Chapter 15 – “At the Passover Supper”

The Children of Israel ate the first Passover supper at the time of their release from bondage in Egypt. {SJ 93.1}

God had promised to set them free. He had told them that the first-born son in every family of the Egyptians was to be slain. {SJ 93.2}

He had told them to mark their own door posts with the blood of the slain lamb, that the angel of death might pass them by. {SJ 93.3}

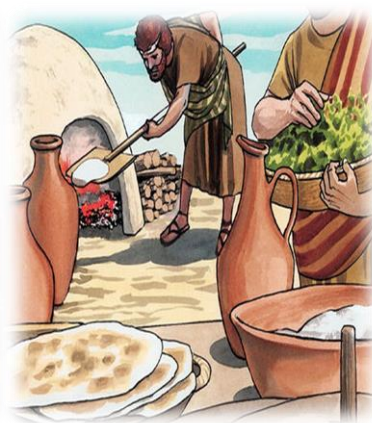
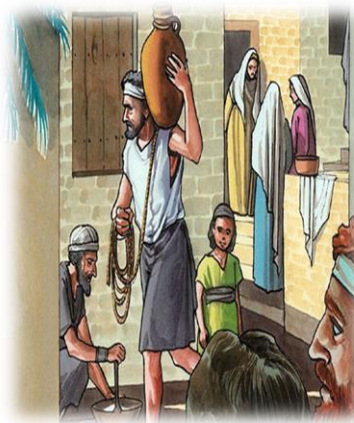
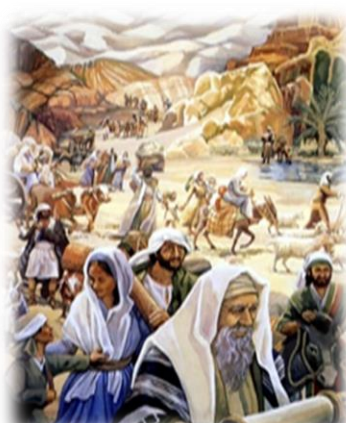
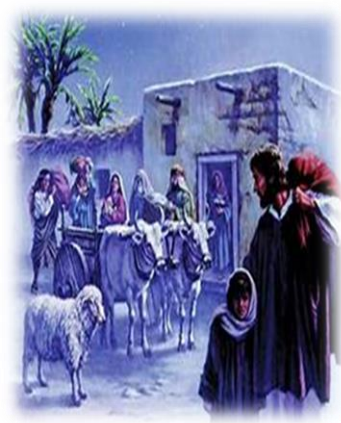
The lamb itself they were to roast and eat at night, with unleavened bread and with bitter herbs, which represented the bitterness of their slavery.

When they ate the lamb, they must be all ready for a journey.

They must have their shoes on their feet, and their staves in their hands. {SJ 93.5}

Continuing:

They did as the Lord had said, and that very night the king of Egypt sent them word that they might go free. In the morning they started on their way to the land of promise. {SJ 93.6}

So every year, the same night on which they left Egypt, all the Israelites kept the feast of the Passover at Jerusalem. And this feast each family had a roasted lamb, with bread and bitter herbs, as their forefathers had in Egypt. And they told their children the story of God's goodness in freeing His people from slavery. {SJ 93.7}

The time had now come when Christ was to keep the feast with His disciples, and He told Peter and John to find a place, and make ready the Passover supper. {SJ 94.1}

