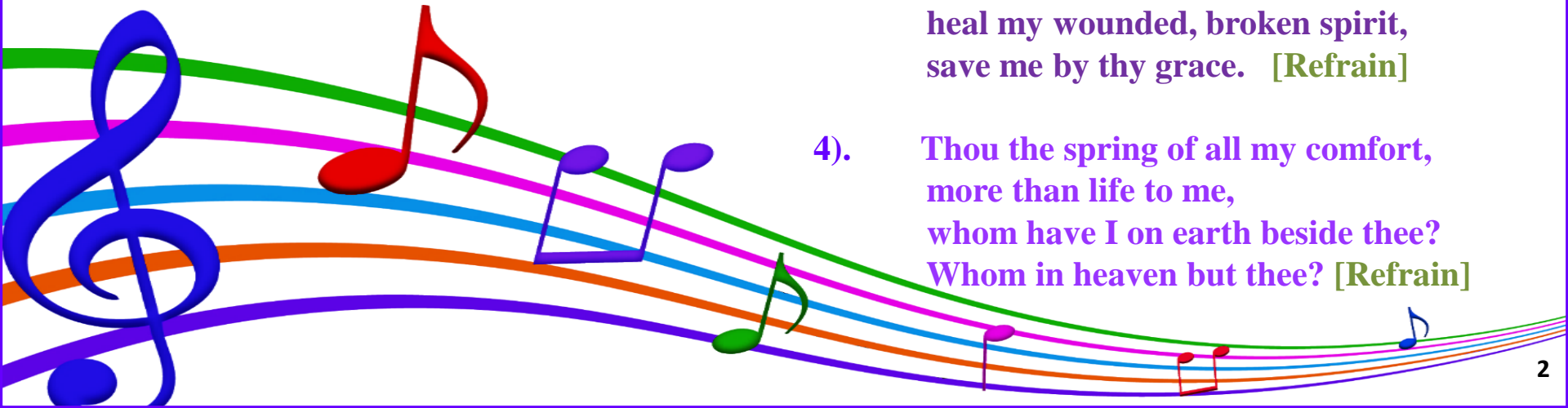

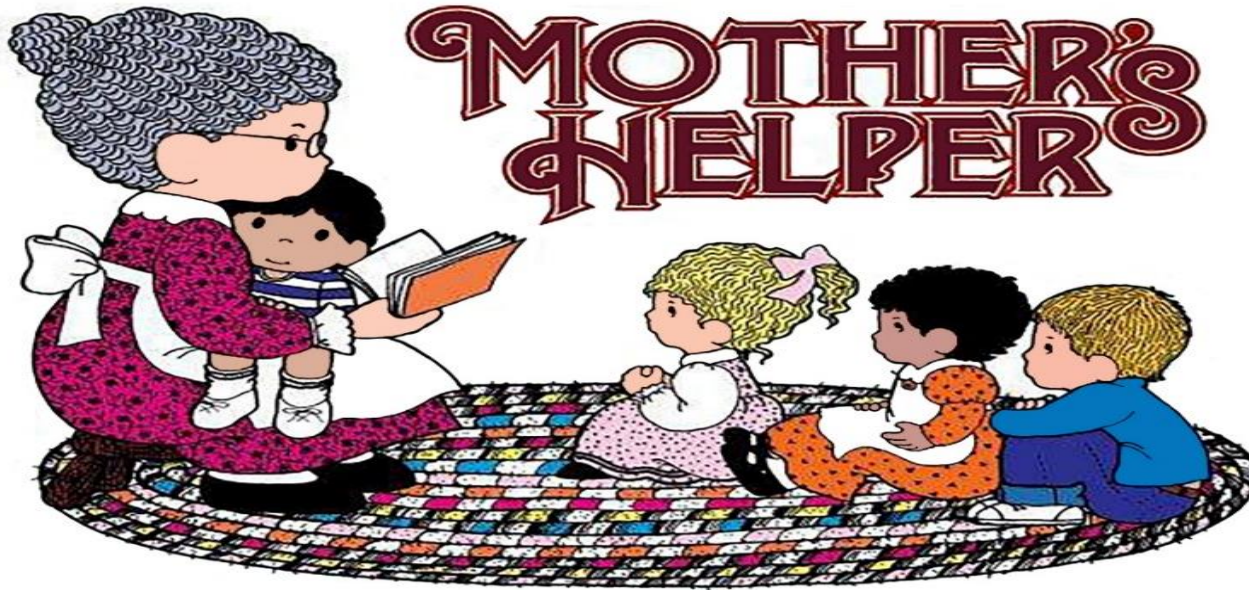

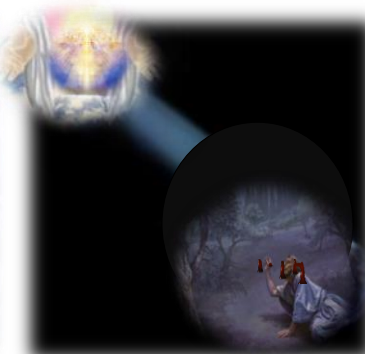

“Sleep on now, and take your rest: behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is betrayed into the hands of sinners.” {SJ 106.2}

