Chapter 16 – "In Gethsemane" Part 4

Continuing: "O My Father, if this cup may not pass away from Me, except I drink it, Thy will be done." Matthew 26:42. {SJ 104.6}

The agony of this prayer forced drops of blood from His pores.

Again He sought the disciples for sympathy, and again He found them sleeping.

His presence aroused them. They looked upon His face with fear, for it was stained with blood.

They could not understand the anguish of mind which His face expressed. {SJ 104.7}

The third time He sought the place of prayer. A horror of great darkness overcame Him.

He had lost the presence of His Father. Without this,

He feared that in His human nature He could not endure the test. {SJ 104.8}

The third time He prays the same prayer as before.











Continuing: The Son of God must drink this cup, or the world will be lost forever.

He sees the helplessness of man. He sees the power of sin.

The woes of a doomed world pass in review before Him. {SJ 104.9}

He makes the final decision. He will save man at any cost to Himself.

He has left the courts of Heaven, where all is purity, happiness, and glory, to save the one lost sheep, the one world that has fallen by transgression, and He will not turn from His purpose.

His prayer now breathes only submission: **{SJ 105.1**}

"If this cup may not pass away from Me, except I drink it, Thy will be done." {SJ 105.2} The Saviour now falls dying to the ground. No disciple is there, to place his hand tenderly beneath his Master's head, and bathe that brow, marred indeed more than the sons of men.

Christ is alone; of all the people there are none with Him. **{SJ 105.3**}

- 4:24 God [is] a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship [him] in spirit and in truth.



Nature

What Mammals Eat

Most mammals eat plants. They are called herbivores. He causeth the grass to grow for the cattle" (Psalm 104:14). Because plants wear teeth down from chewing, mammals' teeth are designed in such a way to help counteract such wear. The teeth have high crowns and therefore wear down slowly. Some herbivorous mammals are: cows, horses, elephants, and many more. The stomachs of herbivorous animals are made so they can eat large quantities of coarse plants. They have a strong digestive juice that is capable of digesting cellulose, the woody part of grass, herbs, and branches of trees. Herbivores help to keep the fields of earth mowed.

The front teeth of beavers, rats, and other rodents grow continuously, therefore they must keep them worn down. Beavers do this by chewing down trees. The way the teeth of these mammals are constantly renewed can remind us of the never-failing supply of living water that Jesus offered the woman of Samaria. People have teeth like herbivorous animals. What do you think God planned for people to eat? Read Genesis 1:29-30.

Mammals that eat animals are called carnivores. They are usually very fast animals that can catch their prey. They also have cushioned feet that can move about noiselessly and can sneak up on their prey without being noticed. Some examples are: lions, tigers, leopards, wolves, and cougars. They do not thoroughly chew their food. They swallow pieces of it whole. They use their long, sharp teeth to grasp

and other sea mammals. Some carnivorous mammals feed on the bodies of dead
animals instead of hunting fresh prey.
One example is hyenas, which have strong
jaws that can crush large bones. The <u>carnivorous</u> animals remind us of Satan and
the sneaky way he tries to destroy God's
children.

Some mammals eat insects. They are called <u>insectivores</u>. The teeth of bats are such that can crush and slice off the hard outer parts of insects. Then the mammal can feed on the soft part within. Some insect-eaters, like aardvarks, anteaters, numbats, and pangolins have weak teeth or none at all. These mammals feast on ants and termites, using their long sticky tongues to catch them. They swallow them whole without chewing.

Mammals that eat both plants and animals are called <u>omnivores</u>. Their teeth can grind plants and tear off flesh. Some examples are: bears, and opossums. Omnivorous mammals eat what is available in the season. A spotted skunk will eat fruits, seeds, and insects in summer while in winter they eat mostly mice and rats.

Eating reminds us of the words of God and partaking of it. Jesus shared precious, kind words with the woman at the well. "Thy words were found, and I did eat them; and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart" (Jeremiah 15:15).

In the beginning God planned that all animals and man would eat vegetation. Sin has changed the diet of animals and man. This can remind us how God meant for His words to make up the spiritual diet of all men. But some of the ancestors of the Samaritans had not kept feeding on God's words. As a result, they "were overcome by an idolatrous nation...whose religion gradually contaminated their own." (*The Desire of Ages* 188) They had a mixed up spiritual diet like an omnivore.

In heaven the animals and man will again have a diet of vegetation "... The lion shall eat straw like the ox" (Isaiah 11:7). You and I can practice eating fruits, nuts, grains, and vegetables right now to prepare for the heavenly home. We can also have salvation today, just as Jesus offered it to the woman at the well. "Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of salvation" (Isaiah 12:3).

Remind

- 1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
- 2. As you fix a meal, or eat it, remember what diets the mammals have. Be reminded how God wants us to eat His word and, like the woman at the well, find salvation.


Continuing: Here God had manifested His glory above the mercy seat. No one but the high priest ever lifted the veil separating this apartment from the rest of the temple. He entered in once a year to make an atonement for the sins of the people. But lo, this veil is rent in twain. The most holy place of the earthly sanctuary is no longer sacred. **{DA 756.5}**







All is terror and confusion. The priest is about to slay the victim; but the knife drops from his nerveless hand, and the lamb escapes. Type has met antitype in the death of God's Son. The great sacrifice has been made. The way into the holiest is laid open. A new and living way is prepared for all. No longer need sinful, sorrowing humanity await the coming of the high priest. **{Next Slide Please}**



Henceforth the Saviour was to officiate as priest and advocate in the heaven of heavens. It was as if a living voice had spoken to the worshipers: There is now an end to all sacrifices and offerings for sin. The Son of God is come according to His word, "Lo, I come (in the volume of the Book it is written of Me,) to do Thy will, O God." "By His own blood" He entereth "in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us." Hebrews 10:7; 9:12. {DA 757.1}





We will end our Chapter with a Reinforcement of our Saviour' Sacrifice for us all, entitled, "Nature Sympathized With His Suffering!"

Faith and hope trembled in the expiring agonies of Christ because God had removed the assurance He had heretofore given His beloved Son of His approbation and acceptance. The Redeemer of the world then relied upon the evidences which had hitherto strengthened Him, that His Father accepted His labors and was pleased with His work. In His dying agony, as He yields up His precious life, He has by faith alone to trust in Him whom it has ever been His joy to obey. Amid the convulsions of nature are heard by the amazed spectators the dying words of the Man of Calvary. {LHU 42.3}



Nature sympathized with the suffering of its Author. The heaving earth, the rent rocks, proclaimed that it was the Son of God who died. There was a mighty earthquake. The veil of the Temple was rent in twain. Terror seized the executioners and spectators as they beheld the sun veiled in darkness, and felt the earth shake beneath them, and saw and heard the rending of the rocks. The mocking and jeering of the chief priests and elders were hushed as Christ commended His spirit into the hands of His Father. The astonished throng began to withdraw and grope their way in the darkness to the city. They smote upon their breasts as they went and in terror, speaking scarcely above a whisper, said among themselves: "It is an innocent person that has been murdered. 




Dear Remnant Families, Boys, Girls, and Guests;
