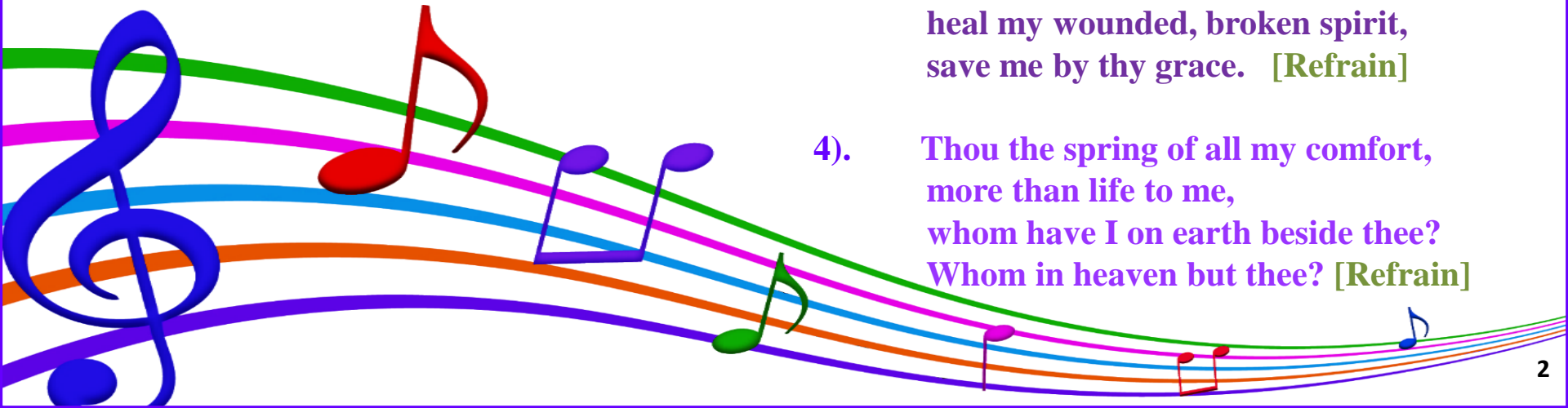

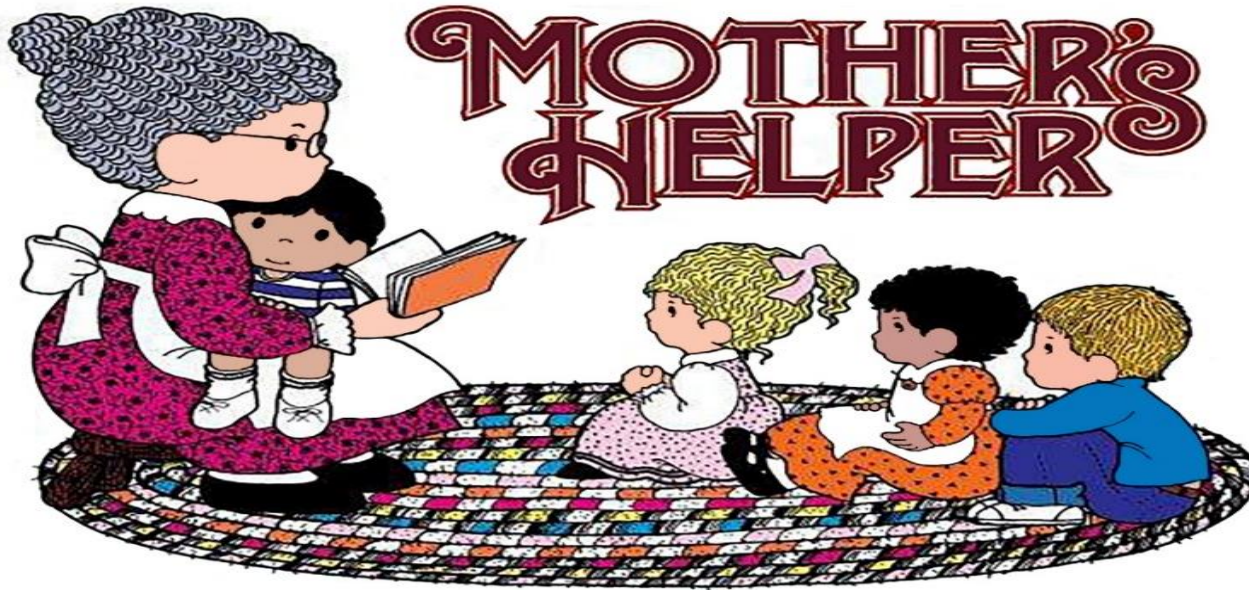

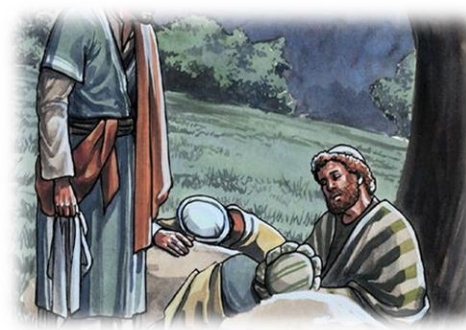

## Chapter 16 – “In Gethsemane ” Part 3

**Continuing:** But the disciples trusted to themselves. They did not look to the Mighty Helper as Christ had counselled them to do. So when the Saviour was most in need of their sympathy and prayers, they were found asleep. Even Peter was sleeping. {SJ 103.4} And John, the loving disciple who had leaned upon the breast of Jesus, was asleep. Surely the love of John for his Master should have kept him awake. His earnest prayers should have mingled with those of his loved Saviour in the time of His great agony.

The Redeemer had spent whole nights in praying for His disciples, that their faith might not fail in the hour of trial. Yet they could not remain awake with Him even one hour. {SJ 103.5}