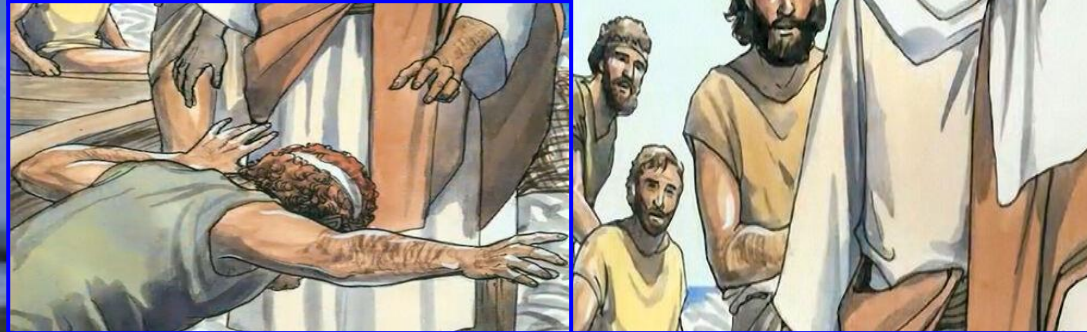

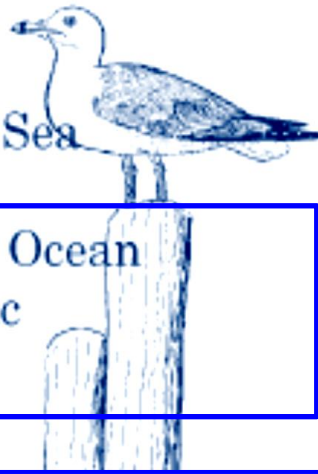

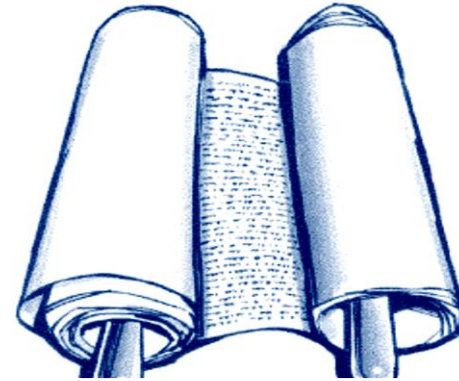

Exploring the Ocean And the Music of the Sea

Scientists explore and study the ocean in many ways. They use ships equipped with much scientific equipment. They have submarines that go deep under the water. The satellites from way up in the sky can view the ocean and give out information very quickly. Computers also help as scientists collect and put information into them. As the scientist studies the oceans so we need to study the ways to follow Jesus. He will not disappoint us, but will give us new ideas that will be very **helpful** to us. There are many new and interesting discoveries being made all the time about the oceans.

“Some people call the world God’s great cathedral. One of its organs is the sea. Oh, it is a great organ, the sea! It can play as sweet and soft as a flute. But it can also roar and thunder to terrify the bravest.

“The sounds are many that make the music of the sea. It may seem to you one great sound, but it is made up of many. As you lie by the sea on a breezy day. You see the little white waves out there like sheep in a green field, or like cloudlets in the sky. Each one of them is making a little whisper as it runs along and breaks; and the sum of all their whispers must be something considerable, like the singing of a forest of little birds.

“There is the sound of every wave that tumbles on the sand, the rush of it as it runs along the beach, the hiss of it as it draws back. And there is the rattle of the pebbles one upon another, which it carries back with it. Then there is the little clash



as it meets another upcoming wave, and the pebbles are driven up again. Then there must be the sound of the tidal wave as it rises for hours, and then sinks for hours away. Streams are flowing with their own sound into the sea, or falling over cliffs with a trickle, or a splash, or a thud.

“And the winds are piping in many keys; and the sea birds are shrieking with wild sounds, which, perhaps, you do not separately hear, but they all make up the one mysterious voice and music of the sea—a voice as rich, and a music as unfathomable, as the great ocean deeps themselves.”

The music of the sea can remind us of the voice of God which Revelation tells us is “*as the sound of many waters*” (Revelation 1:15). “*Hear attentively the noise of his voice, and the sound that goeth out of his mouth...God thundereth marvelously with his voice; great things doeth he, which we cannot comprehend*” (Job 37:2, 5). “*The voice of the Lord is upon the waters...The voice of the Lord is powerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty*” (Psalm 29:3-4).

