to the Messiah as the brooks run back to the sea. The cycle of giving would start over again when Peter would go out to **help** others and lead them to Jesus.

## Remarkable Parent Food

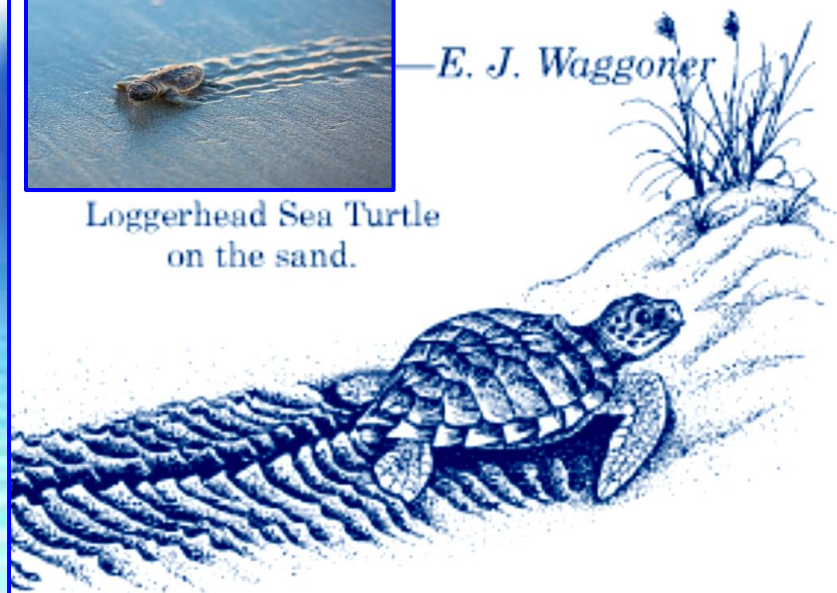
“It is impossible that anyone who is acquainted to any degree with the Lord should stand by the sea without being reminded of the mighty power of the Creator. Yet many gaze upon the sea day after day with never a thought of its Maker, and even openly defy Him. To such the Lord says: *‘Hear now this, O foolish people, and without understanding; which have eyes, and see not; which have ears, and hear not: Fear ye not me? saith the Lord: will ye not tremble at my presence, which have placed the sand for the bound of the sea by a perpetual decree, that it cannot pass it: and thought the waves thereof toss themselves, yet can they not prevail; though they roar, yet can they not pass over it?’* (Jeremiah 5:21-22).

“But it is not in order to produce fright that the Lord reminds us of His mighty power that can set bounds for the sea, so that it cannot pass over in its fiercest tumult. No; it is that we may trust Him. Perfect faith and love drive fear away. So the power of God over the sea is referred to as the evidence of His faithfulness. *‘O Lord God of hosts, who is a strong Lord like unto thee? thou rulest the raging of the sea: when the waves thereof arise, thou stillest them’* (Psalm 89:8-9).”

