

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Chapter 23 – "Calvary" Part 4

Continuing: The soldiers divided the clothing of Jesus among themselves. One garment was woven without seam, and about this there was a contention. They finally settled the matter by casting lots. God's prophet had foretold that they would do this. He wrote: **SJ 143.1** "Dogs have compassed Me: the assembly of the wicked have inclosed Me: they pierced My hands and My feet. . . . They part My garments among them, and cast lots upon My vesture." Psalm 22:16, 18. {SJ 143.2} As soon as Jesus was lifted up on the cross, a terrible scene took place. Priests, rulers, and scribes joined with the rabble in mocking and jeering the dying Son of God, saying: **{SJ 143.3**} "If Thou be the King of the Jews, save Thyself." Luke 23:37. {SJ 143.4}

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Continuing: "He saved others; Himself He cannot save. If He be the King of Israel, let Him now come down from the cross, and we will believe Him. He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now, if He will have Him: for He said, I am the Son of God." Matthew 27:42, 43. {SJ 143.5} "And they that passed by railed on Him, wagging their heads, and saying, Ah, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save Thyself, and come down from the cross." Mark 15:29, 30. {SJ 143.6} Christ could have come down from the cross. But if He had done this, we could never have been saved. For our sake He was willing to die. **{SJ 143.7**} "He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed." 



Nature Horses

A horse is a mammal. Horses combine, in a striking way, the character qualities of strength and beauty. A fine horse is one of the most powerful animals God has made. And when a horse is left as God made him, with a gracefully flowing mane and tail, he is very beautiful. Even his stately way of carrying himself commands our respect and admiration. An inspired description of the horse is given to us in Job 39:19-25. It shows us why the horse was often used during wars in Bible times. "Hast thou given the horse strength? hast thou clothed his neck with thunder?

"Canst thou make him afraid as a grasshopper? the glory of his nostrils is terrible.

"He paweth in the valley, and rejoiceth in his strength: he goeth on to meet the armed men.

"He mocketh at fear, and is not affrighted; neither turneth he back from the sword.

"The quiver rattleth against him, the glittering spear and the shield.


"He swalloweth the ground with fierceness and rage: neither believeth he that it is the sound of the trumpet.

"He saith among the trumpets, Ha, ha; and he smelleth the battle afar off, the thunder of the captains, and the shouting."

Paying no mind to the danger involved, "the horse rusheth into the battle" (Jeremiah 8:6). In Bible prophecy a white horse is used to symbolized the purity of the faith of the early church (Revelation 6:2). Considering the fearless character of the mighty war horse and its symbolic meaning, it is no wonder that Jesus is pictured as sitting upon a white horse during the last battle in this earth's history-the battle of Armageddon. "And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war... And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean" (Revelation 19:11, 14).

Use the illustrations on pages 130-132 as you study these lessons about the horses.

As Christians we have been called to fight **industriously** against Satan. Like a robber, he unlawfully trespasses on our ground and steals the precious grains of heavenly truth, leaving in their place poisonous seeds of his own invention. The **industrious** war horse can remind us of the daring courage and purity of faith we need in the spiritual battle we are engaged in. The horse's mane and tail are like banners or flags. A flag used in war was called a standard.









It has been said of the Arabian horse that it was as gentle as a lamb and that it needed no other guide than the halter. But when the Arabian mare heard the war-cry of the tribe and saw the glittering spear of her rider, her eyes flashed with fire, her blood-red nostrils opened wide, her noble neck arched, and her tail and mane were raised and spread out to the wind. This vivid description of the war horse can remind us of the remnant who are as *"terrible as an army with banners"* (Song of Solomon 6:4). As the horse raises its mane and tail, so the remnant "*lift up a standard* (banner, flag) for the people" (Isaiah 62:10). As the war horse is excited by the glittering spear of her rider, so the remnant are encouraged as their Master prepares to fight for them. "O Lord... fight against them that fight against me... Draw out also the spear, and stop the way against them that persecute me" (Psalm 35:1, 3). The brave horse reminds us to fearlessly charge on, knowing victory is sure.



Horses were once the fastest and surest way to travel on land. The pioneers used horses when they settled this country. They were used to pull stagecoaches, and covered wagons, and they also carried the mail. Today, the horse is an animal that is enjoyed by families for recreation.

The horse was made for working (industry) and running. It has wide nostrils to help it breathe easily, a good sense of smell, sharp ears, and keen eyes. Horses bite grasses and other plants with their sharp front teeth. Then they grind the food with the large, ridged back teeth. As the horse eats grass and its seeds, so the birds in our lesson came and ate the seeds by the wayside. Long, muscular legs give horses the strength to run at fast speeds or to pull a heavy wagon. These powerful legs can also be a weapon. Notice that the horse is a vegetarian and has great strength. I will take heed to my ways, that I sin not with my tongue: I will keep my mouth with a bridle, while the wicked is before me." Psalm 39:1

"Be ye not as the horse, or as the mule, which have no understanding: whose mouth must be held in with bit and bridle, lest they come near unto thee." Psalm 32:9

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A male horse is called a stallion, a female horse, a mare, and a newborn horse, a foal.

Horses are usually quick to please their owners. This can remind us that God wants us to be quick to hear the Word and please Him. Having good memories, horses can be trained to obey commands. A horse can learn to come when its owner calls it by name. Do you respond when God calls you? And do you call upon Him when you have a need? "He shall call upon me, and I will answer him: I will be with him in trouble; I will deliver him, and honour him" (Psalm 91:15).

Horses must be governed by bits and bridles. "Behold, we put bits in the horses' mouths, that they may obey us; and we turn about their whole body" (James 3:3). Paul uses this to illustrate the importance of bridling our tongues if we would be obedient to our Heavenly Master.

In disciplining "a whip for the horse" is sometimes used (Proverbs 26:3). This can remind us that "a rod is for the back of him that is void of understanding" (Proverbs 10:13). The horse is a very powerful animal and without proper discipline it could be very dangerous to be around.

John 21:4 (KJV)



John 21:7 (KJV)



Jesus had appointed to meet His disciples in Galilee; and soon after the Passover week was ended, they bent their steps thither. Their absence from Jerusalem during the feast would have been interpreted as disaffection and heresy, therefore they remained till its close; but this over, they gladly turned homeward to meet the Saviour as He had directed. **{DA 809.1}**



Seven of the disciples were in company. They were clad in the humble garb of fishermen; they were poor in worldly goods, but rich in the knowledge and practice of the truth, which in the sight of Heaven gave them the highest rank as teachers. **{Next Slide Please}**




Continuing: They had not been students in the schools of the prophets, but for three years they had been taught by the greatest Educator the world has ever known. **Under His instruction** they had become elevated, intelligent, and refined, agents through whom men might be led to a knowledge of the truth. **{DA 809.2}**



Review of Chapter 85 "By the Sea Once More"

Isaiah 64:6 (KJV)

But we are all as an unclean [thing], and all our righteousnesses [are] as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away.

"The white robe of innocence was worn by our first parents when they were placed by God in holy Eden. . . . But when sin entered, they severed their connection with God, and the light that had encircled them departed. . . . Nothing can man devise to supply the place of his lost robe of innocence. . . .