Did you know that God wants you, like the disciples, to be a part of His voice on this earth? The music of the sea reminds us of the great hymn of praise God longs to hear from the sea of humanity. “*And I heard as it were the voice of a great multitude, and as the voice of many waters...saying, Alleluia: for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth*” (Revelation 19:6).

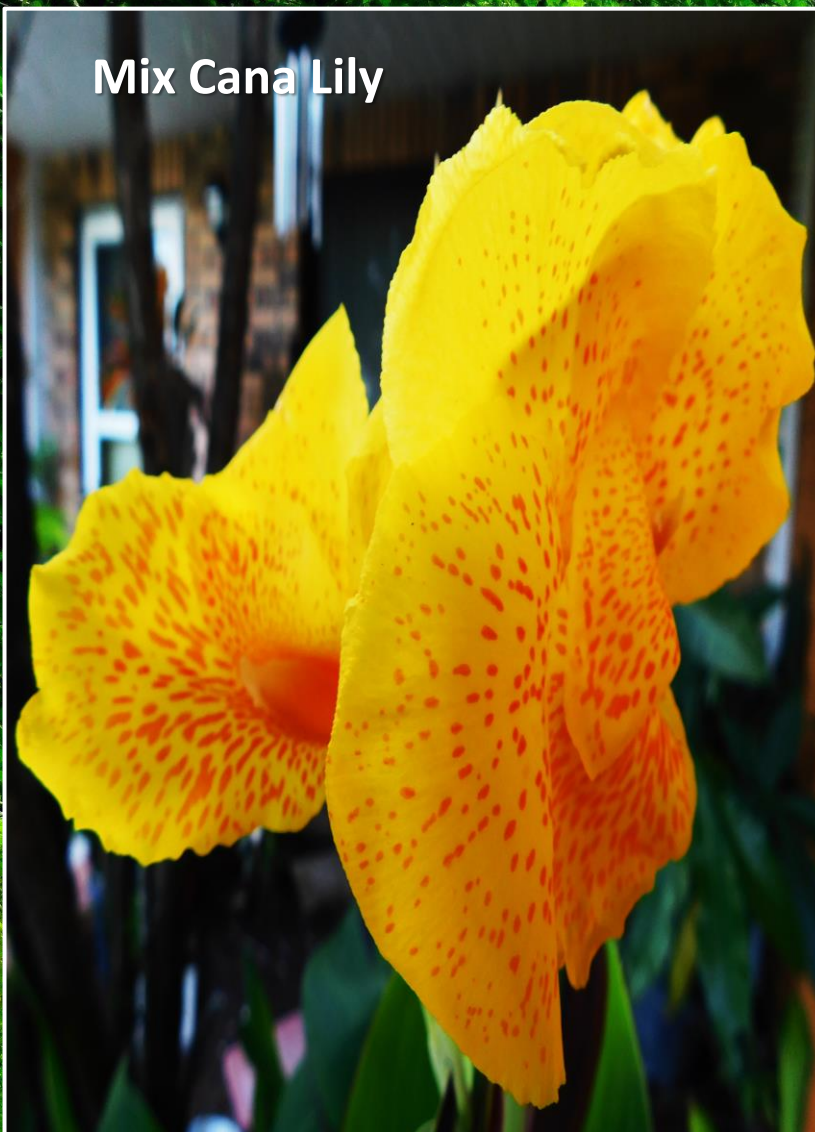




Continuing:

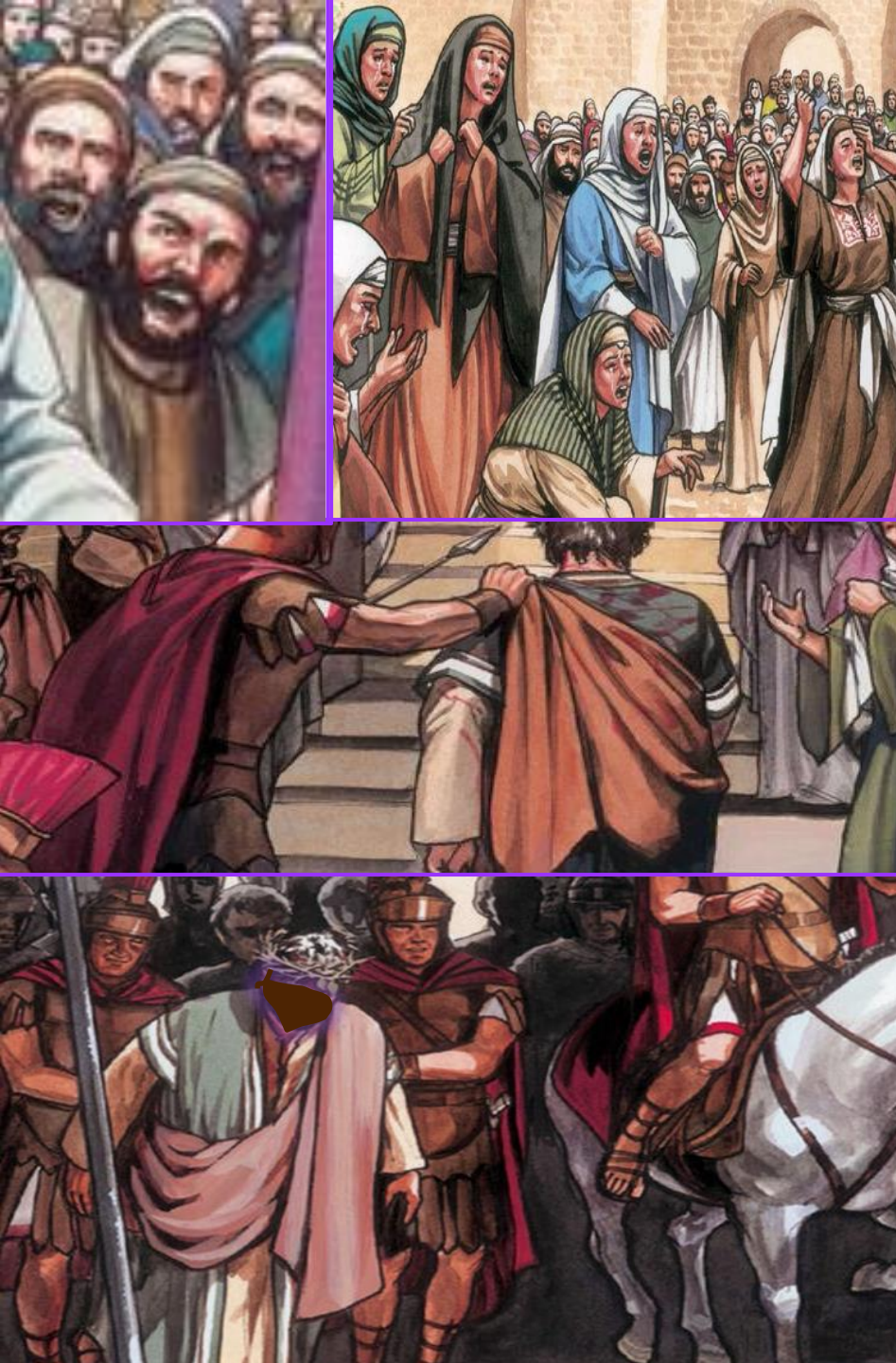

A vast multitude followed Jesus from the judgment hall to Calvary.

The news of His condemnation had spread throughout Jerusalem, and people of all classes and all ranks flocked toward the place of crucifixion. The priests and rulers had been bound by a promise not to molest Christ's followers if He Himself were delivered to them, and the disciples and believers from the city and the surrounding region joined the throng that followed the Saviour.

