"The gospel seed often falls among thorns and noxious weeds; and if there is not a moral transformation in the human heart, if old habits and practices and the former life of sin are not left behind, if the attributes of Satan are not expelled from the soul, the wheat crop will be choked. The thorns will come to be the crop, and will kill out the wheat." (Christ's Object Lessons 50)

If you have ever weeded in the garden you realize it takes hard, Industrious work to do it-so it is in weeding al sin out of the life. Thorny weeds in the garden are much easier to remove when they are young and tender then when they are mature. This teaches us that today is the easiest day to get rid of sin. Every day we put it off it will get harder and more painful.


### Reinforce




Illustration of the Horse's Eye Ciliary ring Lens Ciliary muscle





### Let's take a look at illustration of an actual Horse's Eyes!

The shape of a horse's eyes makes objects far to the side or back appear to move faster than they really do. So a horse may shy (move suddenly) at the slightest movement of something to the side or back of it. A horse's eyes take time to adjust to changes in light. It may appear to be nervous when coming from a dark stall into bright sunshine until the eyes adjust. Gradually Jesus was unfolding the light of the truth in parables.

# Nature What Is a Flower?

What is a flower? The word flower means, "the best of everything." That is just what God was giving the children of Israel, "the best of everything." They needed to learn to trust in Him, that He was providing them the best food, water, and protection.

The flower is the reproductive part of any seed-bearing plant. Weeds, trees, shrubs, vines, vegetables and grasses all have flowers. There are about 250,000 varieties of flowering plants. There were over a million Israelites who came out of Egypt. Some were like weeds, some like trees, some like vines, but all needed to learn to trust their lives to God so they could bloom and fulfill the purpose God intended for them.

Flowers grow almost everywhere form snow-covered mountains to hot, dry deserts. Wherever they grow that place is more beautiful. The children of Israel were like flowers trying to grow on the desert. However, they needed to learn to trust in God that they might make the desert a beautiful, blooming flower garden.

"The wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice, and blossom as the rose. It shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice even with joy and singing: the glory of Lebanon shall be given unto it, the excellency of Carmel and Sharon, they shall see the glory of the Lord, and the excellency of our God" (Isaiah 35:1-2). God may allow the little landscape of our lives to become barren like a desert so that others may see, by way of contrast, "the excellency of our God" in causing us to bloom in such unfavorable circumstances.

# Nature More Garden Flowers

There are many kinds of garden flowers, such as hollyhocks, tulips, pansies, and others. It is enjoyable to have a garden full of plants. The flowers form seeds to grow new plants. Moses' garden of helpers grew by the thought (seed) Jethro suggested to Moses. Now he had many trusted people to help him carry on the work.

Some of the beautiful flowers that grow from unattractive bulbs are daffodils, tulips, hyacinths, and others. We see from this that God can transform a rough and unattractive character into an object of breathtaking beauty. The bulbs can be planted in the autumn. During the winter they grow slowly, and when the weather becomes warmer the bulbs grow quickly. The roots and leaves grow longer, and flowers form.

### Nature Wind and Water

Two of the ways God has provided for flowers to plant their seeds are the wind and water currents. Seeds from flowers, such as dandelions and milkweed, are shaped like parachutes and sails, and are carried by the wind, floating away to be planted. Seeds from the sycamore tree spin to the ground like helicopters.

A tulip is a lovely garden flower belonging to the lily family. Tulips bloom in the spring, growing from bulbs. Usually the tulip has one large, bell-shaped flower at the tip of its stem.

The word tulip comes from a Turkish word meaning turban. The beautiful

### Nature Wildflowers

Some flowering plants become pests. Their seeds scatter far and wide and grow quickly. They crowd out the plants that people want in that place. These unwanted flowering plants are called weeds. They can spoil crops and make gardens unsightly. Dandelions are a wildflower and are also considered a weed.

"Hellebores feature beautiful, open flowers ranging from lime green and mauve, to white, dusty pink and crimson. As a clump-forming plant, hellebores are great for propagation and given the right care, can last for many years. Although commonly known as the 'winter rose', hellebores are not related to the rose family, but in fact belong to the Ranunculaceae. They're still just as beautiful!"

**Note:** Hellebores, while beautiful, are poisonous to both animals and humans. Do not ingest any part of this plant.



"Native to Southeastern Europe, Common Purple Lilac or Lilac Tree is a multi-stemmed shrub. It features lilac, lavender, or light purple clusters of exceptionally aromatic, 4-petaled blossoms that are surrounded by lush green shrubbery. These trees grow well in well-drained, moist soils and sunny areas. However, they don't tolerate hot, humid conditions."



### **Golden Euonymus**

(Euonymus japonicus 'Aureo-marginatus') is an evergreen shrub that belongs to the Euonymus genus. Here are some key points about this shrub.