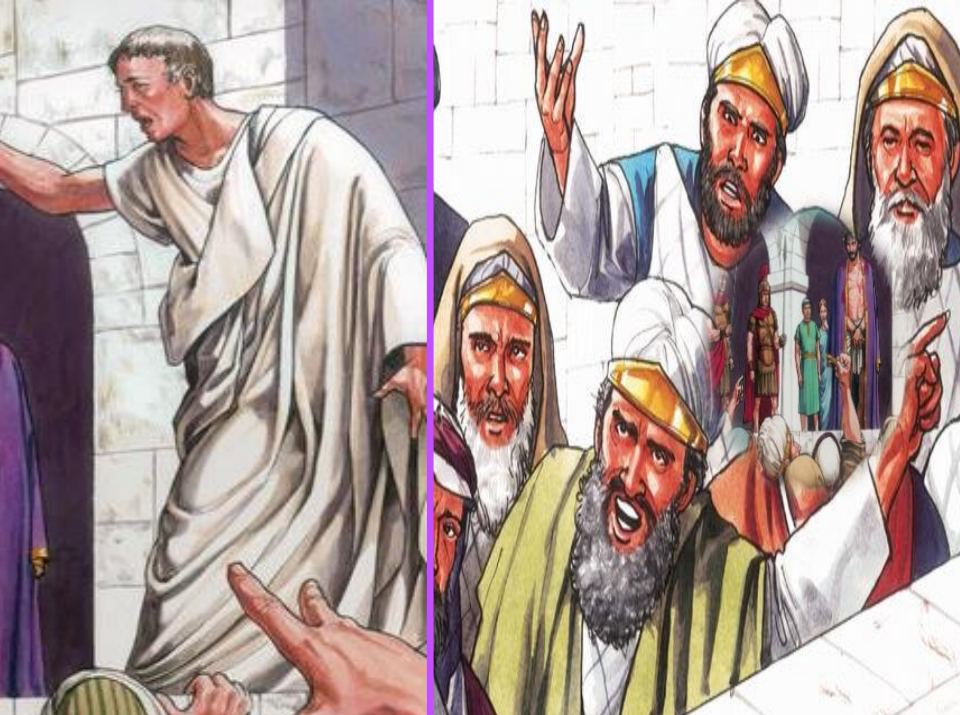
Then came Jesus forth, wearing the crown of thorns, and the purple robe. And [Pilate] saith unto them, Behold the man!

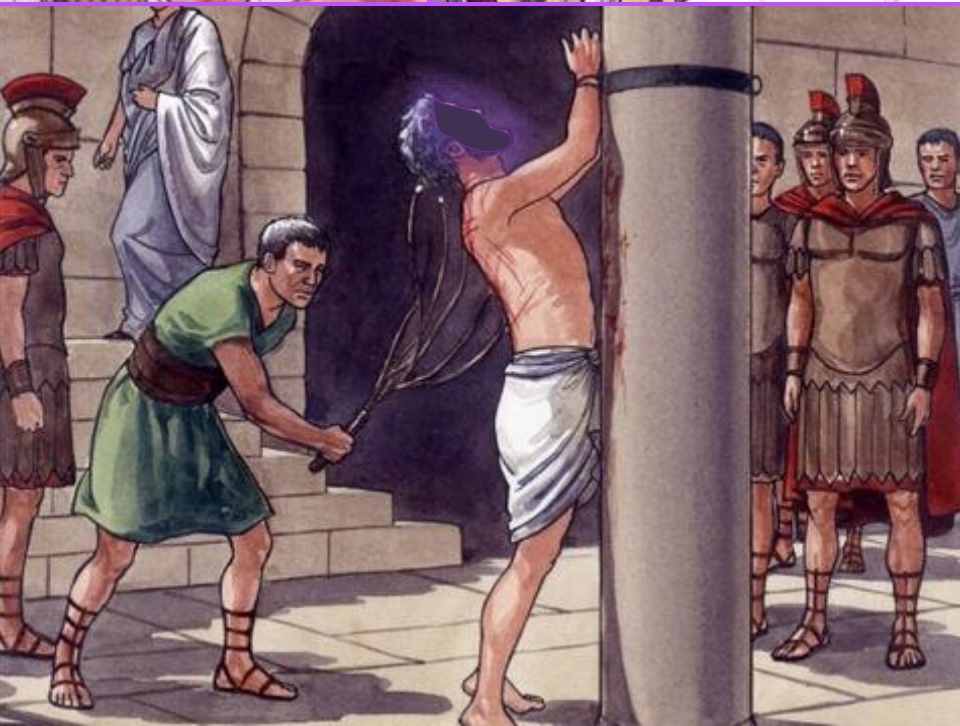
Then delivered he him therefore unto them to be crucified. And they took Jesus, and led [him] away.



