**Hopefulness** is a desire of some good accompanied with expectation of obtaining it, or a belief that it is obtainable. **Hope** always gives pleasure or joy, whereas wish or desire may produce or be accompanied with pain and anxiety.


### A Bat's Head and Wings

The faces and heads of bats vary greatly as you have probably noticed in pictures. Some bats have a head shaped like a dog or bear. One kind has a flat face, while others have folds of skin, called nose-leaf, on their snouts. The bat's good sense of smell helps them find food and a place to roost.

Almost all bats have small, sharp teeth to chew their food into a soup. Bats need to digest their food quickly. Why? Because this quick digestion helps eliminate extra weight while flying.

Remember, a bat's wings are really hands. Like birds, they have lightweight bones and small bodies. Bats have claw-like thumbs that help them move across rough surfaces like cave walls and tree bark. The bat's "hands" have very thin, tough skin stretched over them. Have you ever see a surgical glove? That would help you understand the thickness of the skin between the bat's fingers.

The length of a bat's wings depend on the kind of bat. Some bats can hover in one spot with their short, broad wings. Others have longer, narrower wings. The ability of the bat to fly can remind us how Jairus would have liked to have Jesus move more quickly ("fly") to the bedside of his daughter. Man's ways would have been to have gone quickly and not waited upon the Holy Spirit to work. When the messenger came and said that she was dead, Jesus said that there was **hope**.

Their claws serve as tooth brushes. Keeping clean is a very important part of a bat's life. They clean themselves when they wake up, before they eat, after they eat, before they go to sleep, and whenever they have time. A bat's life can depend on how clean they keep their wings. It can remind us how our spiritual life depends on keeping our souls clean. *"Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God"* (II Corinthians 7:10).

# Hawaiian Hawk & Hawaiian Hoary Bats

A bat's legs are weak. The special tendons in their legs make it possible for them to hang upside down when they roost. They can live in places up high where enemies cannot get to them. The long, curved claws on their feet help them roost, climb, and groom themselves. They lick their wings clean and also use their thumbs to clean their faces! Hanging upside down is like doing something the opposite way it should be done. The Holy Spirit was leading Jesus along slowly so that the woman that **hoped** to be healed might reach Him. Most people would have moved quickly and not waited upon the Holy Spirit to work. Being "upright" is always a blessing.

## Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. When you do your chores happily and without complaint, others notice, and you are telling them a story like the woman shared with out even speaking.






## Reinforce

4. When you brush your teeth, remember what a bat uses to brush theirs. When you bathe or wash your face and hands remember the lesson the bat teaches us by its cleanliness.



## Remarkable Parent Food


