
1). To God be the glory, great things he has done! So loved he the world that he gave us his Son, who yielded his life an atonement for sin, and opened the life-gate that all may go in.

Chapter 24 – "Death of Christ" Part 2

Continuing: In the meantime the darkness had settled over Jerusalem and the plains of Judea.

As all eyes were turned in the direction of the fated city, they saw the fierce lightnings of God's wrath directed toward it. {SJ 146.5} Suddenly the gloom was lifted from the cross, and in clear, trumpetlike tones, that seemed to resound throughout creation, Jesus cried: {SJ 146.6} "It is finished." John 19:30.

"Father, into Thy hands I commend My spirit." **Luke 23:46. {SJ 146.7}**A light encircled the cross, and the face of the Saviour shone with a glory like the sun. He then bowed His head upon
His breast and died. **{SJ 146.8}**

Continuing:

The multitude about the cross stood paralyzed, and with bated breath gazed upon the Saviour. Again darkness settled upon the earth, and a hoarse rumbling like heavy thunder was heard.




Character Quality

Industry vs Slothfulness

Industry is the habit of working hard and steadily with thoughts and deeds directed by heaven.



Remember, a horse's legs are made for fast running. Large muscles in the upper part of the leg provide power for great speed. The long, thin, lower legs give the horse a long stride. The front legs carry most of the weight and take the jolts when running or jumping. The back legs give the power for running or jumping. Each foot is like a strong toe, protected by the curved hoof. The frog (see illustration) is like a rubber heel. It helps absorb the jolt when the horse is running and the hoof hits the ground.







The legs and hoofs assist the horse in moving quickly. Race horses can go 42 miles (68 km) an hour. As the leg of the horse is drawn up and then goes down again the horse moves along. The fastmoving horse reminds us how quick we need to be in responding to Christ. Then our roots will grow deep and still deeper. As a horse moves faster it changes its gait —or the order in which its feet hits the ground. When traveling at a high speed the horse also uses its tail as a rudder, kinking it around the curves. It can remind us about how God's standards guide and direct our lives.

Horses' hoofs reminds me of an interesting case history. There was once a famous horse who seemed to be able to solve arithmetic problems by tapping out the answers with his hoof. He never got the answer wrong and it was thought that he could even read the instructions of a mathematics problem written on the blackboard.

Scientists came to study this horse. They had total strangers give the horse, whose name was Hans, math problems and Hans answered them all correctly. The scientists, after years of studying Hans, decided he must have a brain that was at least as bright as a human.





Remind

- 1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
- 2. Remember the horses' legs, and move swiftly to go to Mother when she calls you.
- 3. Whenever you get gravel in your shoes that hinders you from walking easily, remember the lesson of the stony ground. We must let God remove our stony heart before we can get along very well in our Christian walk.

Reinforce

- 1. Look for horses! Use an encyclopedia or guide book to identify the breed.
- 2. Visit someone who has horses if you do not own one. They might even let you go for a ride.
- 3. Notice rocky places and how few plants grow there.
- 4. Try an experiment: Put two plants in two different pots—one in rocky soil and one in rich soil. Set them out in the sun. Watch what happens to each plant.
- 5. Say your memory verse!


But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren.



Continuing: Again Jesus applied the test to Peter, repeating **His former words:** "Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou Me?" This time He did not ask Peter whether he loved Him better than did his brethren. The second response was like the first, free from extravagant assurance: "Yea, Lord; Thou knowest that I love Thee." Jesus said to him, "Feed My sheep." {Next Slide Please}



Continuing: Once more the Saviour put the trying question: "Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou Me?" Peter was grieved; he thought that Jesus doubted his love. He knew that his Lord had cause to distrust him, and with an aching heart he answered, "Lord, Thou knowest all things; Thou knowest that I love Thee." Again Jesus said to him, "Feed My sheep." **{DA 812.1}**




Three times Peter had openly denied his Lord, and three times Jesus drew from him the assurance of his love and loyalty, pressing home that pointed question, like a barbed arrow to his wounded heart. Before the assembled disciples Jesus revealed the depth of Peter's repentance, and showed how thoroughly humbled was the once boasting disciple. **{DA 812.2}**









Peter was naturally forward and impulsive, and Satan had taken advantage of these characteristics to overthrow him. Just before the fall of Peter, Jesus had said to him, "Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: but I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren." Luke 22:31, 32. {Next Slide Please}




Continuing: That time had now come, and the transformation in Peter was evident. The close, testing questions of the Lord had not called out one forward, self-sufficient reply; and because of his humiliation and repentance, Peter was better prepared than ever before to act as shepherd to the flock. **{DA 812.3}**





The first work that Christ entrusted to Peter on restoring him to the ministry was to feed the lambs. This was a work in which Peter had little experience. It would require great care and tenderness, much patience and perseverance. It called him to minister to those who were young in the faith, to teach the ignorant, {Next Slide Please}




Continuing: to open the Scriptures to them, and to educate them for usefulness in Christ's service. Heretofore Peter had not been fitted to do this, or even to understand its importance. But this was the work which Jesus now called upon him to do. For this work his own experience of suffering and repentance had prepared him. **{DA 812.4}**









Before his fall, Peter was always speaking unadvisedly, from the impulse of the moment. He was always ready to correct others, and to express his mind, before he had a clear comprehension of himself or of what he had to say. **But the converted Peter was very** different. He retained his former fervor, but the grace of Christ regulated his zeal. He was no longer impetuous, self-confident, and self-exalted, but calm, self-possessed, and teachable. He could then feed the lambs as well as the sheep of Christ's flock. **{DA 812.5}**



The Saviour's manner of dealing with Peter had a lesson for him and for his brethren. It taught them to meet the transgressor with patience, sympathy, and forgiving love. **Although Peter had denied** his Lord, the love which Jesus bore him never faltered. Just such love should the undershepherd feel for the sheep and lambs committed to his care. Remembering his own weakness and failure, Peter was to deal with his flock as tenderly as Christ had dealt with him. {DA 815.1}








The question that Christ had put to Peter was significant. He mentioned only one condition of discipleship and service. "Lovest thou Me?" He said. This is the essential qualification. Though Peter might possess every other, yet without the love of Christ he could not be a faithful shepherd over the Lord's flock. Knowledge, benevolence, eloquence, gratitude, and zeal are all aids in the good work; but without the love of Jesus in the heart, the work of the Christian minister is a failure. **{DA 815.2}**
