

Chapter 24 – “Death of Christ” Part 2

Continuing: In the meantime the darkness had settled over Jerusalem and the plains of Judea.

Suddenly the gloom was lifted from the cross, and in clear, trumpetlike tones, that seemed to resound throughout creation, Jesus cried: {SJ 146.6}

“Father, into Thy hands I commend My spirit.” **Luke 23:46.** {SJ 146.7}

The people were shaken into heaps by the earthquake.


The wildest confusion and terror ensued. In the surrounding mountains, rocks were rent asunder, and went crashing down into the plains below.







“And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away” (Matthew 13:6).

“The hot summer sun, that strengthens and ripens the hardy grain, destroys that which has no depth of root. So he who ‘hath not root in himself,’ ‘dureth for a while’; but ‘when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.’ Many receive the gospel as a way of escape from suffering, rather than as a deliverance from sin. They rejoice for a season, for they think that religion will free them from difficulty and trial. While life moves smoothly with them, they may appear to be consistent Christians. But they faint beneath the

fiery test of temptation. They cannot bear reproach for Christ’s sake. When the word of God points out some cherished sin, or requires self-denial or sacrifice, they are offended. It would cost them too much effort to make a radical change in their life. They look at the present inconvenience and trial, and forget the eternal realities. Like the disciples who left Jesus, they are ready to say, ‘This is an hard saying; who can hear it?’ (John 6:60).” (Christ’s Object Lessons 47-48)

*Are you willing to deny yourself and cooperate with Jesus in doing an **industrious** work in your life? We do not want to be like the seed that fell on stony ground!*




Nature Mulching

What is mulch? It is chopped up leaves, compost, grass clippings, nutshells, peat moss, pine needles, straw, or wood chips. Some gardeners spread mulch among the garden plants. Mulch helps stop the growth of weeds by not allowing them to receive air and sunlight. It also helps the soil hold moisture. You will not need to water as often if you use mulch. If weeds do come up through the mulch, pull them by hand. Pulling up weeds can remind you how evil people will “conspire to root out the hated sect (remnant), but God will intervene.

“The sweet savor of Christ surrounds them” as the mulch surrounds the plant. “The fragrance of the life, the loveliness of the character, reveal to the world the fact that they are children of God.” (*Mount of Blessings* 28) Just as a plant can grow better free of weeds, so the life is a sweet fragrance when it is free of sin.

At Christ's coming it will be revealed who God's obedient children are.

If your garden does not have mulch on it the soil will tend to dry out and harden; such soil needs frequent stirring. If left standing still it will crust over which tends to shut out the rain. So our minds, unless continually stirred and occupied with the things which God has provided to keep them active, become incapable of receiving truth. The influence of Christ's teachings was that *“He stirreth up the people”* (Luke 23:5). The teaching about the true Sabbath will soon have this effect of stirring up the people throughout the world. Those who resist this teaching will become hardened against the truth.

The Cherry Blossom



Cherry blossom Tree

- ❑ Peak bloom varies each year in Washington D.C., but typically occurs around April 4 and can last up to 14 days. The peak bloom is the day when 70 percent of the **Toshino cherry trees** are open.
- ❑ The first US cherry trees were planted in 1912 as a gift of friendship from Japan. Over 3,000 trees spanning 12 varieties were shipped from Yokohama to Seattle. They were then transferred to freight cars and sent to Washington, D.C.
- ❑ According to the Huffington Post, these flowers likely originated somewhere in Eurasia before migrating to Japan.
- ❑ Though there are hundreds of different types of cherry trees, Yoshino cherry trees are the most popular.
- ❑ Flowers can range in color from **pale pink to bright pink as well as white and ivory**. For example, in Washington D.C. 70% of the trees are made up of **Yoshinos** which have single white blossoms. However, because they are mixed in with Akebono cherry trees, the Yoshino has mutated to present pale pink blossoms.
- ❑ While cherry blossom season usually lasts about a month, from the time the first to the last tree blooms, each individual tree may only flower for about a week.
- ❑ While D.C. is one of the most popular places to travel during cherry blossom season, you can also see the pretty pink blooms around the country. People flock to see the pink petals around Boston's Charles River, the Cherry Blossom Walk in Nashville, the Roosevelt Island Cherry Blossom Festival in New York City, and the Missouri Botanical Garden in St. Louis to name a few.

A pond is a small, quiet body of water. It is usually not very deep and the sun warms it to the bottom. Usually plants grow in the bottom.

In many places ponds have many plants and animals that live in or near them. In His home life, boy Jesus was like a quiet pool of water reflecting the truth about the Father to men. He helped those around Him, even the most unlovely. The ugliest pool of water becomes beautiful if we see the beauty (Jesus) around it reflected in it. You can reflect the truths of Jesus' life and become like a beautiful pool. *"But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord"* (II Corinthians 3:18).

