"Marine mammals need to come to the water surface to breathe, which is why the deep-diving whales have blowholes on top of their heads, so they can surface to breathe while keeping most of their body underwater." https://slideplayer.com/slide/3461511/



Learn more about the whale by reading this information.

It is hard to see underwater, and the deeper you go the darker it becomes. Therefore God gave the whales a keen sense of hearing. Water carries sound better than it carries light. Sound carries four times faster in water than in air. Whales can "see" with sound. This is called echo-location. It works like this:

- The whale sends out a sound (a click) to "see" what is ahead.
- Far ahead the click hits a school of fish and bounces back like a ball bouncing against the side of a house. The click begins traveling back to the whale.
- The sound comes back to the whale. If it takes a long time the whale knows the fish are far away. If it takes a short time, the whale knows they are near.

"Take heed therefore how ye hear...."



Clouds carry rain and snow which help to water the earth. Clouds can also bring destruction and even death with hail or a tornado. Dark clouds hide the sun. They are like trials that come to each of us. When the sun rises higher in the heavens, it melts away the dark clouds, like the love of God. In the east, one little cloud can develop quickly into a raging storm. Even so, one small sin can cause great destruction in a life. How important to have **purity** of life with every sin confessed and forsaken.

Clouds look different from one another. Some are fleecy masses, others look like feathers, while others are dull gray or dark. Many clouds are continually changing shape. They do this because parts of the cloud evaporate (change into vapor) when mixed with drier air than the cloud. Clouds also change shape as the wind blows them about.



John had multitudes (many) coming to hear his message of repentance and **purity** of life. Some were like the clouds that change shape, changing their lives of sin for a life of **purity** as the Holy Spirit (wind) moved upon their hearts. For them there was a special promise in the Scriptures: "I have blotted out as a thick cloud, thy transgressions, and, as a cloud, thy sins: return unto me for I have redeemed thee" (Isaiah 44:22).



The setting Sun can also remind us that "they must fall who would rise again." "Self must be dethroned. Pride must be humbled if we would know the glory of the spiritual kingdom. The Jews would not accept the honor that is reached through humiliation." (The Desire of Ages 57)



There are more than 60 kinds of deer which includes caribou, elk, marsh deer, moose, mule deer, musk deer, and reindeer. Deer live all over the world; in hot dry deserts, the cold Arctic Circle, but most live in prairies, swamps, or woodlands.

Deer come in all sizes. The moose of North America is the largest deer in the world, while the pudu of South America is the smallest.

Usually, male deer are called bucks, while male caribou, elk, and moose are called bulls, and red deer are called stags, or harts. Most female deer are called does. Female caribou, elk, and moose are called cows, and female red deer are hinds. Most young deer are called fawns, but the young caribou, elk, and moose are known as calves. God's people are called meek, merciful, pure in heart, and peacemakers.








You can tell something about an animal's way of life from the way its sense organs look. For example, an animal with small eyes will probably rely on other senses than sight. An animal with large ears depends more on hearing. Compare the face of a dog and a cat. Generally dogs have a long muzzle, large ears and their eyes are not large compared to the rest of their face. We could guess then that the sense of smell is most important, then hearing and lastly, sight.

Blueberry (Bog/Alpine), Vaccinium uliginosum (ERICACEAE)

BOG or ALPINE BLUEBERRY is a low-growing deciduous shrub. Its stems may be upright, reaching 2 ft. (0.6m) in height, or else prostrated, spreading in carpets. Bog blueberries prefer acidic, peaty soils. They are commonly found around bogs, swamps, and open tundra, and also grow on mountain slopes and in forest understory.

FLOWER AND FRUIT: Small urn-shaped flowers may be white, dark pink, or bronze-colored. Each flower is 0.2 inches (0.5cm) long with 4 or 5 lobes. Fruits are 0.2-0.4 inches (0.5-1cm) wide. They are round and slightly flattened with prominent calyxes. Their dusky blue skin is covered with a subtle waxy coating.

LEAF: Leaves are less than 0.8 inches (2cm) long and have a leathery texture. They are dark green with a pale underside and smooth edges. In autumn, foliage turns mahogany.

