Hopefulness vs Desperation or Hopelessness

Hopefulness is a desire of some good accompanied with expectation of obtaining it, or a belief that it is obtainable. Hope always gives pleasure or joy, whereas wish or desire may produce or be accompanied with pain and anxiety.



The Hawaiian hoary bat is the only extant and native terrestrial mammal found in Hawai'i. Like many species of bats, Hawaiian hoary bats are brown in color. However, they are distinguished by a silver tint along the brown fur of their backs. More pronounced silver bands are found along the necks as the fur transitions to a yellowish brown along the face with the ears retaining a black edging around their perimeter. The common name of hoary bats was inspired by the hoary, or frosty, the coloration of their coats. Females of this species are larger than males.

These bats are native to the islands of Hawai'i. They are found in landscapes including human-populated areas, forests, agricultural fields, pastures, and even near mountain summits. During the warmer months, bats will travel to lowland environments where they will be more active. During the colder months, Hawaiian hoary bats travel to highland environments where they are not as active.

#### **Habits and Lifestyle**

Hawaiian hoary bats are solitary and prefer to roost individually rather than in colonies. They are nocturnal hunters, usually hunting for food just before sunset and returning to their nests just before sunrise. Like other bats, they capture and eat their prey while still in flight. Bats do not have keen eyesight to spot their prey; rather, they use echolocation. By foraging using echolocation, bats can catch their target while in flight. The bats' flight patterns differ in accordance to the environment they are hunting in and the prey they are hunting. When hunting in open environments (i.e pastures or above the canopy) where larger prey is more abundant, they will fly faster with less maneuverability. When hunting in closed environments (i.e clustered forests) where smaller prey is more abundant, they will fly slower to allow for more maneuverability to catch their elusive prey. While foraging, Hawaiian hoary bats can travel up to 19 km (12 miles) a night.



They weigh approximately 1/2 an ounce.




The flap of skin between their legs and tail called the interfemoral membrane or uropatagium.

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# **Leaf-Nosed Bat Interesting Facts The leaf-nosed bat (Phyllostomidae)**

The New world leaf-nosed bat is endothermically a mammal and bilaterally symmetrical. This bat species has a high wing load and low wing aspect ratio and this allows them to hover to feed on fruits, pollen, and insects.

These species of bats are active at night. Phyllostomidae roosts in caves, drain pipes, buildings, and other vegetation.

**Uroderma** genus leaf-nosed bats use broad leaves to make tents for roosting by chewing the midrib of the leaf to fold into a tent and small groups of bats roost under it.

Almost all the Phyllostomids do not exhibit reduced body temperature except in Heller's broad-nosed bats, Pallas' long-tongued bats, and Seba's short-tailed bat's aestivation is possible. Desmodus species displays aggressive behavior, food sharing, and reciprocity.

This family of the New World leaf-nosed bat occupies a wide range of habitats across forests and deserts. The leaf-nosed bat habitat includes temperate, tropical, forests, deserts, caves, and buildings. They also prefer a habitat with dense rainforests and high elevation.





Thicker forearms and tiny thumbs make up the top of the wings, and the fingers create the wing tips.

Large ears help bats to hear even faint sounds. Some bats see quite well, contrary to the "blind as a bat" myth.

Some bats have flaps or bumps of skin on their faces called nose leaves.

Powerful muscles in a bat's fur-covered body flap the wings.

The bones of a bat's arms and hands create a frame for its skincovered wings

Bat's legs are not adapted for standing so they hang upside down by their feet instead of perching like birds.




This small grayish brown flying mammal feeds on insects and plant matter.




#### **The Eastern Box Turtle**

(Terrapene carolina carolina), also known as the land turtle, is a type of turtle with a special hinged shell. It's a subspecies of the common box turtle (Terrapene carolina). These turtles are native to the eastern part of the United States.

Eastern box turtles have a high, dome-shaped top shell, called a carapace. They also have a hinged bottom shell, called a plastron. This hinge lets them close their shell completely, like a box!

These turtles stay fairly small, usually 4.5 to 6 inches long. Some can grow over 7 inches. In captivity, they can live for more than 100 years. However, in the wild, they often live shorter lives because of diseases and predators.



Chelodina, often called **Snake-necked Turtles**, is a large group of turtles with very long necks. They are part of the Chelidae family. These unique turtles live in Australia, New Guinea, Rote Island in Indonesia, and East Timor.

Snake-necked turtles are known for how they protect themselves. Instead of pulling their head straight back into their shell like many turtles, they tuck their long neck to the side of their body. Their shells are usually ovalshaped and can be small to medium in size. This group includes many of the well-known snake-necked turtles. They are typically small to medium-sized and have oval shells.

Common green iguanas have a wide distribution throughout Central and South America. They are one of the largest lizards in the Americas and certainly one of the most beautiful.

