






- 1) Peace, perfect peace, in this dark world of sin?




Hopefulness vs Desperation or Hopelessness

Hopefulness is a desire of some good accompanied with expectation of obtaining it, or a belief that it is obtainable. Hope always gives pleasure or joy, whereas wish or desire may produce or be accompanied with pain and anxiety.




Bats look different, and are different sizes, depending on the kind. Bats who live out in the open have bright colors and markings. Those living in caves and other dark, sheltered areas have black, brown gray, red, or yellowish colored fur. No other kind of animal has both wings and fur. Mammals are the only animals with fur or hair.

There are about 1,000 different kinds of bats. All these different kinds of bats reminds us how many different kinds of people there were in the large crowds "thronging" around Jesus (Mark 5;31). The largest bats are the flying foxes which eat fruits. They have a wingspan of more than 5 feet (1.5 meters) and a body about the size of a pigeon. The smallest bat is about the size of a bumblebee. It is called Kitti's hog-nosed bat and lives in Thailand. It weighs about 1/14 ounce (2) grams). It is the smallest mammal in the world. Like the smallest mammal, touching someone is a small act. Yet, Jesus notices even our very smallest acts, as He noticed the sick lady who touched His garment.



Or it may land on the ground nearby and walk over to its victim. It is very quiet in its approach. The light weight bat hops on the victim and slices the skin with its razor-sharp front teeth. The victim does not usually feel any pain or even wake up. Then the bat laps up the blood as it flows from the wound. A chemical in the bat's saliva stops the blood from clotting. Chickens and other small animals can lose so much blood from a few attacks that they die. Does it remind you about the woman who had been losing blood for 12 years and was in a terrible condition of weakness and suffering? Her blood should have clotted, but it kept flowing. Satan, like a vampire bat, had attacked and wounded her, but Jesus' life-giving virtue passed through her body and she was healed.



The Ten commandments are a picture of God's character of love. He is bound by their principles in all He does. The sick woman touching the hem of His garment reminds us of reaching out by faith to God's character of love. It is His life-giving love or virtue that brings healing to all of us. He is still the same Great Physician. "Why then is not the health of the daughter of my people recovered?" (Jeremiah 8:22)."

Remind

- 1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
- 2. As you mend a hem, remember your lesson. As you use your hands to do your chores, think of the bats with their strange hands.
- 3. Do not give Satan a chance to wound you through sin. But, if any man sin, we have a Great Physician who binds up our wounds and makes us whole. When someone gets cut and needs a bandage notice how Jesus helps the blood to clot, and how the cut heals in a short time.


Reinforce

- 1. Look for bats! Use your guide book to identify them.
- 2. Notice the hands of people around you. Draw an outline of each member of the family's hand. Cut it out of black paper. Mount the "hands" on a piece of white paper.
