
# Jesus Is Coming Again

Jesus is coming again!







## Nature

### Lions

One of the most famous members of the cat family is the lion. He is often called the “king of beasts.” Why? Because of his thundering roar, strength, royal appearance, beauty, and power. Jesus’ kingly command for the disciples to cross the lake caused them to obey Him. Jesus is called the “*Lion of the tribe of Judah*” (Revelation 5:5).

Lions do look like kings but lions do not always lead the easy life of kings. They need to work hard to survive. Jesus (“King”) worked very hard for the people, toiling many times from dawn to dusk.



#### Isaiah 65:25 (KJV)

The wolf and the lamb shall feed together, and the lion shall eat straw like the bullock: and dust [shall be] the serpent's meat. They shall not hurt nor destroy in all my holy mountain, saith the LORD.

Besides being called the “*Lion of the tribe of Judah*,” Christ is also called the “*Lamb of God*.” In Isaiah 11:6-7 and 65:25 we read that in the new earth the lion and the lamb will be friendly to one another. It can remind us how in heaven we will better understand the harmony between Christ’s kingly nature (lion) which executes justice and His humble servant nature (lamb). Usually during His earthly ministry Jesus showed His servant nature. However, His kingly dignity and




authority did shine through now again as when He commanded the disciples and the multitude to depart in our Bible lesson this week. The people feared to disobey Him just as the beasts of the earth would not dare ignore the roar of a lion. A lion's roar is very powerful and loud. It can be heard from a great distance. It reminds us that, *"The Lord shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the heavens and the earth shall shake:"* during the time of the judgment (Joel 3:16).



Jesus was a member of the tribe of Judah. *"Judah is a lion's whelp: from the prey, my son, thou art gone up: he stooped down, he couched as a lion, and as an old lion; who shall rouse him up?"* (Genesis 49:9). This verse gives the idea that it would be as easy to conquer a lion as to overcome one with the character of Judah. Or that it would be as safe to rouse an old lion as to contend with one who stood fast in his loyalty to God's ways. This really does describe how Jesus acted. He could not be turned from His purpose in spite of the efforts of the disciples and the multitude to

proclaim Him king. Proverbs 30:30 appropriately says, “*the lion...turneth not away for any.*”

Lions can live in a cool climate and in hotter areas. They like the woodlands, grassy plains, and areas with thorny scrub trees “*The lion is come up from the thicket*” (Jeremiah 4:7). They live where they can find food; like deer, antelope, zebra, and other hoofed animals. Lions also need a water supply.


HERE'S AN ILLUSTRATION OF WHERE THEY LIKE TO LIVE:

The most dangerous lions are those that have tasted human flesh. Ezekiel compared the last king of Judah to this most dangerous animal when he wrote, he “*became a young lion and it learned to catch the prey; it devoured men*” (Ezekiel 19:3). Once a lion kills a man he usually will do it again because, if unarmed, people are easier to catch than wild animals.




There are several places in the Bible where it talks about the death of people who “*feared not the Lord: therefore the Lord sent lions among them, which slew some of them*” (II Kings 17:25). (See also I Kings 13:20-27; 20:36 and Jeremiah 5:6.) How **thankful** we can be for God’s protection in our lives.



Men have killed so many lions that in some areas there are none left. Before the Flood lions lived all over the world. They even lived in North and South America. Men think of lions as vicious hunters. Satan is also called a lion because of these character traits. Jesus went up into the mountain to pray for “power to reveal to men the divine character of His mission, that Satan (roaring lion) might not blind their understanding and pervert their judgment.” While Jesus was praying, Satan (the lion) was trying to destroy the disciples in a storm on the sea and Jesus allowed the storm because of their murmurings.

*“Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour”*  
(I Peter 5:8).

Thank God for what you do have instead of murmuring about what you think you need!



## Remind

1. As you work together as a family, let your chores remind you of your lesson.
2. Never murmur when asked to help your parents but be **thankful** that you can be a true disciple.
3. When feeding your pet cat, think about lions and how they represent Jesus, Satan, and kingdoms.
4. Be like the "*Lion of Judah*" and do not get side tracked from your work by Satan's temptations.



## Reinforce


1. Look for mammals! Use your guide book to identify them.

6. Say your memory verse!


## Remarkable Parent Food

One of the boys was perfectly happy over a half-withered bunch of flowers which he had just picked up in the street. "I say, Billy," said he to his companion, "wasn't somebody real good to drop these flowers just where I could find them?"

## "Bite Bigger, Billy"

They are so pretty and nice. Keep a lookout, Billy. Maybe you will find something too." Soon the gentleman heard his merry voice again saying, "O, Billy, if there aint almost half a peach, and it aint very dirty neither! 'Cause you haven't eaten anything, you may bite first." Billy was just going to take a very little taste of it, when his companion said, "*Bite bigger, Billy.*" Maybe we will find another one before long.



What a noble heart that boy had in spite of his rags and dirt! He was "*doing good*" like the Bible tells us to do and like they do in the Heavenly Canaan. There was nobody for him to be kind to but his companion in poverty—a poor ragged boy at his side. But he was showing him all the kindness in his power when he said, "Bite bigger, Billy." There was nothing greedy, nothing selfish about that boy. His behavior shows how even a poor ragged boy can do good by showing kindness. Think of his words if you are ever tempted to be unkind or selfish to your companions.
