


Deer of the World

Deer are the only mammals with bones, called antlers, on their heads. Antlers are different from horns. They are strong, hard layers of skin with a bony core. In most kinds of deer only the males have antlers, but in caribou and reindeer the males and females have antlers. These antlers can help protect the deer from predators or enemies, like wolves, coyotes, and cougars. Deer are the most common land mammals and are known for their running abilities. Christians are known for their **self-control** when tempted by the predator, Satan.

Moose

Male moose may grow 7 1/2 feet (2.3 meters) tall at the shoulders and weigh 1,800 pounds (816 kilograms).






There are more than 60 kinds of deer which includes caribou, elk, marsh deer, moose, mule deer, musk deer, and reindeer. Deer live all over the world; in hot dry deserts, the cold Arctic Circle, but most live in prairies, swamps, or woodlands.

Deer come in all sizes. The moose of North America is the largest deer in the world, while the pudu of South America is the smallest. Usually, male deer are called bucks, while male caribou, elk, and moose are called bulls, and red deer are called stags, or harts. Most female deer are called does. Female caribou, elk, and moose are called cows, and female red deer are hinds. Most young deer are called fawns, but the young caribou, elk, and moose are known as calves. God's people are called meek, merciful, pure in heart, and peacemakers.

- 3. Pudu are about 1 foot (30 centimeters) tall at the shoulders and weigh about 20 pounds (9 kilograms). Find a picture of this deer from South America. Other deer that live in Central and South America besides the pudu are marsh deer, brocket deer, pampas deer, and huemul.

- 4. Using an encyclopedia look up the word "deer" and see the many different ones that belong to that family of mammals.




Continuing: and I will take Him away."


If this rich man'1s tomb was thought too honorable a burial place for Jesus, she herself would provide a place for Him.

There was a grave that Christ's own voice had made vacant, the grave where Lazarus had lain.

Might she not there find a burial place for her Lord? She felt that to care for His precious crucified body would be a great consolation to her in her grief. {DA 790.1}




But now in His own familiar voice Jesus said to her, "Mary." Now she knew that it was not a stranger who was addressing her, and turning she saw before her the living Christ. In her joy she forgot that He had been crucified. **Springing toward Him,** as if to embrace His feet, she said, "Rabboni." {Next Slide Please}



Continuing: But Christ raised His hand, saying, **Detain Me not**; "for I am not yet ascended to My Father: but go to My brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto My Father, and your Father; and to My God, and your God." And Mary went her way to the disciples with the joyful message. **{DA 790.2}**



Jesus refused to receive the homage of His people until He had the assurance that His sacrifice was accepted by the Father. He ascended to the heavenly courts, and from God Himself heard the assurance that His atonement for the sins of men had been ample, that through His blood all might gain eternal life. The Father ratified the covenant made with Christ, {Next Slide Please}








The news of Christ's resurrection was so different from what they had anticipated that they could not believe it.

It was too good to be true, they thought. They had heard so much of the doctrines and the so-called scientific theories of the Sadducees that the impression made on their minds in regard to the resurrection was vague. They scarcely knew what the resurrection from the dead could mean. They were unable to take in the great subject. **{DA 790.4}**


