



Chapter 29 – The Ascension

The Saviour's work on earth was finished. The time had now come for Him to return to His Heavenly home. He had overcome, and was again to take His place by the side of His Father upon His throne of light and glory. {SJ 167.1}

Jesus chose the Mount of Olives as the place of His ascension. Accompanied by the eleven, He made His way to the mountain. But the disciples did not know that this was to be their last interview with their Master.

As they walked, the Saviour gave them His parting instruction.

Just before leaving them, He made that precious promise, so dear to every one of His followers: {SJ 167.2}


“Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.” **Matthew 28:20.** {SJ 167.3}

They crossed the summit, to the vicinity of Bethany. Here they paused, and the disciples gathered about their Lord.

Beams of light seemed to radiate from His countenance as He looked with love upon them.

Words of the deepest tenderness were the last which fell upon their ears from the lips of the Saviour. {SJ 167.4}

Continuing: With hands outstretched in blessing, He slowly ascended from among them.

As He passed upward, the awe-stricken disciples looked with straining eyes for the last glimpse of their ascending Lord.

A cloud of glory received Him from their sight.

At the same time there floated down to them the sweetest and most joyous music from the angel choir. {SJ 169.1}

While the disciples were still gazing upward, voices addressed them which sounded like richest music.

They turned, and saw two angels in the form of men, who spoke to them, saying: {SJ 169.2}

“Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into Heaven? This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into Heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into Heaven.” Acts 1:11. {SJ 169.3}

These angels belonged to the company that had come to escort the Saviour to His heavenly home.


Kinds of Elephants

All elephants are not the same. There are the African elephants which are larger than the Indian (Asian) elephant. Indian elephants have smaller ears than the African elephant. They have a high forehead with two large bumps on it. The back of an Asiatic elephant bends up in the middle. The males are usually the only ones with tusks.

Remarkable Facts

- The word elephant means “leader,” or “chief.” An elephant is the Chief of land animals. Jesus is Chief or Leader of God’s people.
- An elephant weights more than 90 people.
- Elephants uproot “in disgust” plants they do not like the taste of, thus, they weed their “garden.”





Which kind
of elephants are these?


African elephants have very large ears, which have about the same shape as the continent of Africa. Their foreheads do not have big bumps on them. Their backs bend down in the middle and both male and female have tusks. An African elephant has two tips at the end of its trunk while the Indian elephant has only one.

Both male African elephants and male Asian elephants are larger than the females. The Indian elephant is 9 feet tall (2.74 meters) and weighs about 10,000 pounds (4,535 kilograms). African males are about 10 feet tall (3 meters) and weigh about 12,000 pounds (5,443 kilograms). Some grow even larger than this.

Male elephants are called bulls and the females are called cows. The young elephants are called calves. Asian elephants live as long as 80 years, and African elephants may live 60 years.




African Elephant

Asian Elephant




Both kinds of elephants require a lot of food each day. A wild elephant eats about 300 pounds (140 kilograms) of vegetation in one day. They also drink about 40 gallons (150 liters) of water in a day. This reminds us about how much food Jesus would need to feed the people. *‘Is any thing too hard for the Lord?’* (Genesis 18:14). If God can daily feed herds of elephants, He can **give** food to a multitude and to you. Elephants can live almost anywhere if there is enough food and water. They have made their homes in forests or bush, on plains, in valleys or on the slopes of mountains. They can remind us of how adaptable the disciples were to different situations as long as they could be near the *“Bread of Life,”* or *“Water of Life.”*

TUSKS: Both male and female African elephants are capable of growing tusks

WEIGHT: Between 4000kg to 7000kg

TOENAILS: African forest elephants have 5 in front and 4 in hind while African bush elephants have 4 in front and 3 in hind

EARS: Large ears shaped like the continent of Africa

TRUNK: Two “fingers” for grasping

HEIGHT: About 4 metres (tallest at the shoulder)

PIGMENTATION: Consistent dark colouration

TUSKS: Only male elephants are capable of growing tusks, while females sometimes grow tushes (a very small tusk)

WEIGHT: Between 3000kg to 6000kg

TOENAILS: 5 in front and 4 in hind

EARS: Smaller, rounded ears

TRUNK: One “finger” for grasping

HEIGHT: About 3.5 metres (tallest at the arch of the back)

PIGMENTATION: Freckled appearance and pigmentation

Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. As you help fix dinner for the family, think how much more salad or bread the elephants or the multitude would need. If God cares for them by **giving** them food do you think He will care for you?

Reinforce


1. Look for mammals! Use your guide book to identify them.
2. Find a stone that weights about 100 pounds (45 kilograms) and imagine three piles of food like that. This is what an elephant eats. Fill a gallon jar with water and place 39 beans or other objects by it, then think how many 40 gallons are.
3. Choose something special you own to **give** away to someone.

4. Arrange your pictures on the bulletin board under African and Asian (Indian) elephants.

5. For individual activities, stories, and poems, use the booklet entitled, *Children's Bible Activities, Stories, and Poems*, for this quarter.

6. Say your memory verse!

“Therefore take no thought, saying, What shall we eat? or, What shall we drink? or, Wherewithal shall we be clothed?”


“(For after all these things do the Gentiles seek:) for your heavenly Father knoweth that ye have need of all these things.
