
1). To God be the glory, great things he has done! So loved he the world that he gave us his Son, who yielded his life an atonement for sin, and opened the life-gate that all may go in.


Character Quality


Industry vs Slothfulness
Industry is the habit of working hard and steadily with thoughts and deeds directed by heaven.



A female horse (mare) carries a foal inside her body for about 11 months before birth. Foals can stand very soon after birth, and in a few hours they can run about. The foal looks like its legs are too long for its body. But as the horse grows the legs grow more slowly than the rest of the body. As the mare brings forth the fruit (foal), so we are to "bring forth fruit unto God" (Romans 7:4). This fruit is: "...love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law" (Galatians 5:22-23).

When a foal is a year old it is half grown. Almost all horses are full grown at the age of five. Most mares have five or six foals during their life. Many horses will live from 20 to 30 years. As the foal grows into an adult horse, so we are to grow in Christ. The seed of the Word is given "that ye may grow thereby" (I Peter 2:2).





Remind


- 1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.


- 1. Look for horses! Use an encyclopedia or a guide book to identity the breed.








Continuing:








Continuing:

Peter had been restored to his apostleship, but the honor and authority he received from Christ had not given him supremacy over his brethren. This Christ had made plain when in answer to Peter's question, "What shall this man do?" He had said, "What is that to thee? follow thou Me." Continuing:


The favor which Christ had shown him in forgiving his apostasy, and entrusting him with the feeding of the flock, and Peter's own faithfulness in following Christ, won for him the confidence of his brethren.

He had much influence in the church. But the lesson which Christ had taught him by the Sea of Galilee Peter carried with him throughout his life.



We will end our Chapter 84 with a Reflection, taken from: A Spirit of Prophecy Book Entitled, "Gospel Workers!" Chapter 6 - The Under-Shepherd Pages 183.4 through 184.2

The sheep that has strayed from the fold is the most helpless of all creatures. It must be sought for; for it cannot find its way back. So with the soul that has wandered away from God; he is as helpless as the lost sheep; and unless divine love comes to his rescue, he can never find his way to God. Then with what compassion, what sorrow, what persistence, should the under-shepherd seek for lost souls! How willingly should he endure self-denial, hardship, privation! **(GW-Gospel Workers 183.4)**

Continuing:

There is need of shepherds who, under the direction of the Chief Shepherd, will seek for the lost and straying. This means the bearing of physical discomfort and the sacrifice of ease. It means a tender solicitude for the erring, a divine compassion and forbearance. It means an ear that can listen with sympathy to heart-breaking recitals of wrong, of degradation, of despair and misery. **{GW-Gospel Workers 184.1}**


Continuing:

The spirit of the true shepherd is one of self-forgetfulness. He loses sight of self in order that he may work the works of God. By the preaching of the word and by personal ministry in the homes of the people, he learns their needs, their sorrows, their trials; and, co-operating with the great Burden-bearer, he shares their afflictions, comforts their distresses, relieves their soul-hunger, and wins their hearts to God. In this work the minister is attended by heavenly angels, and he himself is instructed and enlightened in the truth that maketh wise unto salvation. {GW 184.2}
