Chapter 20 – "Before Pilate" Part 3

Continuing: Pilate then asked, <u>"Art Thou a king then?"</u> **{SJ 126.5**} Jesus answered, "Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth My voice." **{SJ 126.6**} Pilate had a desire to know the truth. His mind was confused. He eagerly grasped the words of the Saviour, and his heart was stirred with a great longing to know what the truth really was, and how he could obtain it. He asked Jesus: <u>"What is truth?"</u> **{SJ 126.7**} But he did not wait to receive an answer. The tumult of the crowd outside the hall of justice had increased to a roar. (Next Slide)







Continuing:

The priests were clamorous for immediate action, and Pilate was recalled to the interests of the hour. Going out to the people, he declared: <u>"I find in Him no fault at all.</u>" **John 18:33-38. SJ 126.8**} These words from a heathen judge were a scathing rebuke to the base perfidy and falsehood of the rulers of Israel who were accusing the Saviour. **{SJ 127.1}** As the priests and elders heard this from Pilate, their disappointment and rage knew no bounds. They had long plotted and waited for this opportunity. As they saw the prospect of the release of Jesus, they seemed ready to tear Him in pieces. **{SJ 127.2**}

Nature Fruiting Vegetables

Fruiting vegetables are plants that flower and produce fruit with their seeds enclosed. Fruits of vegetable plants include cucumbers, eggplants, muskmelons and watermelons, okra, peppers, snap beans, summer and winter squash, and tomatoes.

"And God said, Let the earth bring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the fruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so" (Genesis 1:11).

Blue Hubbard squash

A member of the large family, including squashes, pumpkins, and gourds, Blue Hubbard squash catches the eye with its color and size. It has a distinctive blue-gray or bluish-green skin. It's a type of winter squash and can be found from September to March in grocery stores and farmers' markets. Blue Hubbard squash's size ranges from **10 to 30 pounds** or even larger.

Blue Hubbard squash grows in many places across the US and Canada. It's a nutritious vegetable and is a good source of nutrients, including vitamins A and C, dietary fibers, potassium, and antioxidants such as beta-carotene.

In contrast to the outer shell, the flesh of the Blue Hubbard squash is orange. Like the other squash family members, its inner texture is dense and sweet. The rich taste of Blue Hubbard squash makes it versatile in the kitchen. You can cook soups, casseroles, omelets, bake pies, and other pastries with it. This Blue Hubbard squash recipe gives you everything you need to know to turn this autumn specialty

into a fulfilling stew.









Many times, during a storm or trial, like a deer, we need to <u>stand</u> perfectly still and wait on the Lord as to what we should do. The white-tailed deer's tail is like a flag of warning. What counsel does Isaiah 59:19 give to us? A female deer carries her young inside of her for about six to nine months depending on the kind of deer. She finds a hidden



place away from others of her kind to give birth. The mother deer is very protective of her newborn. Jeremiah, however, tells us about a drought that was so terrible that even *"the hind...calved in the field, and forsook it* (newborn calf), *because there was no grass"* (Jeremiah 14:5). This must have been quite an awful situation because deer do not naturally desert their young. The young will stay hidden for about four to five weeks or until they can walk well enough to keep up with mother. God gave fawns special protection against their enemies in their helpless condition.

Vegetables are different from fruits. Fruits grow each year on trees and other woody plants that live more than two years. Scientists consider muskmelons and watermelons as vegetables because they grow on a vine and must be replanted each year. Vegetables can be put into several classes—one class is fruiting vegetables such as tomatoes, cucumbers, squash, and melons. Then there are root vegetables like carrots, beets, turnips, and radishes. Another class would be leafy vegetables like spinach, lettuce, and cabbage. There are even flowering vegetables such as cauliflower and broccoli. There will only be two classes of people when Jesus returns. These are the faithful and wise servants and the evil servants.

Continuing: Through all our trials we have a never-failing Helper. He does not leave us alone to struggle with temptation, to battle with evil, and be finally crushed with burdens and sorrow. Though now He is hidden from mortal sight, the ear of faith can hear His voice saying, Fear not; I am with you. "I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive forevermore." Revelation 1:18. I have endured your sorrows, experienced your struggles, encountered your temptations. I know your tears; I also have wept. The griefs that lie too deep to be breathed into any human ear, I know. Think not that you are desolate and forsaken. Though your pain touch no responsive chord in any heart on earth, look unto Me, and live. "The mountains shall depart, and the hills be removed; but My kindness shall not depart from thee, neither shall the covenant of My peace be removed, saith the Lord that hath mercy on thee." Isaiah 54:10. {DA 483.1} However much a shepherd may love his sheep, he loves his sons and daughters more. Jesus is not only our shepherd; He is our "everlasting Father." And He says, "I am the good shepherd, and know my [sheep], and am known of mine. As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep. John 10:14, 15 What a statement is this!--the only-begotten Son, He who is in the bosom of the Father, He whom God has declared to be "the Man that is My fellow" (Zechariah 13:7),--the communion between Him and the eternal God is taken to represent the communion between Christ and His children on the earth! {DA 483.2}

Continuing: Because we are the gift of His Father, and the reward of His work, Jesus loves us. He loves us as His children.