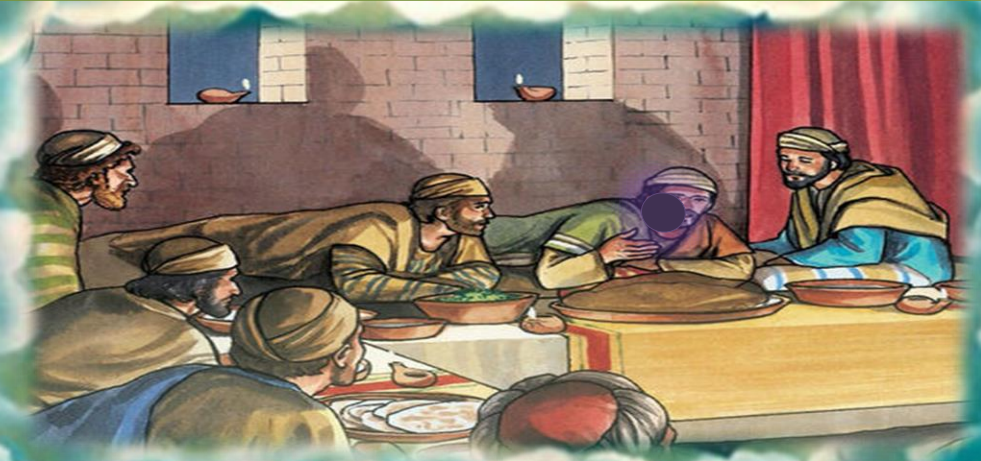

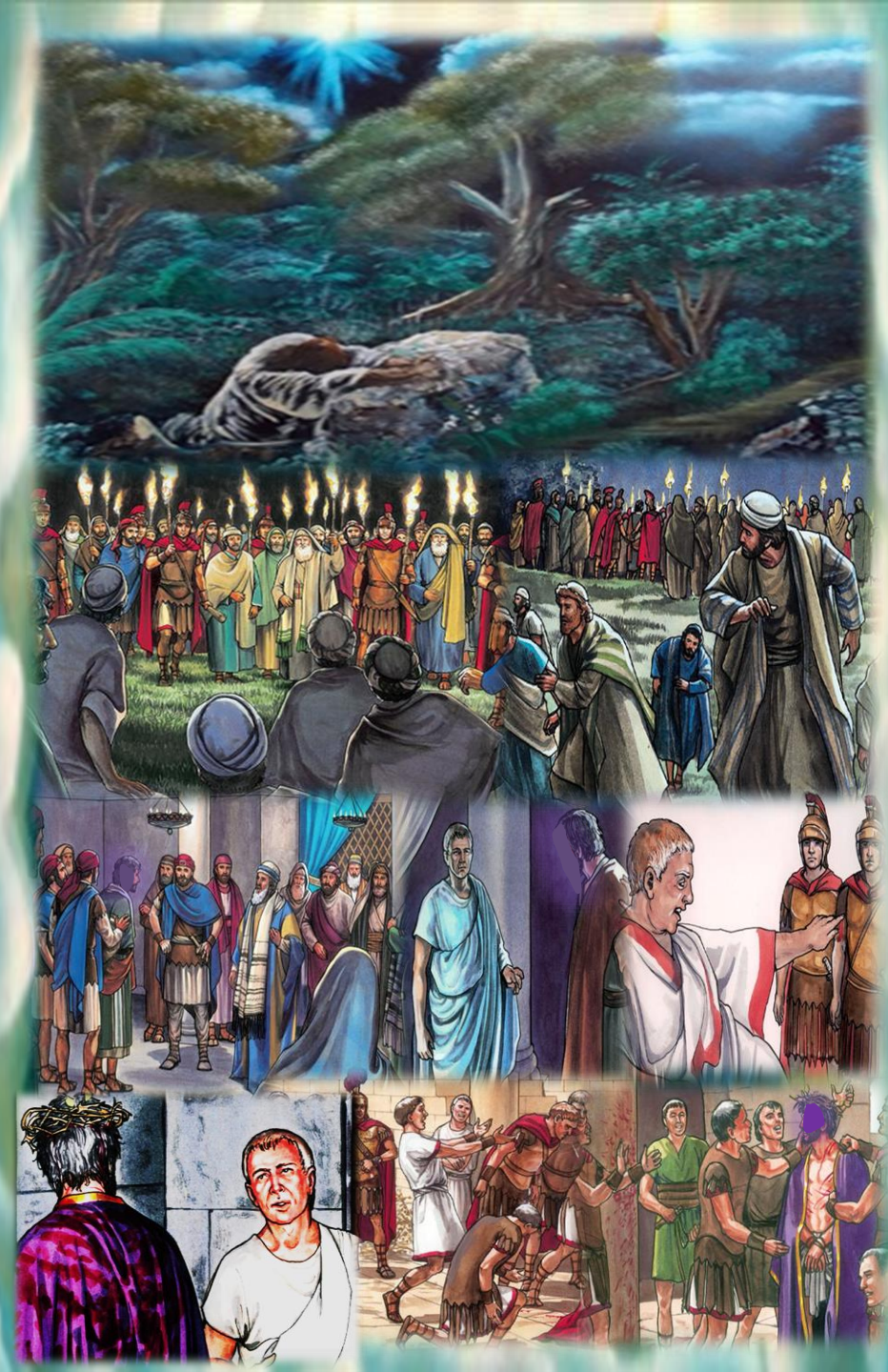
As Jesus passed the gate of Pilate's court, the cross which had been prepared for Barabbas was laid upon His bruised and bleeding shoulders. Two companions of Barabbas were to suffer death at the same time with Jesus, and upon them also crosses were placed. The Saviour's burden was too heavy for Him in His weak and suffering condition. Since the Passover supper with His disciples, He had taken neither food nor drink.