When Pilate gave Jesus up to be scourged and mocked, he thought to excite the pity of the multitude. He hoped they would decide that this was sufficient punishment. Even the malice of the priests, he thought, would now be satisfied. But with keen perception the Jews saw the weakness of thus punishing a man who had been declared innocent. {Next Slide Please}



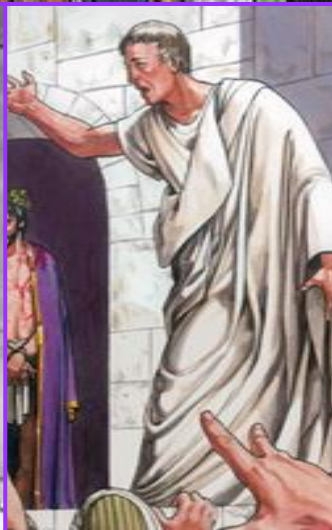




Pilate now sent for Barabbas to be brought into the court. He then presented the two prisoners side by side, and pointing to the Saviour he said in a voice of solemn entreaty, “Behold the Man!” “I bring Him forth to you, that ye may know that I find no fault in Him.” {DA 735.3}

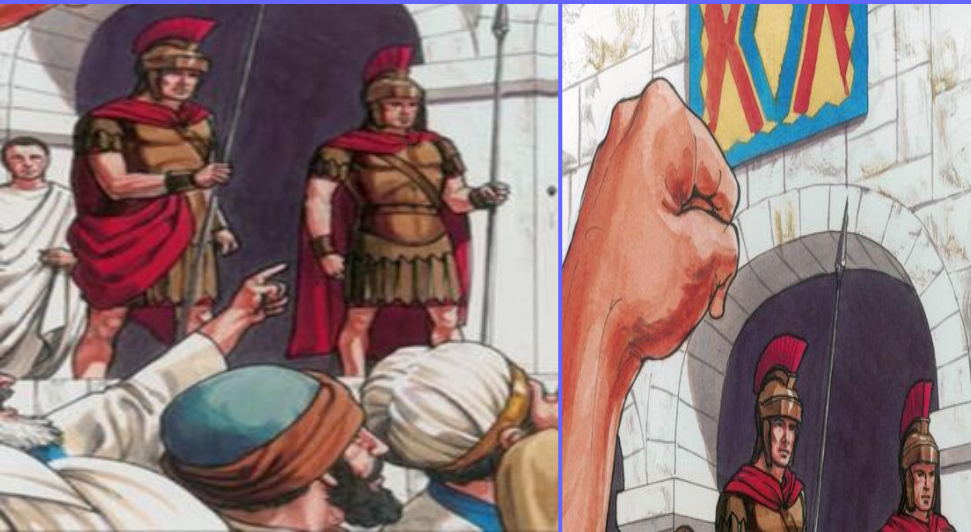


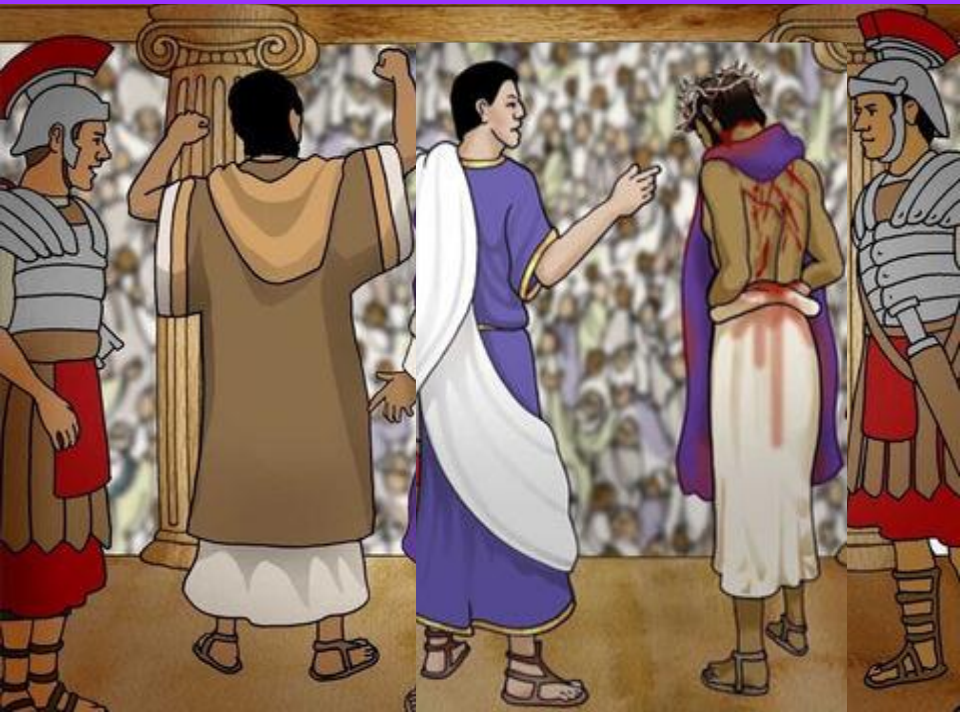
