

Chapter 23 – "Calvary"

Jesus was hurried to Calvary amid the shouts and jeers of the crowd. As He passed the gate of Pilate's court, the heavy cross which had been prepared for Barabbas was laid upon His bruised and bleeding shoulders. Crosses were placed also upon two thieves, who were to suffer death at the same time with Jesus. **{SJ 139.1**} The load was too heavy for the Saviour in His weary, suffering condition. He had gone but a few rods when He fell fainting beneath the cross. **{SJ 139.2**} When He revived, the cross was again placed upon His shoulders. He staggered on a few steps, and again fell to the ground as one lifeless. His persecutors now realized that it was impossible for Him to go farther with His burden, and they were puzzled to find someone who would carry the humiliating load. **{SJ 139.3**} (Next Slide)



Continuing: Just then they were met by Simon a Cyrenian, coming from the opposite direction.

Him they seized and compelled to carry the cross to Calvary. **{SJ 139.4}** The sons of Simon were disciples of Jesus, but he himself had not accepted the Saviour. Simon was ever after grateful for the privilege of bearing the cross of the Redeemer. The burden he was thus forced to carry became the means of his conversion. The events of Calvary and the words uttered by Jesus led Simon to accept Him as the Son of God. **{SJ 139.5}** Arriving at the place of crucifixion, the condemned were bound to the instruments of torture. The two thieves wrestled in the hands of those who stretched them upon the cross; but the Saviour made no resistance. **{SJ 141.1}**





Nature A Camel's Hump, Legs, and Feet

The camel is an unusual mammal with a hump on its back. This hump is made mostly of fat. Strong bands of tissue hold pads of fat together, making the hump above the backbone.

> Jesus made the camel With a great big fatty hump. I would like to ride a camel, I'd go bump, bump, bump.

This extra storage provides energy when there is no food available for the camel. When a camel goes on an extra long trip or is starving the hump shrinks. Once it again has food and rest the hump becomes firm and plump. The hump does not store water. God wants us to store His word in our minds to comfort and encourage us and other people as Jesus did the widow of Nain.

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Camels have long necks and legs that are long and strong. This is a great help for the dromedaries in the desert. The stiltlike legs of the camel hold the camel's body high above the hot desert sands and thus help it not to sweat much. In the upper part of the leg are powerful muscles that help the camel carry heavy loads for long distances. Camels are the only animals that can live in the desert and carry loads across it. Some camels have been known to carry 1,000 pounds (450 kilograms), but about 330 pounds (150 kilograms) is the usual load. When working they travel about 25 miles (40 kilometers) each day, at a speed of 3 miles (5 kilometers) an hour. Sometimes a number of camels travel together in a line, one

behind the other, across the desert. This is called a caravan. Caravans can remind us of the line of people that were coming out of the village of Nain in the funeral train.

Camels walk when it is very hot. When they travel faster they gallop or pace. The pace is a medium–speed where both legs on the same side lift and come down together. This causes a swaying, rocking motion, and riders can become "seasick." Did you know camels are called "ships of the deserts?" Do you think a camel's long legs would get in the way when it sits down? They do not! The camel folds its front legs under its body, falls to its knees, folds its rear legs, and lets the rear part of the body fall to the ground. (See illustration on page 101.) To get up, it straightens it hind legs, then jerks up its front legs.

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The camel can sit down and get up again this way with even heavy loads on its back. The tough, leathery skin pads on the camel's legs are like cushions when the animal is kneeling. Did you know that God has made you in a special way too for kneeling? That is why He gave you a kneecap.

Camels had to kneel down before they could be loaded. This can call to mind that if we want to be a burden-bearer for God we must first humbly kneel in prayer. Jesus spent a lot of time on His knees and it helped Him to carry the weight of the sins of the world. A camel's hump is very sensitive to pressure. This makes it necessary to be very careful in loading the animal. Padded saddles are used from which the load hangs down evenly on either side. Like a man is careful in loading his camel, so we can **trust** our Master not to give us more than we can bear. He promises us, "My burden is light" (Matthew 11:30).

On the camel's foot are two toes. A hoof that looks like a toenail grows at the front of each toe. The camel walks on the broad pad that joins its two long toes. The pads spread when stepped upon and they are about as big as a dinner plate. Camels are supported by their large feet on the sand the same way a man walks on top of the snow with snowshoes. The camels cushioned feet makes hardly any sound when walking or running.

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Our Jesus made the camels; With skin between their toes. He also gave them tough pads; On the bottom of their soles.

They can walk in desert sand Where it is hot, indeed. Our Jesus made the camels With feet to meet their need. Camels raise their heads more than 12 feet (3.65 meters) in the air. This helps them to see for miles in a flat desert, and they can find food and water in this way. Their long necks help them to reach down to graze on low desert plants.

As a camel train moves across the desert on these plate-like feet it reminds us of the funeral train Jesus met in our lesson story.

A Camel Caravan

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Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.

2. When you help mother make a special dish to take to a friend or family member who had a loved one die, remember your lesson.

4. As you put a cushion down for grandmother or grandfather to sit on, remember the cushion-pads on the camel's legs for kneeling.

5. When you are asked to walk to the mailbox in the hot sun, remember the camel train and the funeral train.

2. Notice the heads, bodies, legs, and feet of other mammals. See how many unusual shapes and sizes there are, each fulfilling a purpose.

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Remarkable Parent Food

"During His ministry, Jesus had raised the dead to life. He had raised the son of the widow of Nain, and the ruler's daughter and Lazarus. But these were not clothed with immortality. After they were raised, they were still subject to death. But those who came forth from the grave at Christ's resurrection were raised to everlasting life. They ascended with Him as trophies of His victory over death and the grave. These, said Christ, are no longer the captives of Satan; I have redeemed them. I have brought them from the grave as the first fruits of My power, to be with Me where I am, nevermore to see death or experience sorrow.

"These went into the city, and appeared unto many, declaring, Christ has risen from the dead, and we be risen with Him. Thus was immortalized the sacred truth of the resurrection. The risen saints bore witness to the truth of the words, 'Thy dead men shall live, together with My dead body shall they arise.' Their resurrection was an illustration of the fulfillment of the prophecy, 'Awake and sing, ye that dwell in dust: for thy dew is as the dew of herbs, and the earth shall cast out the dead' (Isaiah 26:19)." Continuing: The more abundant impartation of the Spirit did not take place till after Christ's ascension. Not until this was received could the disciples fulfill the commission to preach the gospel to the world. **But the Spirit** was now given for a special purpose. **{Next Slide Please}**



Continuing: Before the disciples could fulfill their official duties in connection with the church, **Christ breathed** His Spirit upon them. He was committing to them a most sacred trust, and He desired to impress them with the fact that without the Holy Spirit this work could not be accomplished. **{DA 805.2}**



The Holy Spirit is the breath of spiritual life in the soul. The impartation of the Spirit is the impartation of the life of Christ. It imbues the receiver with the attributes of Christ. Only those who are thus taught of God, those who possess the inward working of the Spirit, and in whose life the Christ-life is manifested, are to stand as representative men, to minister in behalf of the church. **{DA 805.3}**