Had Christ now asked James and John, “Can ye drink of the cup that I drink of? and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?” they would not have answered so readily as they did before,

“We can.” Mark 10:38, 39. {SJ 103.6}

What an example of the tender, loving pity of the Saviour! **{SJ 104.4}**

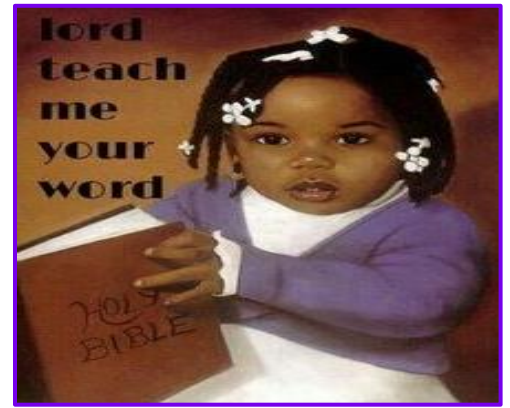
Again the Son of God was seized with superhuman agony.

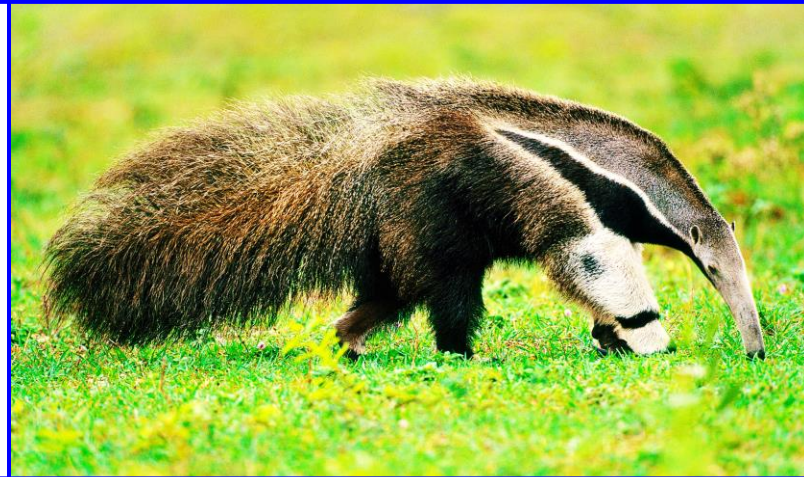

## Creature Features

**SPECIES:** *Myrmecophaga tridactyla*

**SIZE:** Length of body & tail up to 10 ft.;  
Height up to 2 ft.;  
Weight up to 86 lbs.

**HABITAT:** Open areas of Central  
and South America

**PREY:** Ants and termites

**LIFESPAN:** Up to 25 years

**BY THE NOSE:** The giant anteater always follows its long nose. The creature's sense of smell is 40 times better than that of a human, and it can find ant and termite colonies simply by sniffing.