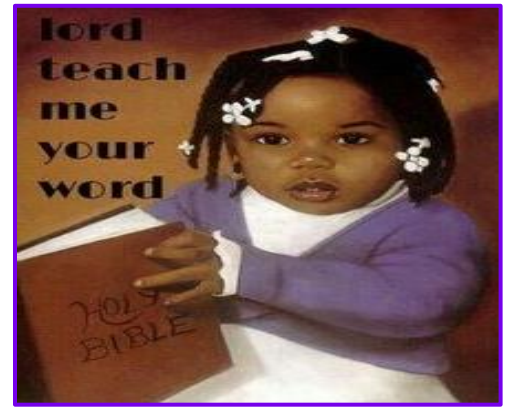

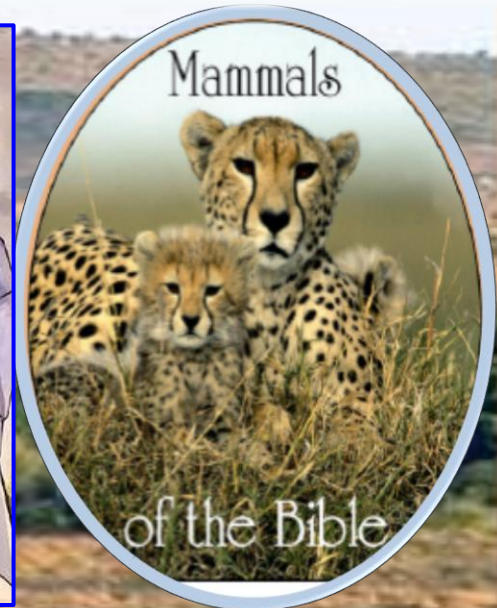
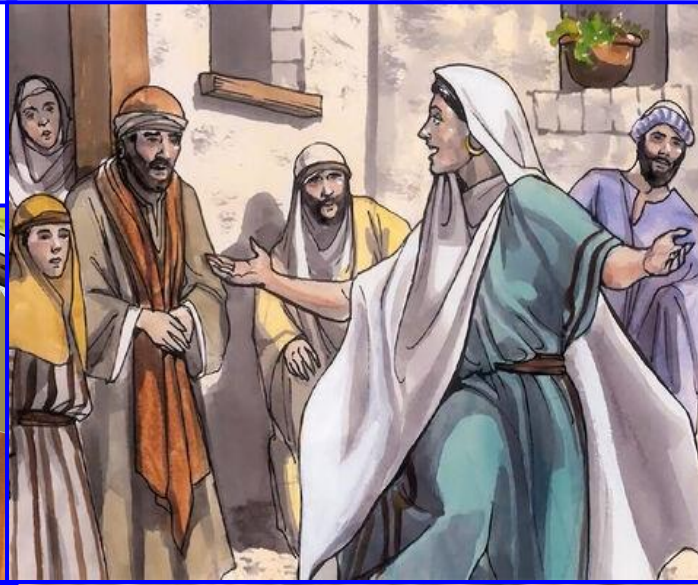

