



Chapter 22 – "Condemned by Pilate"

When the Jews returned from Herod, bringing the Saviour again to Pilate, he was very much displeased, and asked what they would have him do. He reminded them that he had examined Jesus, and had found no fault in Him. He told them that they had brought complaints against Him, but that they had not been able to prove a single charge. **{SJ 133.1**} As stated in the preceding chapter, they had taken Him to Herod, who was a Jew, like themselves, and he had found in Him nothing worthy of death. But to pacify the accusers, Pilate said: {SJ 133.2} "I will therefore chastise Him, and release Him." Luke 23:16. {SJ 133.3} Here Pilate showed his weakness. He had acknowledged that Christ was innocent; then why should he punish Him It was a compromise with wrong. (Next Slide)



Continuing: The Jews never forgot this through all the trial. They had intimidated the Roman governor, and now pressed their advantage until they secured the condemnation of Jesus. {SJ 133.4} The multitude clamored more loudly for the life of the prisoner. {SJ 134.1} While Pilate was hesitating as to what he should do, there was brought to him a letter from his wife, which read: {SJ 134.2} "Have thou nothing to do with that just man: for I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of Him." Matthew 27:19. {SJ 134.3} Pilate turned pale at this message; but the mob became more urgent as they saw his indecision. {SJ 134.4}



Character Quality

Self-Control vs Self-indulgence Self Control is control of one's emotions, desires or actions by one's own will, being empowered by the Holy Spirit.





A mammal has these characteristics:

- 1. Warm-blooded,
- 2. Has a backbone,
- 3. Two pairs of limbs,
- 4. More or less complete covering of hair,

5. Feeds its babies with milk,


6. Most give their young protection and training, and

7. Mammals have a larger, more welldeveloped brain than other animals.



Deer are mammals! Try to remember the seven points that make a deer a mammal! Females feed their fawns or calves milk made by their bodies. This milk is very rich. It contains three times as much fat and protein as cows' milk. This rich diet makes the fawn grow very fast. The rich milk of the deer can remind us of the rich spiritual milk of God's word, especially that contained in the Sermon on the Mount. Spiritual growth will be rapid as we take in its principles. In fact, there is so much spiritual nutrition in this demonstration that we could reach spiritual maturity if we had nothing else to "eat."

Like all mammals, deer are warm-blooded; that is, their body temperature stays the same regardless of the surrounding temperature. Deer have a coat of fur that helps keep their bodies warm in cold weather.



You will notice that all deer have long, thin legs and are very good runners. Deer move their legs quickly as they take long strides. A deer's foot has two center toes. Each of the two toes are protected by a hard covering called a hoof. The Bible calls this being "cloven-footed." A deer runs on tiptoe with a springing run. God designed the body of the deer so that it can leap covering great distances and heights. It can remind us of how He will help us to overcome. "Then shall the lame man [crippled in character] leap like a hart" (Isaiah 35:6). To be able to leap requires great strength and self-control.

The speed a deer runs helps them escape predators (enemies). A white-tailed deer can run up to 40 miles (64 kilometers) per hour and can leap 15 to 20 feet (4.6 to 6.1 meters) forward. We can escape our enemy, the devil, by building our house, called character, on Jesus, the solid Rock. *"Deliver thyself as a roe from the hand of the hunter"* who *"as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour"* (Proverbs 6:5; I Peter 5:8).



The parts of the deer's mouth are made to help them tear off leaves and twigs and grass to eat, while being alert for enemies. It has large eyes on the sides of the head, but the ears and nose usually are the first to warn them of danger. God gave the deer special eyes that can see close up and far away at the same time. This way it can see what it is eating while it is scanning the distance for enemies. The location of the eyes high on the head make it possible for a deer to see almost completely around itself. Deer show the character quality of cautiousness. They can remind us how important it is for us "watch and pray" that we enter not into temptation and lose our self-control?

The antlers are bones growing out of the deer's skull. This hard bone is made with sharp points and becomes a dangerous weapon. Antlers are a little like horns. In the Bible, horns are used as symbols of power. (Jeremiah 48:25) Male deer use their antlers to fight other males during mating season or for leadership of a herd. The fighting is more like a pushing and shoving contest between males. It is rare that a deer would use its antlers to slash another deer. Deer living in mild or cold climates loose their antlers before winter and in the spring grow a new set. The way the deer lose their antlers ("horns") can remind us of how the wicked lose their characters because they have not built on Christ. "All the horns of the wicked also will I cut off; but the horns of the righteous shall be exalted" (Psalm 75:10).


New antlers are soft and tender while they are growing quickly. A thin layer of skin grows over the antlers which helps them develop. This layer of skin is called velvet. Do you know why? It is covered by short, fine hairs that make it look velvety! When the antlers reach full size, the velvet dries and the deer rids itself of it by rubbing the antlers against a tree, a bush, or the ground. The antlers have branches that end in points or prongs called tines. Different deer have different shaped antlers. Moose and caribou have flat, broad antlers. The antlers of the deer give them a noble, dignified look. They are like their crown. They remind us of the beautiful crowns that await those who have developed **selfcontrol** in their characters. **Self-control** is evidence of nobility of soul and adds a noticeable graciousness to the character, even as the stately antlers grace the deer's



head. The majestic antlers of the deer can also remind us of God's invitation to David to dwell with Him in Mount Zion. He promised, "There will I make the horn of David to bud...upon himself shall his crown flourish" (Psalm 132:17-18). The Scriptures also teach us how our characters, or crowns, can grow in beauty: "He hath dispersed, he hath given to the poor; his righteousness endureth for ever; his horn shall be exalted with honour" (Psalm 112:9).