Chapter 2 - “The Sower Went Forth to Sow” Part 5

Continuing:

“There are very many who claim to serve God, but who have no experimental knowledge of Him. Their desire to do His will is based upon their own inclination, not upon the deep conviction of the Holy Spirit. Their conduct is not brought into harmony with the law of God. They profess to accept Christ as their Saviour, but they do not believe that He will give them power to overcome their sins. They have not a personal relation with a living Saviour, and their characters reveal defects both hereditary and cultivated. **{COL 48.1}**

It is one thing to assent in a general way to the agency of the Holy Spirit, and another thing to accept His work as a reprover calling to repentance. Many feel a sense of estrangement from God, a realization of their bondage to self and sin; they make efforts for reform; but they do not crucify self. They do not give themselves entirely into the hands of Christ, seeking for divine power to do His will. They are not willing to be molded after the divine similitude.

In a general way they acknowledge their imperfections, but they do not give up their particular sins. With each wrong act the old selfish nature is gaining strength. **{COL 48.2}**

The only hope for these souls is to realize in themselves the truth of Christ's words to Nicodemus, “Ye must be born again.” “Except a man be born from above, he can not see the kingdom of God.” **John 3:7, 3, margin. {COL 48.3}**

Continuing!

True holiness is wholeness in the service of God.

This is the condition of true Christian living. Christ asks for an unreserved consecration, for undivided service. He demands the heart, the mind, the soul, the strength.

Self is not to be cherished. He who lives to himself is not a Christian. {COL 48.4}

Love must be the principle of action. Love is the underlying principle of God's government in heaven and earth, and it must be the foundation of the Christian's character.

This alone can make and keep him steadfast.

This alone can enable him to withstand trial and temptation. {COL 49.1}

And love will be revealed in sacrifice. The plan of redemption was laid in sacrifice—a sacrifice so broad and deep and high that it is immeasurable.

Christ gave all for us, and those who receive Christ will be ready to sacrifice all for the sake of their Redeemer.

The thought of His honor and glory will come before anything else. {COL 49.2}


If we love Jesus, we shall love to live for Him, to present our thank offerings to Him, to labor for Him. The very labor will be light. For His sake we shall covet pain and toil and sacrifice. We shall sympathize with His longing for the salvation of men.

We shall feel the same tender craving for souls that He has felt. {COL 49.3}

This is the religion of Christ. Anything short of it is a deception. No mere theory of truth or profession of discipleship will save any soul. We do not belong to Christ unless we are His wholly. It is by halfheartedness in the Christian life that men become feeble in purpose and changeable in desire. The effort to serve both self and Christ makes one a stony-ground hearer, and he will not endure when the test comes upon him. {COL 50.1}

The first work that Christ entrusted to Peter on restoring him to the ministry was to feed the lambs.

This was a work in which Peter had little experience. It would require great care and tenderness, much patience and perseverance.

It called him to minister to those who were young in the faith, to teach the ignorant, {Next Slide Please}


Continuing: to open the Scriptures to them, and to educate them for usefulness in Christ's service.

Heretofore Peter had not been fitted to do this, or even to understand its importance.

But this was the work which Jesus now called upon him to do.


For this work his own experience of suffering and repentance had prepared him.

Before his fall, Peter was always speaking unadvisedly, from the impulse of the moment. He was always ready to correct others, and to express his mind, before he had a clear comprehension of himself or of what he had to say. But the converted Peter was very different. He retained his former fervor, but the grace of Christ regulated his zeal. He was no longer impetuous, self-confident, and self-exalted, but calm, self-possessed, and teachable. He could then feed the lambs as well as the sheep of Christ's flock. {DA 812.5}

The Saviour's manner of dealing with Peter had a lesson for him and for his brethren. It taught them to meet the transgressor with patience, sympathy, and forgiving love. Although Peter had denied his Lord, the love which Jesus bore him never faltered. Just such love should the undershepherd feel for the sheep and lambs committed to his care. Remembering his own weakness and failure, Peter was to deal with his flock as tenderly as Christ had dealt with him.


“Lovest thou Me?”

The question that Christ had put to Peter was significant. He mentioned only one condition of discipleship and service.

“Lovest thou Me?” He said. This is the essential qualification. Though Peter might possess every other, yet without the love of Christ he could not be a faithful shepherd over the Lord’s flock.

Knowledge, benevolence, eloquence, gratitude, and zeal are all aids in the good work; but without the love of Jesus in the heart, the work of the Christian minister is a failure.
