



Chapter 24 – "Death of Christ" Part 3

Continuing: At the time of the death of Christ, some of the priests were ministering in the temple at Jerusalem. They felt the shock of the earthquake, and at the same moment the vail of the temple, which separated the holy from the most holy place was rent in twain from top to bottom by the same bloodless hand that wrote the words of doom upon the walls of Belshazzar's palace. The most holy place of the earthly sanctuary was no longer sacred. Never would the presence of God again overshadow that mercy seat. Most male horses have 40 teeth, and most females have 36 teeth. Horses' teeth do not have nerves, and they are continually growing. The horses use their back teeth to grind (chew) their food. By counting teeth, a person who knows about horses can tell how old it is. Most foals are born without teeth, but soon grow two upper and two lower front teeth. At four months they have four uppers and four lowers, and at the age of one year, they have six pairs of upper and lower cutting teeth.



It is at five years of age when the horse has twelve pairs of cutting teeth, a full set of teeth. The teeth are important for the horse to use for eating its food. It is said that some people dig their graves with their teeth (4 Testimonies 408). That means they do not eat the right foods or they eat too much. This would be an example of a bad habit that will choke out the good seed of the Word. Overeating drains electrical energy from the brain

and therefore affects communion with God. Also, we are told we should chew our food thoroughly (*Counsels on Diets and Foods* 108, 320) before swallowing for good digestion. It reminds us how important it is to thoroughly study (chew) the Word and understand it, not letting the cares of this world (weeds/thorns) crowd the Word out.





Horses have good hearing. They have short, pointed ears that move around to pick up sounds from all directions. The way a horse holds its ears can show the horse's attitude. When it points its ears forward it is curious about something. When it twitches its ears or lays them back against the head it is angry and one should be careful around it. Jesus was trying to help the people to hear the truth so He scattered grains of it among the crowds. Some were eaten by birds, some fell on stony ground, some fell among thorns, but some fell on good ground and were understood. "Who hath ears to hear. let him hear" (Matthew 13:9).

Horses also have a good sense of smell. Their nostrils are very large and can smell things from a long way off. A strong wind and heavy rains make it difficult for smelling and can cause nervousness in a horse.

The eyes of horses are oval, and set on the sides of the head. The eyes can each look a different way, and in a half circle. So a horse can look forward with one eye and backward with the other eye. Because of the position of the eyes, the horse has a blind spot a short distance in front of it. To see a nearby object straight ahead a horse will turn its head. People can have spiritual blind-spots. "The care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches" can blind them to the importance of God's Word.


A Blind Spot

Ask God to show you your blind spots that you might apply the heavenly "eye salve!"




The shape of a horse's eyes makes objects far to the side or back appear to move faster than they really do. So a horse may shy (move suddenly) at the slightest movement of something to the side or back of it. A horse's eyes take time to adjust to changes in light. It may appear to be nervous when coming from a dark stall into bright sunshine until the eyes adjust. Gradually Jesus was unfolding the light of the truth in parables. The Holy Spirit would enlighten the receptive minds of those who had been prepared for greater light. Jesus was teaching the people to see the truth that: "The garden of the heart must be cultivated. The soil must be broken up by deep repentance for sin." Poisonous plants must be removed for the tender plants to grow!



Can you see this seed of truth?

Horses can be trained through repetition to follow signals. They have very good memories, and remember experiences many years after they have occurred. Some of the parables were remembered by the people who heard them, and later, after Jesus' death and resurrection, they took root and grew.







Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what [is that] to thee? follow thou me.




Continuing: Jesus walked alone with Peter, for there was something which He wished to communicate to him only. Before His death, Jesus had said to him, "Whither I go, thou canst not follow Me now; but thou shalt follow Me afterwards." To this Peter had replied, "Lord, why cannot I follow Thee now? I will lay down my life for Thy sake." John 13:36, 37. **{Next Slide Please}**





Continuing:

When he said this, he little knew to what heights and depths Christ's feet would lead the way Peter had failed when the test came, but again he was to have opportunity to prove his love for Christ. That he might be strengthened for the final test of his faith, the Saviour opened to him his future. He told him that after living a life of usefulness, when age was telling upon his strength, {Next Slide Please}




Continuing: he would indeed follow his Lord. Jesus said, When he said this, he little knew to what heights and depths Christ's feet would lead the way. "When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry thee whither thou wouldest not. This spake He, signifying by what death he should **glorify God.**" {DA 815.3}









Jesus thus made known to Peter the very manner of his death; He even foretold the stretching forth of his hands upon the cross. Again, He bade His disciple, "Follow Me." Peter was not disheartened by the revelation. He felt willing to suffer any death for his Lord. **{DA 815.4}**




Continuing: Heretofore Peter had known Christ after the flesh, as many know Him now; but he was no more to be thus limited. He knew Him no more as he had known Him in his association with Him in humanity. He had loved Him as a man, as a heaven-sent teacher; he now loved Him as God. {Next Slide Please}



Continuing: He had been learning the lesson that to him Christ was all in all. Now he was prepared to share in his Lord's mission of sacrifice. When at last brought to the cross, he was, at his own request, crucified with his head downward. He thought it too great an honor to suffer in the same way as his Master did. **{DA 815.5}**



To Peter the words "Follow Me" were full of instruction. Not only for his death, but for every step of his life, was the lesson given. **Hitherto Peter had** been inclined to act independently. He had tried to plan for the work of God, instead of waiting to follow out God's plan. **{Next Slide Please}**




Continuing: But he could gain nothing by rushing on before the Lord. Jesus bids him, "Follow Me." Do not run ahead of Me. Then you will not have the hosts of Satan to meet alone. Let Me go before you, and you will not be overcome by the enemy. **{DA 816.1}**









As Peter walked beside Jesus, he saw that John was following. A desire came over him to know his future, and he "saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do? Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou Me." Peter should have considered that his Lord would reveal to him all that it was best for him to know. It is the duty of everyone to follow Christ, {Next Slide Please}



Continuing: without undue anxiety as to the work assigned to others. In saying of John, "If I will that he tarry till I come," Jesus gave no assurance that this disciple should live until the Lord's second coming. He merely asserted His own supreme power, and that even if He should will this to be so, it would in no way affect Peter's work. The future of both John and Peter was in the hands of their Lord. **Obedience in following Him** was the duty required of each. **{DA 816.2}**