Isabella and Olive, each about six years old, are Prospect Park Zoo's original pair of iguanas. They live in the Animal Lifestyles building. Olive's zoo career has shifted to the Education Department where she plays an interpretive role in the Animal Encounters and school programs. Isabella was left to share her exhibit with a red footed tortoise roommate until Ferdinand, a handsome two year old iguana, was obtained this year and introduced to Isabella. And just to round out the Central American theme, a boa constrictor was added to the group.

Like all iguanas, Ferdinand and Isabella have strong jaws and long tails which are nearly half the length of their body. These tails are used to ward off predators. Iguanas spend most of their time in the rainforest canopy and zoo visitors will see both of them resting on vines at the top of the exhibit most of the time. Iguanas are herbivores and a special treat for them is flowers, especially the giant red hibiscus that decorate the zoo's Discovery Trail.



#### Nature What Is a Reptile?

A reptile is an animal that has dry, scaly skin and lungs to breathe with. The scales of reptiles do a good job of keeping in body moisture so reptiles can live in dry places. This can remind us of the scaly skin of leprosy. There are about 6,000 kinds of reptiles. Examples of reptiles are: alligators, crocodiles, lizards, snakes, turtles, and the tuatara.





The common box turtle is about the size of a quarter when it hatches. After it has dug itself out it hides for a few days, living on the egg yolk attached to the underside of its shell. When the yolk is gone it searches for food. It takes five or six years for the turtle's shell to harden enough so that it does not have to hide most of the time. Then, with a reliable suit of armor, it can roam about freely. Its lifestyle can remind us of the protection that is needed mentally and spiritually, for the little ones. Just as the young turtles have to hide until their shield of

Turtles live a very long time. They live longer than any other animal, one kind living as long as 200 years or more. Turtles do most of their growing during the 5-10 years. They will continue to grow but much slower.

Most turtles will eat both animals and plants. A few turtles, like the green turtles and tortoises, eat only green plants. The map turtle, a fresh-water kind, eats only animals. The food of the turtle can remind us of the wonderful feast that God is preparing for the marriage supper of the Lamb. We can have a taste of this feast today if we deny self and spend time eating His Word.

Other turtles living in very warm climates survive the extreme heat and dry periods by estivating, which is somewhat like hibernation.

The heat of trials can seem too much for us sometimes, but Jesus is always inviting us to estivate (rest) in Him.



The Emu, known scientifically as Dromaius novaehollandiae, is a very large flightless bird. It lives naturally in Australia. The emu is the tallest bird in Australia. It is also the second tallest bird in the world, right after its relative, the ostrich. Emus are also related to the cassowary, which is a bit smaller but heavier.

The emu is the second tallest bird in the world. Only the ostrich is taller. Large emus can stand up to 150 to 190 cm (59 to 75 in) tall. From beak to tail, emus are usually 139 to 164 cm (55 to 65 in) long. Males average 148.5 cm (58.5 in) and females average 156.8 cm (61.7 in). Emus weigh between 18 and 60 kg (40 and 132 lb). Females are often a bit larger and wider than males.

The Mallard (Anas platyrhynchos) is a very well-known duck. You can find it in many parts of the world, including North America, Europe, Asia, New Zealand, and Australia. It's the most common duck around! Mallards live almost anywhere there's water, like wetlands, even in city areas. They are medium-sized waterfowl. They are usually 50 to 65 cm (20 to 26 in) long. Their wings can spread out to 81 to 98 cm (32 to 39 in). A Mallard typically weighs between 0.72 and **1.58 kg (1.6 and 3.5 lb).** Both male and female Mallards have special shiny purple-blue feathers on their wings. These are called speculum feathers and have white edges. You can see them when the duck flies or rests. They lose these feathers temporarily during their summer molt.

At WCS's Prospect Park Zoo, you may notice that our pair of Von der Decken's hornbills (Tockus deckeni) share an exhibit with a group of dwarf mongooses. In the wilds of Africa, these animals have a mutually symbiotic relationship — each species enables the other to have an advantage in survival. When the mongooses forage on and in the ground, they send insects and other small animals to the surface that the hornbills can snack on. Hornbills, in return, are perched high in trees and shrubs which gives the mongooses an additional alert system for oncoming danger.

Since our exhibit at Prospect Park Zoo doesn't contain any natural bugs for hornbills to snack on, we animal keepers

Since our exhibit at Prospect Park Zoo doesn't contain any natural bugs for hornbills to snack on, we animal keepers have an opportunity to improve our aim with an enriching bug toss. The toss provides a fun activity for our animals and builds bonds with keepers. This type of husbandry activity allows us to get closer to some of our animals so that veterinarian checks and regular work, like cleaning, are less stressful and even enjoyable for the animals. When I enter the exhibit, our hornbills greet me with expectant attention knowing a treat is on its way.