EDIBLE PARTS: fruit

KEY MEDICINAL USES: It has antiseptic, astringent, and anti-inflammatory properties. Blueberry species are rich in antioxidants and are being investigated for their



cancer-preventative potential.

HOW TO HARVEST AND EAT: Picking season is from mid-July to late September. The higher the elevation, the sweeter berries tend to be. You can eat them raw, or use them as a garnish for salmon.

BALSAMIC BLUEBERRY GLAZE: In a small pot, combine ½ cup blueberries, 5-6 sprigs of fresh thyme; 1 tbsp. each of maple syrup, balsamic vinegar, and lemon juice; ¼ tsp. of salt. Boil for 15 min. over medium heat until the sauce reduces and thickens. Brush glaze on grilled salmon and broil for 3-5 min.

"He bindeth up the waters in his thick clouds; and the cloud is not rent under them" (Job 26:8). What are clouds? They are lots and lots of very tiny water droplets or ice crystals that are floating in the air. Water vapor rises from salty oceans or slimy swamps leaving its impurities behind. It is changed into clouds. Fluffy white clouds moving across a blue sky or at sunset are very beautiful. Some who came to be baptized left their sins behind (and became like beautiful, fluffy white clouds) while others did not want to give them up. John said to those who would not give up their sins, "O generation [Pharisees and Sadducees] of vipers [children of Satan] who hath warned you to flee from the wrath to come?" "The guilty secrets of their lives were unveiled," as the cloud of their hypocrisy was removed by John's rebuke. The people had been




led to have a high opinion of the piety of these men. They looked up to them admiringly, but these men were like the men described in Proverbs 25:14. "Whoso boasteth himself of a false gift is like clouds and wind without rain." These self-righteous people did not have the rain of repentance within them.

Nature Sea Anemones 1 (uh-NEHM-uh-nee)

A sea anemone is a sea creature that looks like a flower. The shape of the animal's body and its bright color gives the sea anemone a plant-like appearance. Our Bible story this week tells about people who had the appearance of being Christians but were not. Anemones come in shades of blue, green, pink, red, or a combination of these colors. Their "petals" are really tentacles with special stinging cells that poison their prey. The prey is then pulled into the mouth. The sea anemone can move slowly. However, it usually remains fixed to a rock or other hard surface. When it moves, it slowly slides its muscular base along the rock surface. Some kinds burrow in sand and gravel; others slide their bodies into crevices in the rocks so that only their tentacles show. When the tide goes out, most anemones on the shore pull in their tentacles and become jelly-like blobs to avoid drying out.

Traffic-light anemones come in various colors, including red, amber, and green. When the tide goes out they fold in their tentacles, looking like brightly colored drops scattered on the rocks. When they are fully grown they have about 200 tentacles. A fully grown sea anemone with all its tentacles reaching out can remind us how the arms of the disciples reached out unselfishly to help all those church members in need. They lived very carefully to help others.

Other members of the sea anemone family are corals, hydras, and jellyfish. Anemones vary in diameter from 1/4 inch (6 millimeters) in some kinds, to more than 3 feet (91 centimeters) in the giant sea anemone that lives in the costal waters of Australia.

Nature Benthos—Starfish 1

The starfish is also called a sea star. It is a spiny skinned sea creature that has arm-like parts on its body. Most kinds of starfish have five "arms," and look like a five pointed star, while some kinds have as many as 40 or more arms. The twelverayed sun has 12 arms, but individuals that have as few as 8 or as many as 13 are not unusual. They are protected by an outer skeleton of hard, chalky plates just under their tough skin. Starfish are found in all the oceans of the world. Most are slow moving and live in the open. Dull colors would serve to hide them, so it seems unusual that they are brightly colored orange, red and even purple, but some are brown. As the starfish is called by another name so Jesus was called the Star of Jacob. It was through the giving of His power that the crippled man was healed.



Starfish are really not <u>true</u> fish.

They belong to a group of sea animals called echinoderms. Other members of the echinoderm family are brittle stars, sea cucumbers, sea lilies, sea urchins and sand dollars. The people could not be <u>true</u> Israelites unless they followed Jesus Christ.
