





Chapter 19 – "Judas"

The Jewish rulers had been anxious to get Jesus into their power, but for fear of raising a tumult among the people they had not dared to take Him openly. So they had sought some one who would secretly betray Him, and had found in Judas, one of the twelve disciples, the man who would do this base act. **{SJ 119.1**} Judas had naturally a strong love for money, but he had not always been wicked and corrupt enough to do such a deed as this. He had fostered the evil spirit of avarice until it had become the ruling motive of his life, and he could now sell his Lord for thirty pieces of silver (about \$17.00), the price of a slave. (Exodus 21:28-32.) He could now betray the Saviour with a kiss in Gethsemane. {SJ 119.2} But he followed every step of the Son of God, as He went from the garden to the trial before the Jewish rulers. He had no thought that the Saviour would allow the Jews to kill Him, as they had threatened to do. **{SJ 119.3**} (Next Slide)



Continuing: At every moment he expected to see Him released and protected by divine power, as had been done in the past.
But as the hours went by, and Jesus quietly submitted to all the indignities that were heaped upon Him, a terrible fear came to the traitor, that he had indeed betrayed his Master to His death. {SJ 119.4} As the trial drew to a close, Judas could endure the torture of his guilty conscience no longer.
All at once there rang through the hall a hoarse voice, which sent a thrill of terror to the hearts of all present: {SJ 121.1} "He is innocent. Spare Him, O Caiaphas. He has done nothing worthy of death!" {SJ 121.2}



Mammals of the Bible


Remember, a mammal has these characteristics:

- 1. Warm-blooded,
- 2. Has a backbone,
- 3. Two pairs of limbs,
- 4. More or less complete covering of hair,
- 5. Feeds its babies with milk,

6. Most give their young protection and training, and

7. Mammals have a larger, more well-developed brain than other animals. The word animal in the Bible has many different meanings. There are four basic groups. There is the domestic stock, like sheep, goats, and oxen; the animals that were dangerous to life like the lion, wolf, and flea; wild animals, like the sparrow, and harvester ant; and finally, unclean animals like the pig and the mouse.

We will be studying the next few weeks just about the mammals we read about in the Bible. We will learn this week more about the **care** of domestic mammals, like the sheep.



Remind

Character Quality

Care vs Indifference Care is to have an interest and concern about another person as Christ **cares** about me.

"Christ applied these prophecies to Himself, and He showed the contrast between His own character and that of the leaders in Israel. The Pharisees had just driven one from the fold, because he dared to bear witness to the power of Christ. They had cut off a soul whom the True Shepherd was drawing to Himself. In this they had shown themselves ignorant of the work committed to them, and unworthy of their trust as shepherds of the flock. Jesus now set before them the contrast between them and the Good Shepherd, and He pointed to Himself as the real keeper of the Lord's flock. Before doing this, how

ever, He speaks of Himself under another figure." (*The Desire of Ages* 477)

The experience of the blind man led Jesus to tell the parable of the sheep. Read the story of the blind man in John 9.

Remarkable Parent Food

There was always the danger from robbers and wolves to be guarded against. Sometimes a sheep would stray away from the flock; so they were frequently numbered to see that none were lost, for the shepherd must give a strict account of all the sheep under his care.... The Shepherd's life is one full of peril. If he is a trustworthy shepherd, he will not be careless and study his own ease, but he will search for the straying sheep amid storm and tempest....

"This is the way the true Shepherd treats the lost sinner. He goes after him; He does not hesitate at peril, self-denial, and self sacrifice. He is intent upon bringing the sin-burdened soul to repentance, to salvation, to peace, rest, and happiness in his Saviour's love. And it is the privilege of every one who has experienced the love of Jesus in his own heart, to think if there is not some one whom he can by personal effort, by studied tact and kindness, bring to Jesus, who is ready and willing to accept all who will come to Him. We can all do much through personal effort. We can be laborers with Jesus Christ." (Sons and Daughters of God 277)



Continuing: Many minds were busy with thoughts started by the scenes of Calvary. From the crucifixion to the resurrection many sleepless eyes were constantly searching the prophecies, some to learn the full meaning of the feast they were then celebrating, some to find evidence that Jesus was not what He claimed to be; and others with sorrowful hearts were searching for proofs that He was the true Messiah. **{Next Slide Please)**



Continuing: Though searching with different objects in view, all were convicted of the same truth,--that prophecy had been fulfilled in the events

of the past few days, and that the Crucified One was the world's Redeemer. Many who at that time united in the service never again took

part in the paschal rites. Many even of the priests were convicted of the true character of Jesus. Their searching of the prophecies had not been in vain, and after His resurrection they acknowledged Him as the Son of God. {DA 775.1}







Nicodemus, when he saw Jesus lifted up on the cross, remembered His words spoken by night in the Mount of Olives: "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." John 3:14, 15. **On that Sabbath, when Christ** lay in the grave, Nicodemus had opportunity for reflection. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: A clearer light now illuminated his mind, and the words which Jesus had spoken to him were no longer mysterious. He felt that he had lost much by not connecting himself with the Saviour during His life. Now he recalled the events of Calvary. The prayer of Christ for His murderers and His answer to the petition of the dying thief spoke to the heart of the learned councilor. **{Next Slide Please}**




Continuing: Again he looked upon the Saviour in His agony; again he heard that last cry, "It is finished," spoken like the words of a conqueror. Again he beheld the reeling earth, the darkened heavens, the rent veil, the shivered rocks, and his faith was forever established. The very event that destroyed the hopes of the disciples convinced Joseph and Nicodemus of the divinity of Jesus. Their fears were overcome by the courage of a firm and unwavering faith. **{DA 775.2}** 34 Let's learn another beautiful scripture song together, dear ones, also from the book of John Chapter 3 verses 14 and 15 (KJV)! 




Never had Christ attracted the attention of the multitude as now that He was laid in the tomb. According to their practice, the people brought their sick and suffering ones to the temple courts, inquiring, Who can tell us of Jesus of **Nazareth? Many had come from** far to find Him who had healed the sick and raised the dead. On every side was heard the cry, We want Christ the Healer! **Upon this occasion those who were** thought to show indications of the leprosy were examined by the priests. {Please Slide Next} 37




Continuing: Many were forced to hear their husbands, wives, or children pronounced leprous, and doomed to go forth from the shelter of their homes and the care of their friends, to warn off the stranger with the mournful cry, "Unclean, unclean!" The friendly hands of Jesus of Nazareth, that never refused to touch with healing the loathsome leper, were folded on His breast. The lips that had answered his petition with the comforting words, "I will; be thou clean" (Matthew 8:3), were now silent. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: Many appealed to the chief priests and rulers for sympathy and relief, but in vain. **Apparently they were** determined to have the living Christ among them again. With persistent earnestness they asked for Him. They would not be turned away. But they were driven from the temple courts, and soldiers were stationed at the gates to keep back the multitude that came with their sick and dying, demanding entrance. **{DA 776.1}**



The sufferers who had come to be healed by the Saviour sank under their disappointment. The streets were filled with mourning. The sick were dying for want of the healing touch of Jesus. **Physicians were consulted** in vain; there was no skill like that of Him who lay in Joseph's tomb. **{DA 776.2}**



The mourning cries of the suffering ones brought home to thousands of minds the conviction that a great light had gone out of the world. Without Christ, the earth was blackness and darkness. Many whose voices had swelled the cry of "Crucify Him, crucify Him," now realized the calamity that had fallen upon them, and would as eagerly have cried, **Give us Jesus!** had He still been alive. **{DA 776.3}**