### 1 – A Woman at a Well

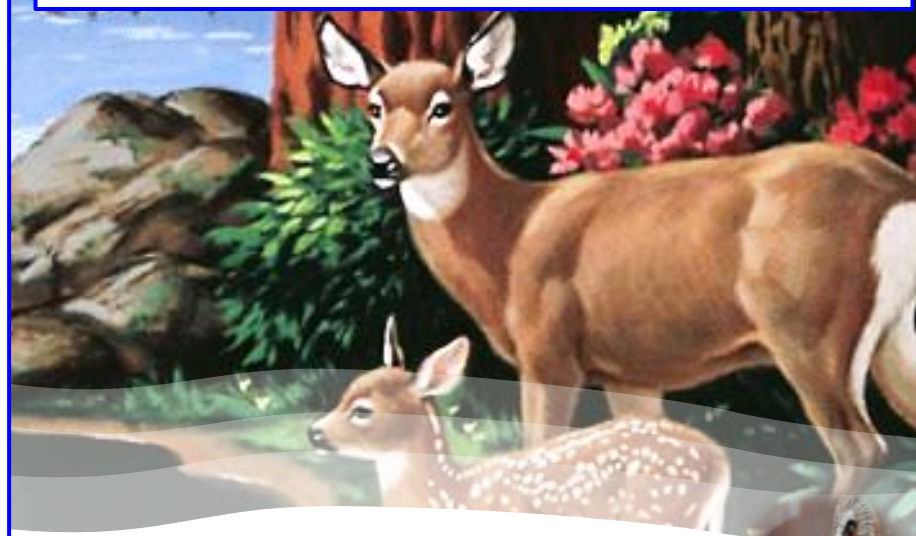


- 4:25** The woman saith unto him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things.

She said to Him, *I know that Messiah cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things.*’ Jesus answered, *I that speak unto thee am he.*’

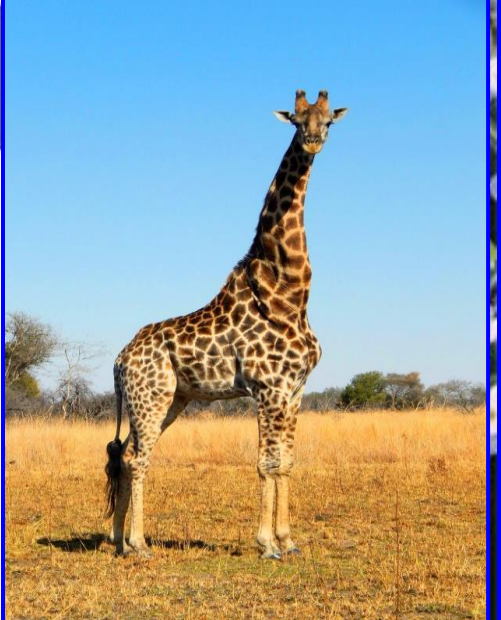
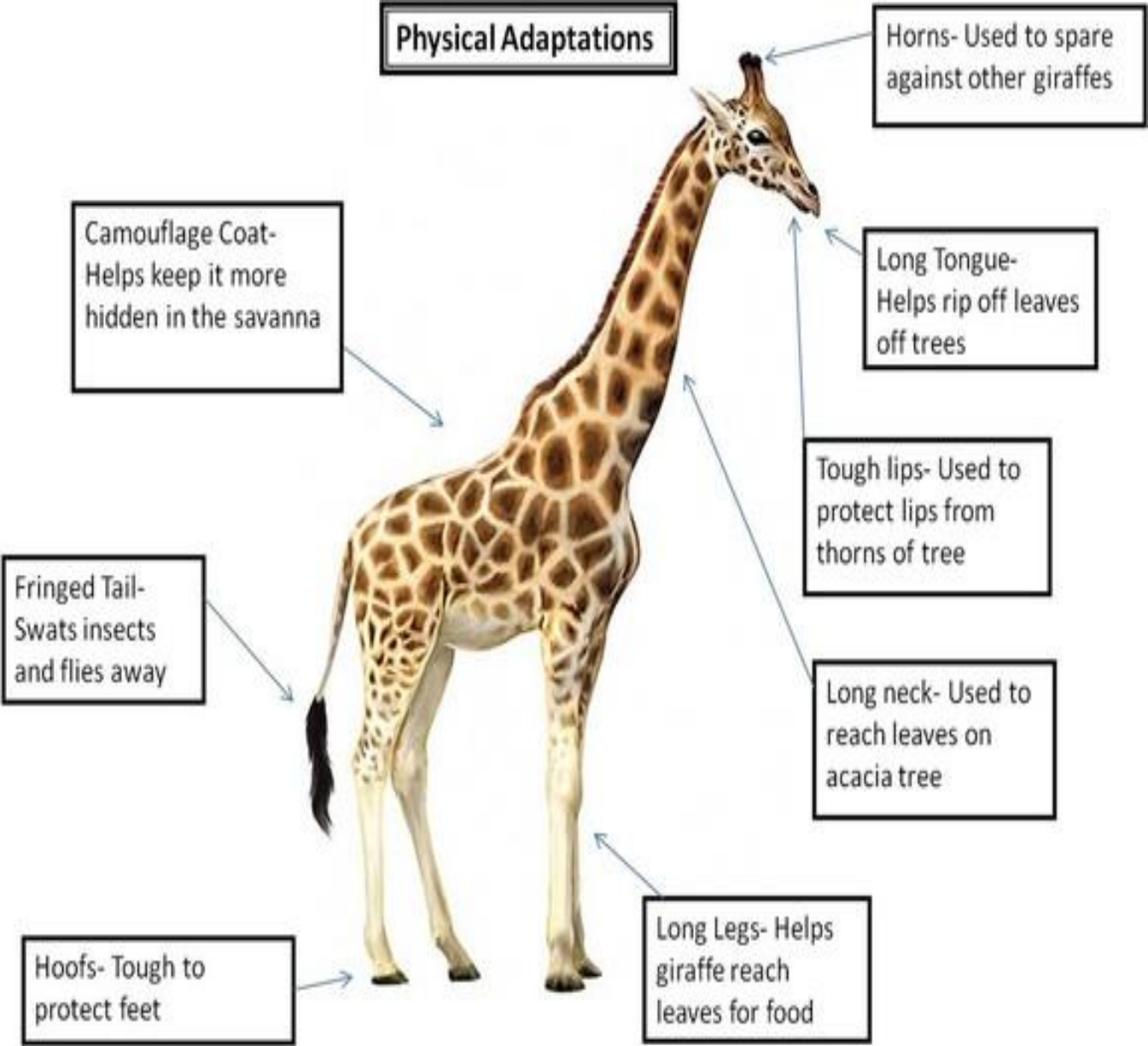
In this story of the woman at the well Jesus teaches us the steps we are to follow in winning a soul. Here are the steps in poetry:

# Giraffe Facts!

Wild giraffes live only in Africa, south of the Sahara Desert. They eat leaves of trees and bushes.



Giraffes are the tallest animals in the world. An adult giraffe is as tall as three men standing on each other's shoulders!

A baby giraffe can walk within 10 minutes of being born and can run soon after that. A newborn giraffe is more than 6 feet tall - as tall as a grown man - and will double its height within a year.



Giraffes can run more than 30 miles per hour. A baby giraffe is even faster than an adult giraffe over short distances.

Giraffes have the same number of bones in their necks as people, but giraffe neck bones are just much, much longer.



There is no other animal like a giraffe anywhere else on the planet. The only other animal related to a giraffe is the okapi, which lives in a very small area of jungle near the Congo River in central Africa and looks more like a horse.



Giraffes do not have horns, which are made of the same material as your fingernails (called keratin). Instead, they have ossicones, which are skin-covered bones that are attached to their skulls.



The giraffe is the national animal of Tanzania.

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## Facts About White-Faced Capuchin Monkeys

Here are some things you probably didn't know about them:

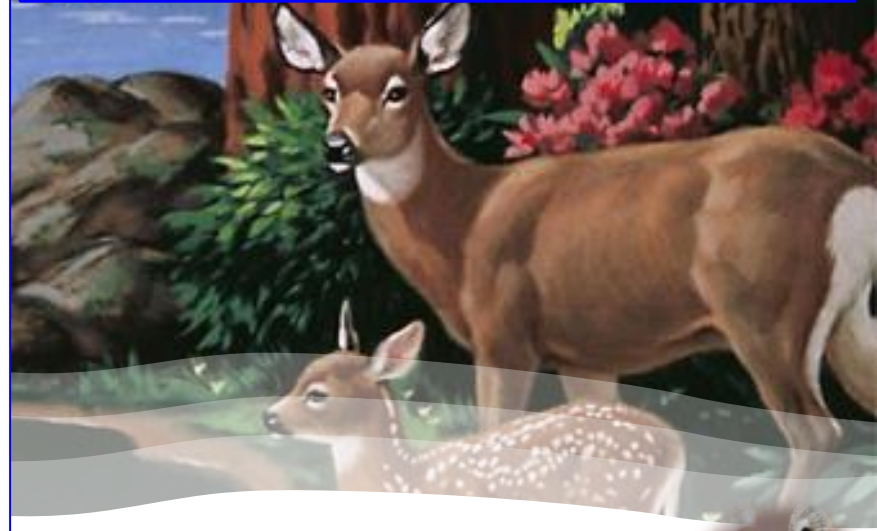
1. They are arboreal and omnivorous. You will always see them traveling through the trees looking for fruits and insects. It is extremely rare to see one of these monkeys on the floor.
2. The back and top of their head are black, but have creamy white on the sides and belly. The ends of the limbs are also black. The face is white, with the forehead hairs longer.
3. Capuchin monkeys are active in the daytime and live in large groups that can be of 3 to 30 individuals, including at least one male.
4. They frequently groom each other and have complex social lives, with alliances made between different individuals.
5. The groups are not territorial, but can be aggressive to members of other groups. They spend most of their time in the forest canopy and sometimes on the ground.