Reader, He loves you. Heaven itself can bestow nothing greater, nothing better. Therefore trust. {DA 483.3}

Jesus thought upon the souls all over the earth who were misled by false shepherds. Those whom He longed to gather as the sheep of His pasture were scattered among wolves, and He said, "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, [and] one shepherd."

John 10:16 {DA 483.4}

"Therefore doth My Father love Me, because I lay down My life, that I might take it again." That is, My Father has so loved you, that He even loves Me more for giving My life to redeem you. In becoming your substitute and surety, by surrendering My life, by taking your liabilities, your transgressions, I am endeared to My Father. {DA 483.5} "I lay down My life, that I might take it again. No man taketh it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." While as a member of the human family He was mortal, as God He was the fountain of life for the world.

He could have withstood the advances of death, and refused to come under its dominion; but voluntarily He laid down His life, that He might bring life and immortality to light. He bore the sin of the world, endured its curse, yielded up His life as a sacrifice, that men might not eternally die. "Surely He hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows.... He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all."

Before we hear your questions dear ones! Let's take a few minutes to review what you have read last Sabbath from Part 1 of our Lesson entitled, **"The Lord Is Risen" Part 3** in our study book The Desire of Ages!





Continuing: Meanwhile the report of Christ's resurrection had been carried to Pilate. **Though Pilate was responsible** for having given Christ up to die, he had been comparatively unconcerned. While he had condemned the Saviour unwillingly, and with a feeling of pity, he had felt no real compunction until now. In terror he now shut himself within his house, determined to see no one. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: But the priests made their way into his presence, told the story which they had invented, and urged him to overlook the sentinels' neglect of duty. Before consenting to this, he himself privately questioned the guard. They, fearing for their own safety, dared not conceal anything, and Pilate drew from them an account of all that had taken place. He did not prosecute the matter further, but from that time there was no peace for him. {DA 782.3}



When Jesus was laid in the grave, Satan triumphed. He dared to hope that the Saviour would not take up His life again. He claimed the Lord's body, and set his guard about the tomb, seeking to hold Christ a prisoner. He was bitterly angry when his angels fled at the approach of the heavenly messenger. When he saw Christ come forth in triumph, he knew that his kingdom would have an end, and that he must **finally die.** {DA 782.4}



Continuing: The priests, in putting Christ to death, had made themselves the tools of Satan. Now they were entirely in his power. They were entangled in a snare from which they saw no escape but in continuing their warfare against Christ. When they heard the report of His resurrection, they feared the wrath of the people. They felt that their own lives were in danger. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: The only hope for them was to prove Christ an impostor by denying that He had risen. They bribed the soldiers, and secured Pilate's silence. They spread their lying reports far and near. **But there were witnesses** whom they could not silence. Many had heard of the soldiers' testimony to Christ's resurrection. And certain of the dead who came forth with Christ appeared to many, **{Next Slide Please}**


Continuing: and declared that He had risen. **Reports were brought to** the priests of persons who had seen these risen ones, and heard their testimony. The priests and rulers were in continual dread, lest in walking the streets, or within the privacy of their own homes, they should come face to face with Christ. They felt that there was no safety for them. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: Bolts and bars were but poor protection against the Son of God. By day and by night that awful scene in the judgment hall, when they had cried, "His blood be on us, and on our children," was before them. Matthew 27:25. **Nevermore would the memory** of that scene fade from their minds. Nevermore would peaceful sleep come to their **pillows.** {**DA 785.1**}



Continuing: When the voice of the mighty angel was heard at Christ's tomb, saying, Thy Father calls Thee, the Saviour came forth from the grave by the life that was in Himself. Now was proved the truth of His words, "I lay down My life, that I might take it again.... I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." Now was fulfilled the prophecy He had spoken to the priests and rulers, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." John 10:17, 18; 2:19. **{DA 785.2}** 39



Over the rent sepulcher of Joseph, **Christ had proclaimed** in triumph, "I am the resurrection, and the life." These words could be spoken only by the Deity. All created beings live by the will and power of God. They are dependent recipients of the life of God. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: From the highest seraph to the humblest animate being, all are replenished from the Source of life. **Only He who is one** with God could say, I have power to lay down My life, and I have power to take it again. In His divinity, **Christ possessed** the power to break the bonds of death. **{DA 785.3}**