Continuing:

He had agonized in the garden of Gethsemane in conflict with satanic agencies. He had endured the anguish of the betrayal, and had seen His disciples forsake Him and flee. He had been taken to Annas, then to Caiaphas, and then to Pilate. From Pilate He had been sent to Herod, then sent again to Pilate. From insult to renewed insult, from mockery to mockery, {Next Slide Please}

Continuing: twice tortured by the scourge,-- all that night there had been scene after scene of a character to try the soul of man to the uttermost.

Christ had not failed.


He had spoken no word but that tended to glorify God.

But when after the second scourging the cross was laid upon Him, human nature could bear no more. He fell fainting beneath the burden.

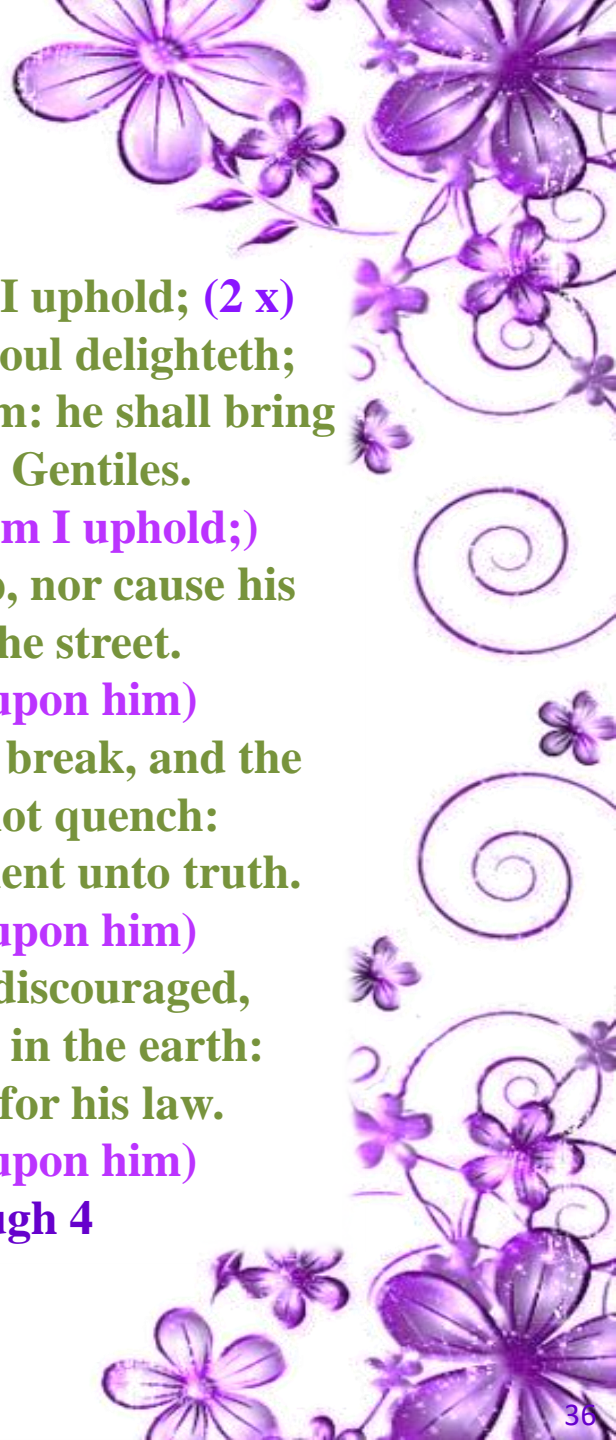

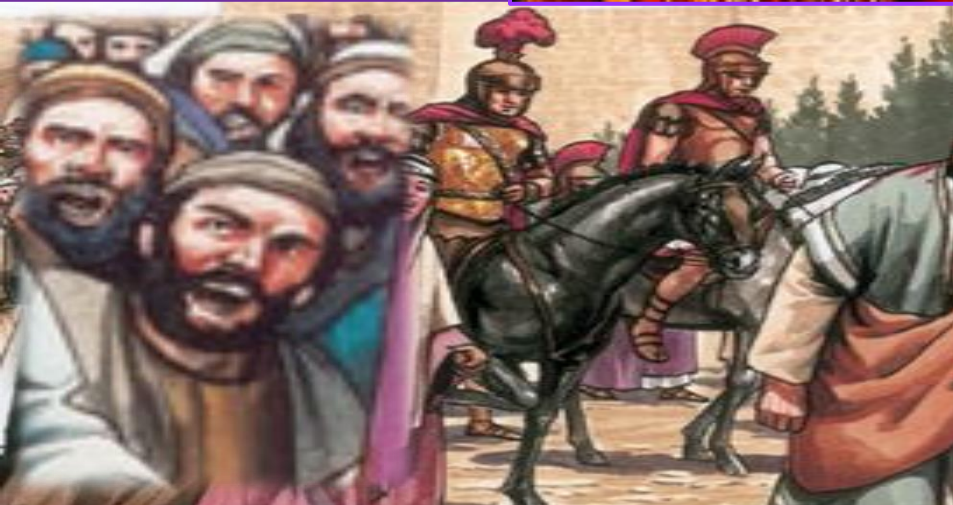
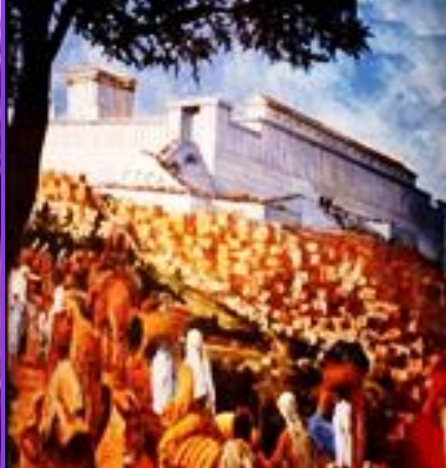


The crowd that followed the Saviour saw His weak and staggering steps, but they manifested no compassion. They taunted and reviled Him because He could not carry the heavy cross. Again the burden was laid upon Him, and again He fell fainting to the ground. {Next Slide Please}