## Squirrel monkeys

“Squirrel monkeys are native to the tropical rainforests of Central and South America. They can be found in countries such as Brazil, Colombia, Ecuador, and Peru, where they thrive in the dense canopy of the trees. They are one of the smallest primates, measuring around 10 to 14 inches in length, excluding their long tails. They typically weigh between 1 and 2 pounds, making them incredibly agile and nimble in their tree-dwelling habitats. These monkeys are highly social animals, living in groups of up to 500 individuals. They have a complex social structure with dominant males leading the group and females taking care of the young. They communicate through a combination of vocalizations, facial expressions, and body postures.”

As the woman heard these words, faith sprang up in her heart. She accepted the wonderful announcement from the lips of the divine Teacher. {DA 190.1}

This woman was in an appreciative state of mind. She was ready to receive the noblest revelation; for she was interested in the Scriptures, and the Holy Spirit had been preparing her mind to receive more light. She had studied the Old Testament promise, "The Lord thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto Him ye shall hearken."

Deuteronomy 18:15. She longed to understand this prophecy. Light was already flashing into her mind. The water of life, the spiritual life which Christ gives to every thirsty soul, had begun to spring up in her heart. The Spirit of the Lord was working with her. {DA 190.2}

## Continuing:

The plain statement made by Christ to this woman could not have been made to the self-righteous Jews. Christ was far more reserved when He spoke to them.

That which had been withheld from the Jews, and which the disciples were afterward enjoined to keep secret, was revealed to her. Jesus saw that she would make use of her knowledge in bringing others to share His grace. {DA 190.3}

Our Redeemer thirsts for recognition. He hungers for the sympathy and love of those whom He has purchased with His own blood. He longs with inexpressible desire that they should come to Him and have life. 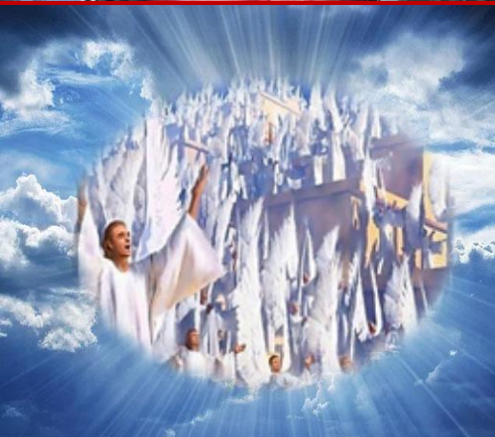

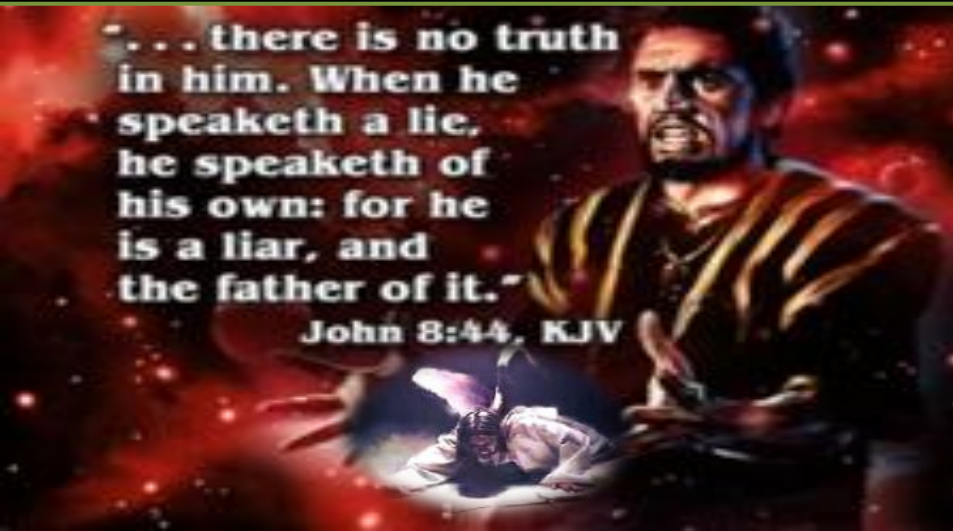
# *The Desire of Ages, p.758*

## *The Desire of Ages, p.758*



To the angels and the unfallen worlds the cry, "It is finished," had a deep significance. It was for them as well as for us that the great work of redemption had been accomplished. They with us share the fruits of Christ's victory. {DA 758.2}

Not until the death of Christ was the character of Satan clearly revealed to the angels or to the unfallen worlds. The archapostate had so clothed himself with deception that even holy beings had not understood his principles. They had not clearly seen the nature of his rebellion. {DA 758.3}