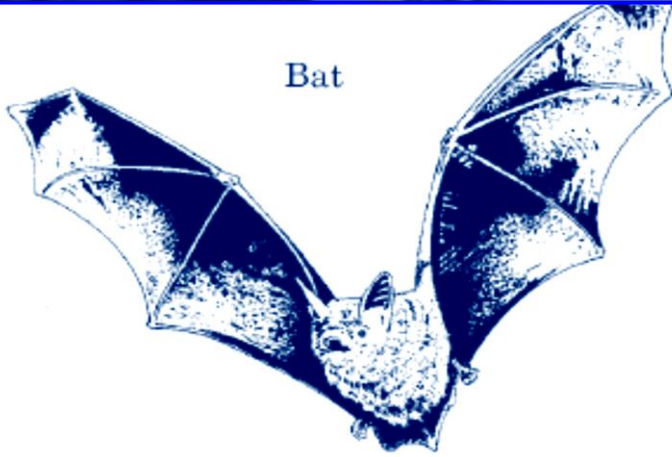
**STAY SHARP:** Sharp, 4-inch claws on the anteater's front feet are good for digging and also for slashing at enemies when cornered. This mammal walks on its knuckles so it doesn't dull these vital tools.

The giant anteater is always sticking its nose into something—mainly anthills and termite mounds. This strange-looking creature's long snout is a super-sniffer. It helps the anteater smell prey and also holds a long sticky tongue that's perfect for nailing scurrying insects. Curving claws help the anteater dig into tough terrain where ants or termites might be hiding.

Giant Anteaters have some of the biggest claws of any mammal, so they walk on the knuckles with the claws curled under.

In Palestine, the land of the Bible times, there are many mammals. One mammal that you might confuse with a bird is a bat. Why? Probably because it flies. We will study about this unusual mammal this week.

Remember a mammal has these characteristics:

1. Warm-blooded,
2. Has a backbone,
3. Two pairs of limbs,
4. More or less complete covering of hair
5. Feeds its babies with milk,
6. Most give their young protection and training, and
7. Mammals have a larger, more well-developed brain than other animals.





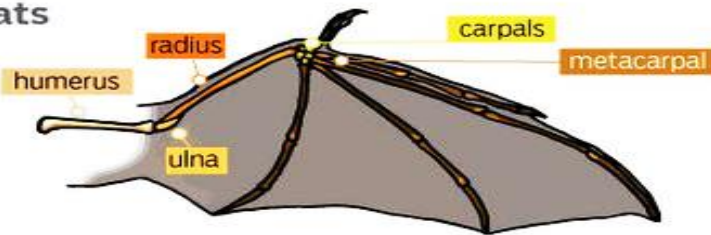
# Morphology

With their forelimbs adapted as wings, they are the only mammals capable of true and sustained flight.

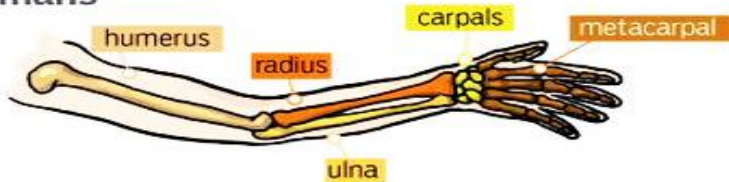


Arm skeletal similarity with bats

As Jesus spoke of the living water, the woman looked upon Him with wondering attention.  
He had aroused her interest, and awakened a desire for the gift of which He spoke.

She perceived that it was not the water of Jacob's well to which He referred;  
for of this she used continually, drinking, and thirsting again.

“Sir,” she said, “give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw.” {DA 187.4}  
Jesus now abruptly turned the conversation.

Before this soul could receive the gift He longed to bestow, she must be brought to recognize  
her sin and her Saviour. He “saith unto her, Go, call thy husband, and come hither.”

She answered, “I have no husband.”

Thus she hoped to prevent all questioning in that direction.

But the Saviour continued, “Thou hast well said, I have no husband: for thou hast had five  
husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly.”

{DA 187.5}

The listener trembled. A mysterious hand was turning the pages of her life history,  
bringing to view that which she had hoped to keep forever hidden.

Who was He that could read the secrets of her life?

There came to her thoughts of eternity, of the future Judgment,  
when all that is now hidden shall be revealed. In its light, conscience was awakened.