There stood the Son of God,

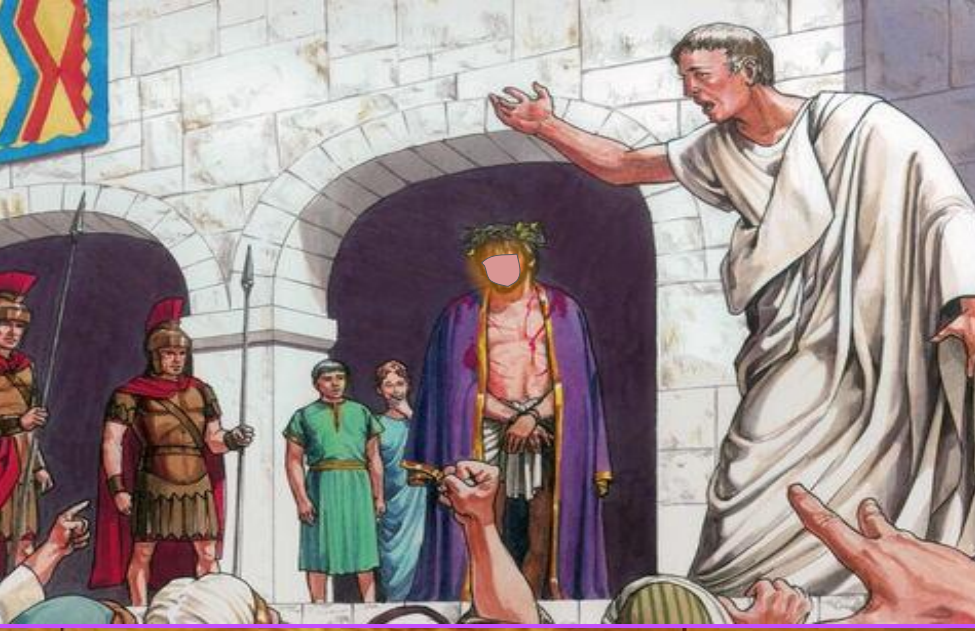




The Roman soldiers that surrounded Christ were not all hardened; some were looking earnestly into His face for one evidence that He was a criminal or dangerous character. From time to time they would turn and cast a look of contempt upon Barabbas. It needed no deep insight to read him through and through.

to the One upon trial.

sufferer with feelings  
of deep pity.

The silent submission  
of Christ stamped upon  
their minds the scene,  
never to be effaced until  
they either acknowledged

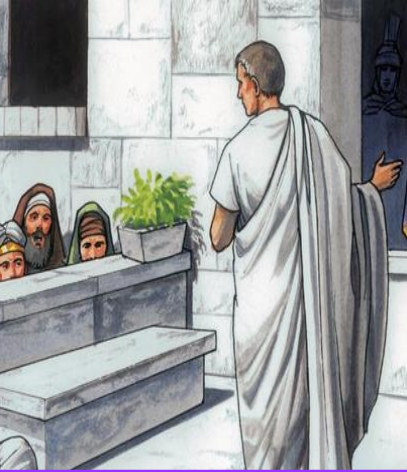

But he did not understand the fanatical hatred of the priests for Him, who, as the Light of the world, {Next Slide Please}


## *The Desire of Ages, p.736*
