
Nature

Movement of Mammals Land

Most mammals live on land. They move about on four legs. They are called terrestrial. In walking they lift one foot at a time—first, one forefoot, then, the opposite hindfoot; then, the other forefoot; and then, the opposite hindfoot. When moving faster, mammals trot by lifting one forefoot and the opposite hindfoot at the same time. Camels, elephants, and giraffes pace. This means they lift both feet on one side of the body at the same time. When terrestrial mammals are moving very fast they gallop. When galloping, they usually have one foot on the ground at a time but at some point all four feet are in the air.

Other mammals move by hopping, like kangaroos, kangaroo rats, and rabbits. Their hind legs are very strong and some have long tails that are used for balance. Each animal has a special way to move. Have you ever noticed how people walk? How they move quickly when they are excited?





Trees

Arboreal mammals live in forested areas and make their homes in the trees. Arboreals have special body features that assist them in moving through the trees. Monkeys have hands and feet that can grasp the branches of the trees. Many monkeys have a prehensile (grasping) tail for hanging onto branches for support.

Monkeys can form living bridges from one tree to another. Such living bridges make it so that mothers and their baby monkeys can pass over rivers, chasms, and gorges quickly and easily. This is how a living bridge is formed: First, several monkeys run up a large tree near the edge of the river. Next one of the monkeys goes out on a strong limb and makes several turns of its tail around it. Then it steps off the branch and hangs with its head downward. The next monkey climbs down the body of the first monkey and fastens its tail about the neck and forelimbs of monkey number one. This is repeated until a long monkey-rope is made. Then the living rope starts to slowly swing. It gathers enough speed to reach the branches of a tree on the opposite side.

The last monkey grabs hold of these branches and the bridge is formed. Several hundred monkeys may pass over this living bridge. What a good illustration of **kind** service to others in the mammal world!



Are you wondering how the monkeys that make up the living bridge will pass over? If monkey number one should let go with his tail, he, along with several other monkeys, would be dashed against the opposite bank or perhaps would end up in the water. The problem is solved by several of the strongest monkeys throwing their tails about the last monkey in the bridge. Then they run up to a strong, high limb which causes the bridge to be lifted into an almost horizontal position. After this is done, the monkey gives a screaming signal to the first monkey to let go of the limb. Then the whole monkey-rope swings over. The lowest monkeys in the chain drop to the ground while the higher monkeys leap to the branches and come down by the trunk.




The monkey bridge brings to mind I John 3:16. *"Hereby perceive we the love of God, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren."*

Other mammals with prehensile tails are opossums, phalangers, some species of anteaters, and some porcupines. Squirrels have sharp, curved claws, as do tree shrews, that help them in climbing trees.

Water

Mammals that live all their lives in water are dolphins, porpoises, manatees, and whales. Their bodies are streamlined with a powerful tail. They move their tails up and down to propel themselves through the water. Their paddle-like flippers are used for steering and balance.

Other mammals spend part of their time in water such as, hippopotamuses, and walruses. Walruses swim by moving their forelimbs and their hindlimbs. Other species use mainly their forelimbs, like platypuses, polar bears, fur seals, and sea lions. While beavers and hair seals use only their hindlimbs to swim.



Air

Bats are the only mammals that fly. Their wings have thin skin stretched over the bones of the forelimbs. The wing movements of bats are: forward, downward, upward and then backward. There are several mammals that can glide, like flying lemurs, and flying squirrels. They have a fold of skin between the forelimb and hind limb on each side of the body. By stretching out their limbs they can glide from one tree to another.

Underground

Mammals that live underground are called fossorial. Some fossorial mammals are: pocket gophers, and moles. These underground mammals have strong claws and powerful forelimbs. Most have poor vision and some are blind. Moles literally “swim” through the soil like a person swims through the water. They have forelimbs that are turned so that the broad palms face backward and the elbows point upward.

These mammals live in darkness. Most of the Jews in Jesus’ day lived in darkness.

“The Jews had been instructed from childhood concerning the work of the Messiah. The inspired utterances of patriarchs and prophets and the symbolic teaching of the sacrificial service had been theirs. But they had disregarded the light; and now they saw in Jesus nothing to be desired...” (*The Desire of Ages* 317) The Samaritans desired the light. We are told, “*Then they went out of the city, and came unto Him.*” Jesus was “celestial” or coming down from or belonging to heaven.

Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. As you call people to come for lunch, notice how they move or as they are given chores to do, note the way they walk. Be reminded how the Samaritan woman moved when she heard the Messiah was Jesus. Because we appreciate the kindness our parents show us, we will hasten to obey them.

Reinforce

1. Look for mammals! Use your guide book to identify them.
2. Draw mammal legs or fins by looking at pictures. Put them on your bulletin board. See if others can identify them.
3. Find pictures of “terrestrial” mammals, an “Arboreal” mammal, and a “fossorial” mammal. Make three cards with these words on them. Place the pictures under the appropriate card.
4. As a family, build a well out of rocks and cement that flowers can be planted in it. Put the Scripture John 4:13-14 on a plaque in front of the well.
5. Say your memory verse!