'This is a very dense shrub with an oval shape if grown in full sun. The thick foliage makes it ideal for a privacy or even a sound hedge. The shrubs are really striking in the garden. The euonymous leaves are leathery to the touch and grow up to three inches (7.5 cm.) long. The greenish-white blossoms appear in spring but you may not even notice them. They are inconspicuous. Golden euonymous shrubs can grow to **10 feet (3 m.)** high and 6 feet (2 m.) wide."

"They look like miniature hyacinths with hanging flowers that look like small beads on the stem of the plant. They're a great choice for garden borders, pathways or pots while adding a splash of iridescent blue to your garden. They multiply well, flower forever and are a hardy, drought tolerant plant that is very easy for you to grow." "One of the earliest flowers, grape hyacinths are a joy in the spring garden that multiply readily by bulb offsets and seeds, happily spreading throughout the garden – sometimes a little too happily, to the point where you might want to transplant them elsewhere!"

The gospel seed often falls among thorns and noxious weeds; and if there is not a moral transformation in the human heart, if old habits and practices and the former life of sin are not left behind, if the attributes of Satan are not expelled from the soul, the wheat crop will be choked. The thorns will come to be the crop, and will kill out the wheat. {COL 50.3} Grace can thrive only in the heart that is being constantly prepared for the precious seeds of truth. The thorns of sin will grow in any soil; they need no cultivation; but grace must be carefully cultivated. The briers and thorns are always ready to spring up, and the work of purification must advance continually. If the heart is not kept under the control of God, if the Holy Spirit does not work unceasingly to refine and ennoble the character, the old habits will reveal themselves in the life. Men may profess to believe the gospel; but unless they are sanctified by the gospel their profession is of no avail. If they do not gain the victory over sin, then sin is gaining the victory over them. The thorns that have been cut off but not uprooted grow apace, until the soul is overspread with them. {COL 50.4}

Continuing: Christ specified the things that are dangerous to the soul.

As recorded by Mark He mentions the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things. Luke specifies the cares, riches, and pleasures of this life.

These are what choke the word, the growing spiritual seed. The soul ceases to draw nourishment from Christ, and spirituality dies out of the heart. {COL 51.1}

"The cares of this world." No class is free from the temptation to worldly care.

To the poor, toil and deprivation and the fear of want bring perplexities and burdens.

To the rich come fear of loss and a multitude of anxious cares.


Many of Christ's followers forget the lesson He has bidden us learn from the flowers of the field. They do not trust to His constant care. Christ cannot carry their burden, because they do not cast it upon Him. Therefore the cares of life, which should drive them to the Saviour for help and comfort, separate them from Him. {COL 51.2}

Many who might be fruitful in God's service become bent on acquiring wealth. Their whole energy is absorbed in business enterprises, and they feel obliged to neglect things of a spiritual nature. Thus they separate themselves from God. We are enjoined in the Scriptures to be "not slothful in business." Romans 12:11. We are to labor that we may impart to him who needs. Christians must work, they must engage in business, and they can do this without committing sin. But many become so absorbed in business that they have no time for prayer, no time for the study of the Bible, no time to seek and serve God. At times the longings of the soul go out for holiness and heaven; but there is no time to turn aside from the din of the world to listen to the majestic and authoritative utterances of the Spirit of God. The things of eternity are made subordinate, the things of the world supreme. It is impossible for the seed of the word to bring forth fruit; for the life of the soul is given to nourish the thorns of worldliness. {COL 51.3}


**Continuing:** Heretofore Peter had known Christ after the flesh, as many know Him now; but he was no more to be thus limited. He knew Him no more as he had known Him in his association with Him in humanity. He had loved Him as a man, as a heaven-sent teacher; he now loved Him as God. {Next Slide Please}




**Continuing:** He had been learning the lesson that to him Christ was all in all. Now he was prepared to share in his Lord's mission of sacrifice. When at last brought to the cross, he was, at his own request, crucified with his head downward. He thought it too great an honor to suffer in the same way as his Master did. **{DA 815.5}** 








To Peter the words "Follow Me" were full of instruction. Not only for his death, but for every step of his life, was the lesson given. **Hitherto Peter had** been inclined to act independently. He had tried to plan for the work of God, instead of waiting to follow out God's plan. **{Next Slide Please}** 



**Continuing:** But he could gain nothing by rushing on before the Lord. Jesus bids him, "Follow Me." Do not run ahead of Me. Then you will not have the hosts of Satan to meet alone. Let Me go before you, and you will not be overcome by the enemy. **{DA 816.1}** 



As Peter walked beside Jesus, he saw that John was following. A desire came over him to know his future, and he "saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do? Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou Me." Peter should have considered that his Lord would reveal to him all that it was best for him to know. It is the duty of everyone to follow Christ, {Next Slide Please}



**Continuing: without undue** anxiety as to the work assigned to others. In saying of John, "If I will that he tarry till I come," Jesus gave no assurance that this disciple should live until the Lord's second coming. He merely asserted His own supreme power, and that even if He should will this to be so, it would in no way affect Peter's work. The future of both John and Peter was in the hands of their Lord. **Obedience in following Him** was the duty required of each. **{DA 816.2}**
