





Chapter 29 – The Ascension

The Saviour's work on earth was finished. The time had now come for Him to return to His Heavenly home. He had overcome, and was again to take His place by the side of His Father upon His throne of light and glory. {SJ 167.1}

Jesus chose the Mount of Olives as the place of His ascension. Accompanied by the eleven, He made His way to the mountain. But the disciples did not know that this was to be their last interview with their Master.

As they walked, the Saviour gave them His parting instruction.

Just before leaving them, He made that precious promise, so dear to every one of His followers: {SJ 167.2}


“Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world.” **Matthew 28:20.** {SJ 167.3}

They crossed the summit, to the vicinity of Bethany. Here they paused, and the disciples gathered about their Lord.

Beams of light seemed to radiate from His countenance as He looked with love upon them.

Words of the deepest tenderness were the last which fell upon their ears from the lips of the Saviour. {SJ 167.4}

They turned, and saw two angels in the form of men, who spoke to them, saying: {SJ 169.2}



Giving vs Stinginess

Giving means to convey something and make it available to another to bless their life and glorify God's name.

“Give Ye Them to Eat”

“The disciples finally came to Him, urging that for their own sake the people should be sent away. Many had come from far, and had eaten nothing since morning. In the surrounding towns and villages they might be able to buy food. But Jesus said, ‘Give ye them to eat,’ and then turning to Philip, questioned, ‘Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?’ This he said to test the faith of the disciple. Philip looked over the sea of heads, and thought how impossible it would be to provide food to satisfy the wants of such a crowd. He

answered that two hundred penny worth of bread would not be nearly enough to divide among them, so that each might have a little. Jesus inquired how much food could be found among the company. *‘There is a lad here,’* said Andrew, *‘which hath five barley loaves, and two small fishes: but what are they among so many?’* Jesus directed that these be brought to Him.”
(The Desire of Ages 365)

Reflect

The disciples had forgotten that they were speaking to the Creator of the universe, *“who calleth those things which be not as though they were”* (Romans 4:17). In their heartlessness and lack of faith, they would have driven the needy multitudes away. At hand, however, was the God who gave the manna and also the One who said, *“I will satisfy the poor with bread”* (Exodus 16; Psalm 132:15).




Early will I Seek Thee

Chapter 39- “Give Ye Them to Eat” Part 2

The people listened to the words of mercy flowing so freely from the lips of the Son of God. They heard the gracious words, so simple and so plain that they were as the balm of Gilead to their souls.

The healing of His divine hand brought gladness and life to the dying, and ease and health to those suffering with disease.

The day seemed to them like heaven upon earth, and they were utterly unconscious of how long it had been since they had eaten anything. **{DA 365.1}**

At length the day was far spent. The sun was sinking in the west, and yet the people lingered.

Jesus had labored all day without food or rest. He was pale from weariness and hunger, and the disciples besought Him to cease from His toil.

But He could not withdraw Himself from the multitude that pressed upon Him. **{DA 365.2}**
The disciples finally came to Him, urging that for their own sake the people should be sent away.

Many had come from far, and had eaten nothing since morning.

In the surrounding towns and villages they might be able to buy food.

But Jesus said, "Give ye them to eat," and then, turning to Philip, questioned, "Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?"

This He said to test the faith of the disciple. **{DA 365.1}**

Continuing: Philip looked over the sea of heads,

and thought how impossible it would be to provide food to satisfy the wants of such a crowd.

He answered that two hundred pennyworth of bread would not be nearly enough to divide among them, so that each might have a little. Jesus inquired how much food could be found among the company.

“There is a lad here,” said Andrew, “which hath five barley loaves, and two small fishes;

but what are they among so many?” Jesus directed that these be brought to Him.

Then He bade the disciples seat the people on the grass in parties of fifty or a hundred, to preserve order, and that all might witness what He was about to do. When this was accomplished, Jesus took the food,

“and looking up to heaven, He blessed, and brake, and gave the loaves to His disciples, and the disciples to the multitude.” “And they did all eat, and were filled.

And they took up twelve baskets full of the fragments, and of the fishes.” **{DA 365.3}**

He who taught the people the way to secure peace and happiness was just as thoughtful of their temporal necessities as of their spiritual need.

The people were weary and faint.

There were mothers with babes in their arms, and little children clinging to their skirts.

Many had been standing for hours.

They had been so intensely interested in Christ's words that they had not once thought of sitting down, and the crowd was so great that there was danger of their trampling on one another.

Jesus would give them a chance to rest, and He bade them sit down.

There was much grass in the place, and all could rest in comfort. **{DA 365.4}**

ASIAN ELEPHANT


What are the differences?



EARS: Large, "Africa-shaped" ear
TRUNK TIP: Two "fingers" for grasping
HEAD: Single dome
HEIGHT (*tallest at shoulder*): 9 – 13'
WEIGHT: 8,800 – 15,400 lbs.

EARS: Small, rounded ear
TRUNK TIP: One "finger" for grasping
HEAD: Twin dome
HEIGHT (*tallest at back*): 6.5 – 9'
WEIGHT: 6,600 – 13,200 lbs.





Physical Differences	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ An African savanna elephant typically weighs around 11,000-16,000 lbs. (5-7 tons) and is between 10-13 feet tall at the shoulder, while an African forest elephant is a bit smaller and weighs less.
Size & Weight	
Ears	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ African elephants have much larger ears than other kinds of elephants. ❑ Their ears are shaped a little like the continent of Africa.
Head	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The heads of African elephants are more round and full, resembling a dome shape.
Tusks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Both male and female African elephants grow tusks; however, there are some cases where neither sex exhibits tusks.
Trunk	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The African elephant's trunk has two prehensile digits that they use for picking up and handling objects.
Lips Shade	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ African elephants have plump, round lower lips.
Skin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ African elephants skin is more wrinkled, as it was recently discovered that cracks and wrinkles help the animal retain moisture, keeping it cool and preventing dehydration in dry habitats.
Ribs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ African elephants usually have more ribs than Asian species, up to 21 pairs of ribs.
Lifespan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The lifespan of an African elephant can extend up to 60-70 years.



Physical Differences	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The largest Asian elephants weigh around 6,000-9,000 lbs. (3-4 tons) and are 8-9 feet tall at the shoulder.
Size & Weight	
Ears	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Asian elephants have smaller, more semi-circular ears than other elephant species.
Head	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Asian elephants have two domes on their head, with an indent running up the center.
Tusks	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Although only male Asian elephants typically grow tusks, it's important to remember that not every male elephant of this species will develop them. However, female Asian elephants and some male Asian elephant species have rudimentary tusks, more commonly known as "tushes."
Trunk	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The Asian elephant has an opposable "thumb" at the end of its trunk, which they use to hold objects against the underside of its trunk.
Lips Shade	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Asian elephants have long and tapered lower lips.
Skin	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The skin of Asian elephants is smoother than that of African elephants.
Ribs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ Asian elephants have an average of 19-20 pairs of ribs. The number of ribs in a species can vary slightly, and some individuals may have more or fewer ribs than the average for their species.
Lifespan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ The lifespan of an Asian elephant can be up to 60 years. Generation length of the Asian elephant is 22 years.


